



Financial Assistance Information Sheet

Park City Soccer Club offers need-based scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$1000. Uniform kits may also be provided, based on the level of the scholarship. The application for scholarship consideration is attached and needs to be returned by May 29, 2019. Previous-year recipients need to re-apply each year. Additional funds may be available to assist with the cost of travel (out-of-state) tournaments, only if monthly balances are paid and up-to-date.

The Scholarship Committee, which is comprised of at least 3 individuals, reviews scholarship applications. Applicants will be informed of an awarded scholarship prior to registration. To be considered, scholarship applicants must have any and all previous Park City Soccer Club accounts paid in full. Selection to a team is handled independent of this scholarship application. Coaching staff is not aware of an application for a scholarship prior to tryouts.

Upon accepting a scholarship, athletes and families must agree to the following:

- To provide 10 hours of volunteer service for Park City Soccer Club
- Provide a volunteer deposit of \$200 (built into the annual fee) which will be reimbursed upon completion of the required 10 hours and submission of the volunteer reimbursement form provided at registration (and available at parkcitysoccer.com)
- That any family of Park City Soccer Club who does NOT complete 10 volunteer hours or DOES NOT return their reimbursement form on time, forfeits their volunteer deposit
- To attend practices and games regularly
- To receive and respond to communications by the Team Manager and Coach
- To remain committed to the team for the entire year including Fall and Spring seasons and the winter training schedule
- That all statements in the scholarship application are truthful and accurate
- To pay the monthly balance due on time according to the payment plan agreement
- To make an initial payment of \$110 upon registration (\$50 for U8 players)
- That the ordering and cost of replacement uniforms are the responsibility of the scholarship recipient
- That, should the athlete leave the team, their name will not be released from the roster until balances are paid in full and uniforms purchased by the Club are returned
- To abide by the Player's Code of Conduct and Parent's Code of Conduct, which is issued at registration
- To receive scholarships in subsequent years, the athlete must reapply and have no outstanding balance owed Park City Soccer Club
- That should these items be violated, scholarship recipients risk losing their scholarships

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
