pray where you are

A Hasidic story tells about the prayer of a poor, simple woodcutter. He was in the forest, and it was time for evening prayer. But, he had forgotten his prayer book. What could he do? He did not know any prayers by heart. He decided to wing it. He said, "God, I have forgotten my prayer book and I do not know any prayers by heart. But, you, O God, know the prayers of my heart. So I will recite the letters of the alphabet and you put the prayer together."

The story concludes that the woodcutter went through the Hebrew alphabet and of all the prayers that God heard on that day, the prayer of the woodcutter in the forest was most precious.

Prayer is not about eloquent words; rather, it is about trust. Prayer is furnishing God with the letters of our life and then trusting our loving God to put the prayer together.

"Gracious God, the tragedy of the bridge collapse makes me aware of the uncertainty of life. Help me to live life fully, to love well and to be grateful for the gift of each new day. Be with those whose lives have changed forever when the bridge collapsed. Surround those who grieve, those who wait for answers, and for those whose bodies are healing with your loving presence. Amen.

The collapse of the 35W bridge raised for me the common human question in the face of suffering, "why"? People of faith have been asking the unanswerable questions for centuries.

I don't think there is anyone who has not asked life's unanswerable questions. Some ask "how long?" when the darkness of depression won't let go. Others ask "why?" when the betrayal of a loved one rips the heart in two. For some the questions of "where are you, God?" comes with the waves of loneliness that grief brings. Each of us knows the pain of our own suffering and have addressed our questions to God. No one is exempt. At some point in life the questions do come. No one is exempt, not even Jesus.

While hanging in agony on a rough wooden cross, Jesus gave voice to the ageless human question in the face of suffering, "Why? Why me?" In the terror of emotional, spiritual and physical torment, Jesus cried out, "My God, my God why have you forsaken me." The psalmist said it, Job voiced it, we have wondered it and Jesus prayed it, "My God, my God, why?"

What do all of those who have asked such questions have in common? What is it that connects Job, Jesus, you and me in such moments? Faith. Yes, faith. It is easy to interpret the questions that arise out of life's ash heap as an expression of doubt, but in truth, one needs to have a strong faith to bring such honesty to God. To pray with the kind of honesty that Jesus did in a time of deep suffering

is a strong assertion of faith in a God who will never, never forsake us, not even in the times when we feel forsaken.

Elie Wiesel in

his book, *Night*, tells the story of being in a Nazi concentration camp where he watched two men and a boy being hung. As the prisoners watched, one said, "Where is God? Where is God, now?" To which another prisoner responded, "There is God. God is hanging on the gallows."

That seems to me to be the answer to life's most difficult questions. Answers to life's difficult questions rarely come, but God is with us in the asking. God is found in the midst of our suffering. God was with Jesus on the gallows and Jesus is with us. Therein lays our comfort when the difficult questions of life rise from fallen bridges, broken relationships, grief-torn hearts, changing health and other forms of suffering. There is nothing that can separate us from God's loving presence, not even the depth of human suffering or the pain of life's unanswerable questions.

Where is God in our suffering? God is with us as we ask the hard questions of life. God is with us in our suffering. God is always with us.
