Beyond a Doubt: Worshiping the God You Know

Have you ever wondered why a sunset is so beautiful? What is it about the interaction of longer reddish wavelengths of light with air particles and water vapor that causes us to stop in our tracks coming out of Wal-Mart, and to stare as if an alien ship has just landed? And why does it elicit a heartfelt response in us?

I think our moments of deep and true worship are like encountering those breath-taking sunsets. Whether you believe that God created people to respond to beauty in creation, or simply that evolution has created neural pathways that draw us to attractive looking things (in our partners, for example), our brains are wired to respond to pleasing visions.

We can find ourselves responding through our other senses as well. Sometimes we'll even find ourselves spontaneously thanking God – or the universe – for the delights of taste and smell. I believe that these innate responses are some of the most organic expressions of worship we have.

But what happens to that involuntary overflow of the heart when we are languishing in a place of doubt about God; when our search for truth – or at least peace of mind about what is knowable – is stymied by the lack of evidence of God's real presence in our lives?

Most people have periods in their lives when little about God, the world and the meaning and purpose for our existence makes sense. For many Christians this wilderness becomes a source of anxiety, maybe even fear, in their lives. Without knowing or trusting what we've learned about God, we may

question why we are put here on earth. I think that part of maturing in our faith is learning how to live with ambiguity in faith. It is learning how not to fear that the walls will cave in on us if we don't do and say all the right things in God's eyes and in the world's judgment. Finally, faith is trying to understand

Finally, faith is trying to understand and appreciate the meaning and purpose in everything we do. Even when we're not sure about our personal Godgiven purpose, we can simply do or say the right thing in response to another's needs, making the world a better place. To me, these caring acts are another unrehearsed moment of worship, acknowledging that we can find God in everything, and everyone, when we are willing to open our minds and be content with our limited comprehension of the universe and its

Creator.

So, how will you worship when you find yourself doubting that God has a plan for your life, or that God cares about the world, let alone even exists? I suggest you try to catch the next couple

of sunsets (or sunrises!) and see what your heart tells you about God.

On-Purpose

One of my favorite parts of my jobs, both here at Trinity and in my executive coaching practice, Original Face, is walking with people as they explore their call. Now most people don't use the word "call" in their coaching objective. They don't often say, "I want to explore my call." They say things like: "I want to change jobs, I want to explore different careers, I want to be an executive leader, or they may say, I want more meaning in my life, I want to make a difference, or I don't know what I'm going to do now that I am retiring or now that my life has changed." These statements are all about listening and discerning call. When I am coaching someone and I hear these statements, I know that I am called in that moment to guide a person into the mystery of listening for God's call. In these sacred moments I find that guiding people into the territory of their hearts often pays off with wisdom. God seems to be very active planting dreams, inspiration and passion in the chambers of this human drum.

Frederick Buechner said, "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." Your deep gladness, your passions, your dreams are part of your call. As a coach, career counselor, and ministry leader, I have been lucky enough to witness many moments when individuals triumph over fear and follow their call. They are not perfectly

smooth rides - following your call doesn't seem to guarantee immediate success or even success as you've defined it. But the called journey seems to be more rewarding, more joyful, and more purposeful even in the times of sadness. This year a gentleman named Paul Potts captured my attention and moved me to tears as I watched him take a stand for his passion. Paul Potts was auditioning for Britain's Got Talent, the English equivalent of American Idol. His audition moment has been captured on You Tube and I recommend that everyone watch this clip at http://www.youtube.com/ watch?v=9oxTy7KIAaA. If you don't have access to the internet, please feel free to stop by my office. Paul Potts was selling car phones or something of the sort at the time of this audition. He faced internal and external barriers but followed his passion despite these challenges. In these moments captured on tape I see God so clearly. So what moment is it for you? Are you listening for God's call in your life? Is there a tug at your heart regarding your career, your community, the needs of the world? This year's On-Purpose column will be dedicated to our stories of call. Psalm 4:7-8

You brought me more happiness than a rich harvest of grain and grapes. I can lie down and sleep soundly because you, Lord, will keep me safe.

You've given your thoughts to the Creator of the earth and heavens. You trust God to keep you through the night. The comfort from this assurance is of a value not to be compared to anything that can be purchased anywhere. This knowledge is better than owning a home, winning the lottery or a college degree.

The writers of the Psalms lived in a time when a good harvest was equivalent to owning a home. A rich harvest of grain and grapes was a feeling of true wealth. Yet the Psalmist is convinced that the happiness that comes from the protection that Yahweh brings is incomparable to all this.

What a timely idea, even here in the twenty-first century. We too want happiness; we too want safety. We also experience the joy of earthly blessings and know how good it feels to have stuff, own stuff and to be able to buy more stuff.

But if our happiness is dependent upon these worldly items, which are here today and tomorrow may be gone, we cannot truly be happy. The assurance of God's love, of God's protection, is a deep happiness no wealth can buy. The Psalmist knew this.

The 23rd Psalm is a beloved psalm of many. I cannot tell you how many times I have shared that psalm with those who are going through a difficult time. It is a psalm that people often request to have read as they die or at their funeral.

The meaning of the psalm was enriched for me when I was leading a grief support group. One participant shared with the group that she was confident she would get through her grief because of the words of the 23rd psalm. She said the hopeful verse for her was, "Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death." She went on to say that the word that she clung to was "through." She noted that the psalmist was not walking in the valley, but THROUGH the valley. She had hope that God would be with her as she moved in, out and through the valley of grief. That is the hard thing about grief. We just keep moving in and out of its valley all the rest of our days.

Psalm 23 helps us claim the promise that God's presence is with us in the valleys, whether they are illness, divorce, doubt, loneliness,

depression, addiction, loss of a job, a bad grade at school, grief, shame, or a troubled relationship. Life is filled with many valleys, but we can go through any valley with God's help.

Looking at the first, the middle and the last words of Psalm 23 can summarize the entire psalm. "The Lord...with me...forever." That is a powerful theme throughout the scriptures and empowers us to move through life's valleys with God at our side.

What do you do when God doesn't answer your prayers? (or at least the way that you want) Pray harder? Give up? Ask others to join you in prayer? I need to confess that sometimes my response to unanswered prayers is anger. Yes, I get angry with God.

For example, I have been praying for a friend with cancer and I know that hundreds of others are praying for her as well. Yet, despite all the prayers the cancer continues to take its physical and emotional toll and I get angry.

My anger does not stop me from praying. Instead, it becomes a part of my prayer. In the tradition of the psalmists who come to God with complete honesty, I tell God exactly how I feel.

I am thankful that I have that kind of relationship with God, a relationship which allows me to be blatantly honest and know that such honesty will not change God's love for me.

Gracious God,

I don't always understand what you are up to. Sometimes I get angry and frustrated when it feels like my prayers are falling on deaf ears. I feel like a child who stomps her feet in response to a parents, "no." Give me the loving trust to pray, "Thy will be done." Amen.


