Dear Friends,

When I started Stamford Peace more than fifteen years ago, I did so out of a strong belief that I could harness my passion for the game of basketball, plus my dedication to education as the gateway to a better and more equitable life, to profoundly and positively influence our community and its young people. Little did I know then that within a dozen or so years our world would be turned upside-down and forced to confront both a multi-year global pandemic and unique national division and social unrest, such that the relationships and positive memories we foster through basketball and the academic tutoring and other supports we provide to historically underserved young people, would become more valuable than ever. Then and now, I believed that diversity is our community's crown jewel, which we must celebrate and invest in to continue to make it shine. Stamford Peace allows us to do so.

At the same time, we are in the throes of an arms race for college and career success, with affluent children having an abundance of academic supports, test prep services, enrichment activities, and college advisory services thrown at them – even if they do not require such services – while lower-income students and families must make do with mostly the same few supports that were available to them as many as 20-30 years ago (e.g., stay after school; seek “homework help” at a community center; etc.) In the absence of innovative approaches like ours concerning how lower-income and minority young people get supported academically, it is impossible to see how the opportunity gap among our community's traditional have's and have not's could do anything but widen.

We are so proud of our ongoing, proven commitment to those that have been historically underserved by our community. In fact, the substantial growth we have witnessed in the number of tutoring sessions we provide; the resoundingly positive feedback we get from Beyond Limits participants generally; and our uniquely high retention rates remain some of our biggest accomplishments .

Undoubtedly, our future growth and success will continue to be a function of the enormous positive impact of our model, the quality of our delivery, and the ever-growing need for our robust academic support services and high-quality sports programming among local area youth. Only with your ongoing support is this possible.

May we look forward to only health, recovery, prosperity and PEACE in 2022 and beyond.

Sports, Academics & Citizenship

Stamford Peace was founded by long-time Stamford community member and 20-year successful financial services executive, Brian Kriftcher, in 2008. Previously, at the age of 40, Brian retired from the for-profit business world in order to devote his full-time energies instead to his “calling” for coaching, teaching, and generally serving the broader community. From the outset, Brian and his dear friend, Lenwood Latta, employed the Stamford Peace platform as a means of positively influencing local area youth, while developing their basketball skills and teaching them valuable life lessons. Academic excellence and supporting children who require academic support was an equally important objective from day 1. From a single team of 9-10-year-old boys in 2008, **Stamford Peace includes more than 1,200 young people today** across a variety of basketball and academic support programs. Stamford Peace provides lower-income families with substantial financial assistance and other subsidies that enable them to participate in our programs.

Stamford Peace remains dedicated to its original premise: “basketball is a privilege,” representing the reward for each child pursuing, to the best of her or his individual ability, their core responsibilities in the classroom, in the community, and at home. Our unique emphasis on sports, education and mentoring are the primary gateways by which we help young people reach their full potential towards the goal of individual achievement and a more just and equitable world. Our year-round work is supported by two key pillars: **PEACE Basketball** and our **Beyond Limits Academic Program**.





For 15 years, PEACE Basketball has offered mission-focused basketball programming for boys and girls ages 5–18 years old. **Thanks to the generous support of our donors, we are able to provide more**

than 20% of our basketball participants with some form of scholarship or meaningful financial aid which enables them to participate.

Among our PEACE Basketball offerings are:

- winter house leagues in Stamford and New Canaan with a combined enrollment of approximately 1300 players;
- high-level boys' and girls' AAU travel teams, including high school team(s) playing on the elite Under Armour Rise circuit;
- summer and vacation day basketball camps;
- summer and fall outdoor leagues in the heart of the Stamford community;
- a high school Varsity league;
- year-round skills clinics; and open gym opportunities; and
- one-on-one and small group training.

Using high-level basketball instruction, training, and competition, we emphasize the importance of education and other essential life skills to local student-athletes. Among the life lessons taught to participants are the value of teamwork, discipline, a strong work ethic, personal integrity, sportsmanship and resiliency. The broad pursuit of excellence — on and off the court — remains a cornerstone emphasis of all PEACE Basketball activities.





Y-Ball League

In 2021, PEACE Basketball was excited to partner with the New Canaan YMCA to run the Y's long-time youth basketball league, Y-Ball. Serving almost 700 K-12 boys and girls, the goal of Y-Ball is to develop the whole basketball player; providing each participant with an opportunity to improve basketball skills, develop gameplay, and build friendships, all while having fun and fostering a love for the game.

Under Armour Rise Circuit

Also in 2021, our 16U Boys AAU team was honored by an invitation to play on the prestigious Under Armour Rise circuit. PEACE Basketball is the only Connecticut program to have an AAU team playing on any sneaker company circuit; with two such teams playing there next year.

Kyle A. Markes Humanitarian Award

For the eighth consecutive year, the Stamford Peace Boys Basketball League honored one of its players with the Kyle A. Markes Humanitarian Award. This award celebrates the memory of former Peace player, Kyle Anthony Walter Markes, who passed away in December 2013 after a year-long battle with acute lymphoblastic leukemia. Each season, the award is bestowed upon an SPBBL 8th grader who gets nominated by his/her coach for displaying the qualities for which Kyle was known – a good teammate and student-athlete, with a love for life, friends, and family.

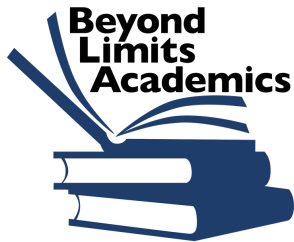


For the 2020-2021 season, we were pleased to bestow the award upon **WILFREDO SOTO**.

Established in 2013 by Andrew Sklover and Brian Kriftcher initially as a tool to support Stamford Peace student-athletes, our Beyond Limits Academic Program has grown considerably over the years and today supports over 200 students -- both athletes and non-athletes alike. The

overwhelming majority of our tutoring participants

are from families eligible to receive free or reduced-price school lunch, for whom access to high-level academic support is generally limited. **Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we are able to extend substantial subsidies making our tutoring and other academic programming affordable for participants.**

Beyond Limits provides high-level, affordable academic supports primarily for middle and high school students from lower-income families, with a goal of instilling academic confidence. Our cornerstone offerings include:

- one-on-one academic tutoring in math and science, conducted by high school juniors and seniors and college students;
- enrichment programming (including computer coding classes, writing workshops; college planning workshops, time management and organizational skills workshops, and more);
- summer programming (including ongoing tutoring and 1-week middle and high school preparatory academies designed to help orient incoming 6th & 9th graders);
- informal peer mentoring; and
- educational advocacy.





Dear Friends,

Over the last 12 months, we were once again blessed to work with so many wonderful students, tutors and families. Important lessons were learned, including the consistent demand for our remote tutoring after we abruptly pivoted to a new pandemic model. **While we will continue to offer remote tutoring, we are very excited to see some increasing demand for on-site sessions.**

Our tutees and tutors have demonstrated tremendous grit and perseverance throughout the pandemic. This most unfortunate experience has strengthened their grit and perseverance far surpassing what the most creative curriculum might produce. Unfortunately, these potential gains were not achieved without a tremendous social and emotional toll on many students. It will be a foundational experience for them and their increased fortitude may, in many cases, be the counterweight to some of the unfortunate short-term academic deficits.

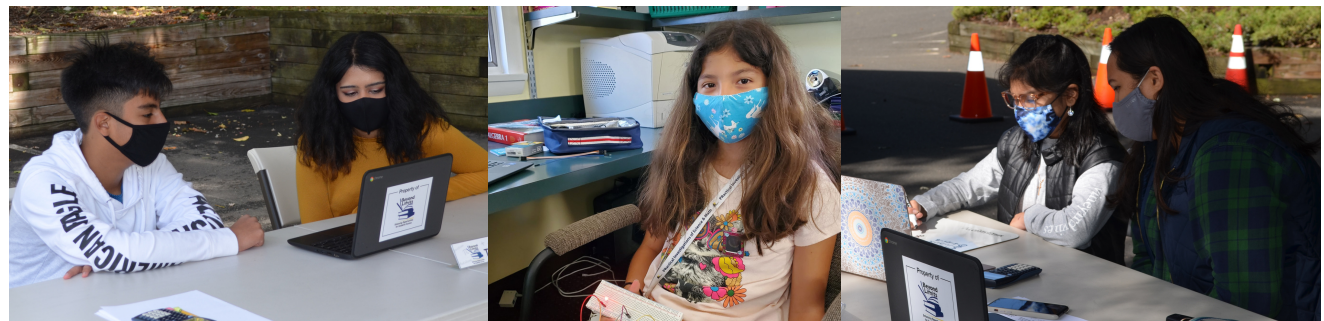

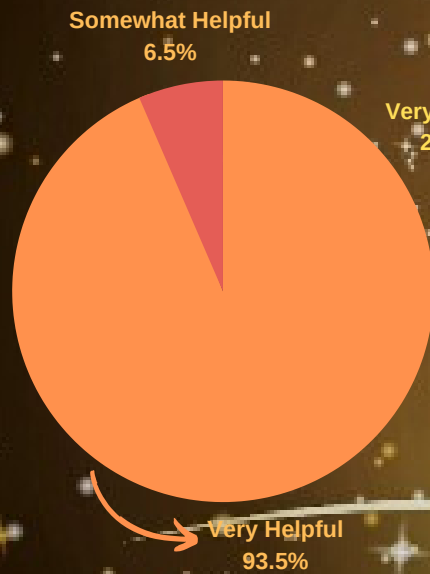

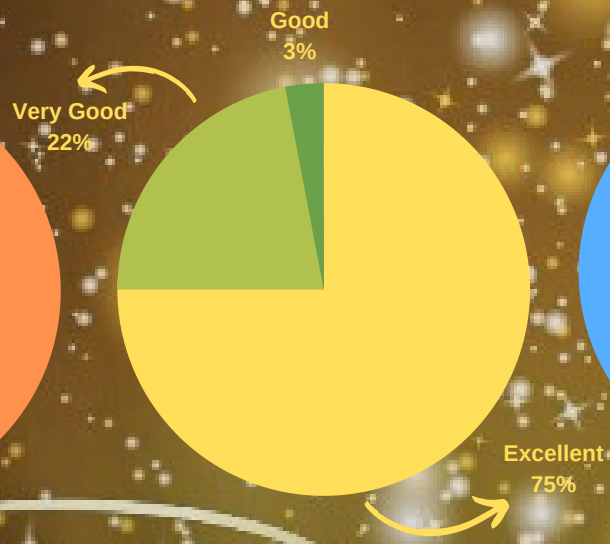


Survey Results from Remote Student Tutoring

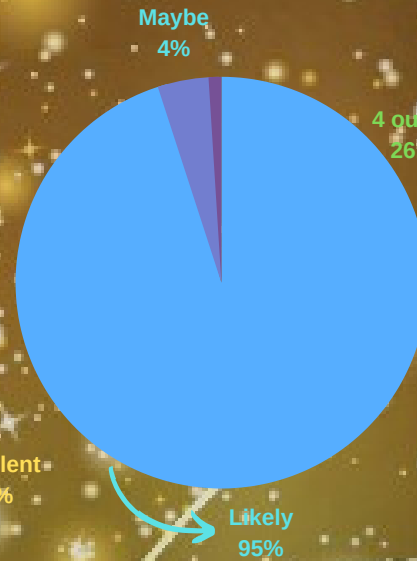
How helpful was your remote tutoring session?



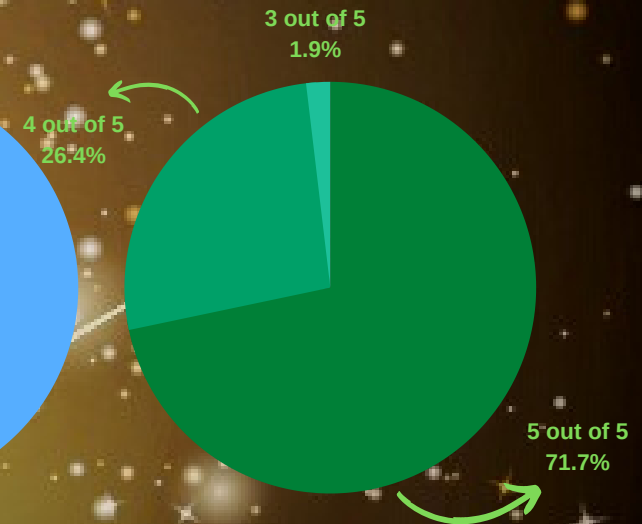
How would you rate your tutor on the remote session?

Alejandra also attended the Beyond Limits Middle School Summer Scholars program, which helps prepare incoming 6th graders for the rigors of middle school.

"We played games, went to the Barlett Arboretum - we were learning but in a fun way. The counselors are also great and fun to talk to!"

Alejandra recommends Beyond Limits to any student who is struggling:

"I can tell them firsthand that they will get help so they can be content and improve their grades."

Alejandra enjoys art, chorus, science, and language arts. Intempo, where she is learning to play the piano, is her favorite activity. She also likes musicals -- especially Dear Evan Hanson, School of Rock, and Harry Potter. And she LOVES to write and sing!

Meet Andrew

Andrew attends Hillcrest Middle School in Trumbull, CT. He came to Beyond Limits because he needed help with math and writing. Andrew is very happy that he found Beyond Limits:

"Ever since I started going to Beyond Limits, I've gotten much better at math!"

Andrew wants other students to know about his positive experience with Beyond Limits:

"The tutors are very nice and they can help you understand hard questions very well."

Andrew's favorite subjects are writing and social studies. He loves books and his favorite activity is . . . baseball.





Meet Tarra



Tarra is in her 7th year as a tutor with Beyond Limits. She graduated from the University of Connecticut in 2020 and is currently working on clinical cancer research at Stamford Hospital while applying to Physicians Assistant programs. Tarra is proud of the years she invested in the BL program:

"Being able to give students this resource, instill confidence in their studies, and enhance their education is invaluable. I walk out of every session feeling fulfilled because I know I make the kids feel the same."

One of Tarra's favorite Beyond Limits memories is helping a student with a learning disability overcome his fear of math:

"This student was very smart but was so distraught by one math problem. After 30 mins of convincing, I was able to instill confidence in him so that by the end of the session, he was practically leaping to go back to the classroom to learn more."

Tarra draws upon her BL experience in her college and professional life:

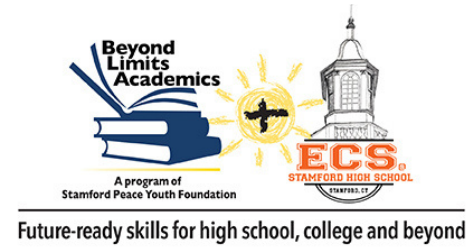
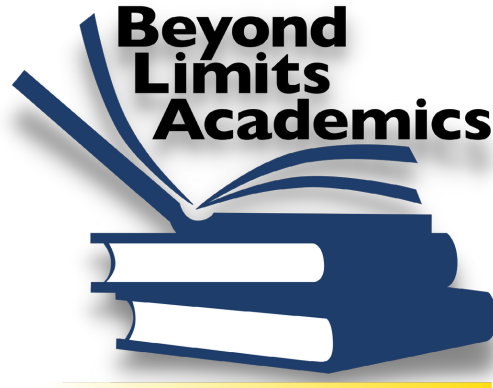
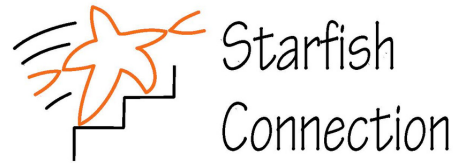
"Tutoring at Beyond Limits has taught me a great deal of communication, patience, and flexibility. In tutoring students, you first have to figure out what the problem is. That takes a great deal of listening and then reinforcing the idea that it's okay to have a fear of the problem, as long as you're willing to learn from it and fix it. And as I am making ground in the health career field and pursuing my graduate degree, tutoring has opened my eyes to health equity, problems with cross-cultural communication, diversity, and so much more. I myself was a SPS student and this program only drives me to give back to my community by providing resources like Beyond Limits for children who might not have the opportunities to succeed in their education."

When asked whether she would recommend the Beyond Limits program, Tarra shares:

"If my 7 years at the program does not say enough, I would totally, wholeheartedly recommend Beyond Limits. Andy makes scheduling very flexible so every student can participate in their extracurriculars and get the extra help they need. The peer-to-peer dynamic makes students unafraid to tackle any sort of problem whether school or personal-related. And a natural mentorship/friendship is formed that is remembered for that student's lifetime."

Meet the Flynns



Sean and Tracy Flynn became involved with Stamford Peace in 2014, when their sons, Christopher and Adam, began playing in PEACE's newly established house league, the Stamford Peace Boys Basketball League. The Flynns instantly saw the value of what the organization and Coach K were putting together in Stamford. Sean became a volunteer coach in the house league and Christopher joined the PEACE AAU travel program. Their relationship with the program deepened when Coach K was coaching the Varsity Basketball team at Trinity Catholic High School, where Christopher attended and played basketball.

The Flynn's were also impressed with the Beyond Limits program:

"We have had the opportunity to see the Beyond Limits program and the important tutoring it provides to so many kids in the community. Not sure that PEACE does anything more important than what is happening at Beyond Limits for the youth of the community."

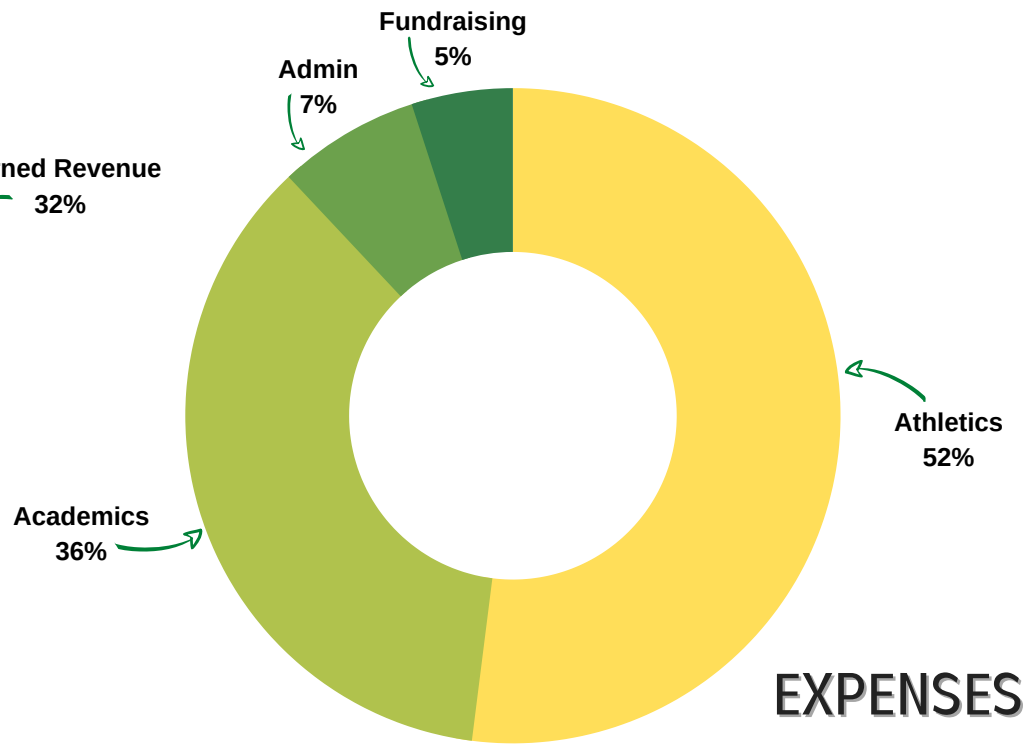
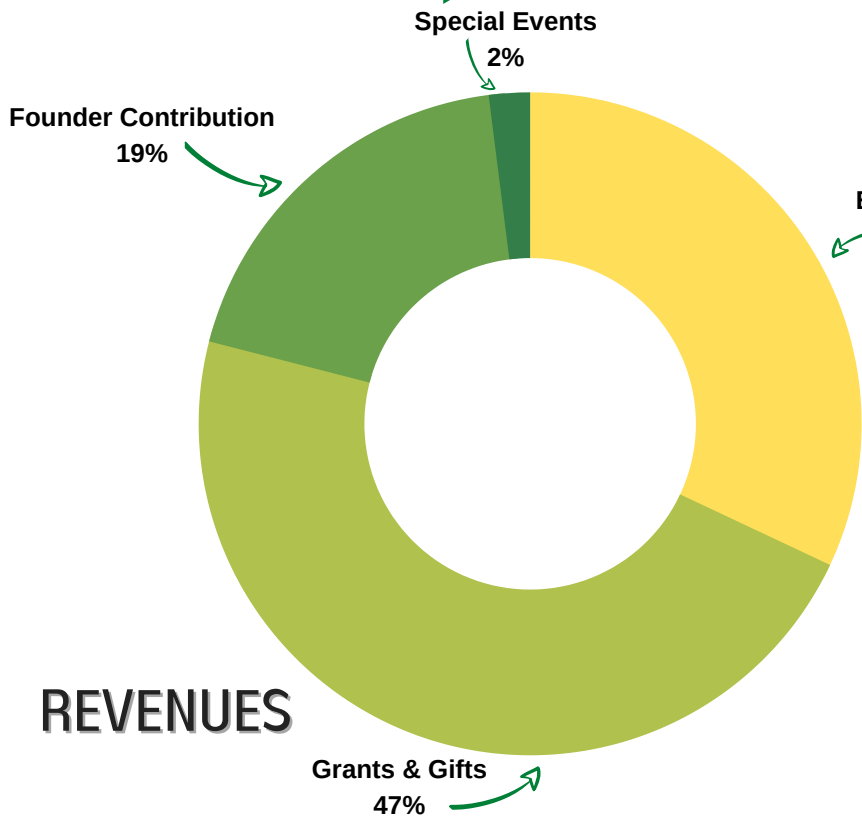
