TERRY NAMED MISS BASKETBALL

Sam Terry of Baraboo has been named Miss Basketball by the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association. The award honors the top senior girls basketball player and has been given out since 1982.

Terry has had an outstanding four year career at Baraboo, but what makes her the player she is, is her work ethic. For example, she hurt her knee at the start of the junior year and instead of sitting out the season, she came back after a little over a month and played the rest of the season on a knee that was nowhere near 100%. Terry was still able to score 15.3 points per game and lead Baraboo to an 18-7 record.

Furthermore, after beginning her high school career as a post player, she has evolved her game to include playing on the perimeter, which makes her a threat to score inside and out. Terry is headed to Green Bay next year to play for Kevin Borseth and the Phoenix.

Terry has had a stellar senior season. She helped the Thunderbirds win a Badger-North title and led them to a trip to the sectional semi-finals. The 6-foot senior averaged 18 points, 8 rebounds, 3 steals and 3 assists per contest. She led Baraboo to a 21-4 record this season and was also part of the Thunderbirds Badger-North title in 2010-11.

“It’s an honor to win the award and couldn’t have done it with the support from my teammates and community,” said Terry.

Terry is a four-time First Team All-Conference selection in the Badger-North Conference and went over the 1000 point mark for her career earlier this season. She finished her career with 1,376 points.

“She was chosen from a great field. Sam’s a very humble person and has been brought up by great parents. She’s always been about the team and comes ready to play every night,” said Baraboo head coach Dave Crane. He continued, “She has also played a large role in our community and goes out of her way to help others.” Sam will be presented the honor tonight at the Resch Center in between the Division 1 and Division 2 championship games. The WBCA’s Miss Basketball committee consisted of current and past high school girls’ coaches.

FISCHER NAMED MR. BASKETBALL

Luke Fischer has won a lot of games during his Outstanding high school basketball career at Germantown.

That much everybody knows as the Warhawks have won 55 straight games heading into their match-up with Mukwonago in today’s WIAA Division 1 state-championship game. What some may not know is how far Fischer has come during his prep career.

Shaking off an injury that forced him to miss six games as a junior, Fischer was able to add weight and strength each year to his long frame while also becoming more aggressive and developing a consistent ability to finish around the basket.

On the other end of the court, Fischer has slowly but surely evolved into a dominate performer, blocking shots and grabbing rebounds at a high rate. In large part because of Fischer’s vastly improved play and Germantown’s absolute domination of opponents over the past several years, the 7-foot-0 post player headed to Indiana University on a scholarship earned the coveted Mr. Basketball award in voting done by a committee of the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association.

The vote for Mr. Basketball this season was exceptionally difficult as the voting committee has several outstanding candidates, including Onalaska senior and Iowa State recruit Matt Thomas, Dominican senior and Marquette recruit Duane Wilson, Vincent senior and Marquette recruit Deonte Burton, Aquinas senior and Wisconsin recruit Bronson Koenig and Sun Prairie senior and Nebraska recruit Nick Fuller, among others considered strongly.

After averaging 16.8 points and 7.6 rebounds per game as a junior for a Germantown squad that went 28-0 and beat Milwaukee King in the Division 1 title game, Fischer is averaging 20.5 points and 9.4 rebounds per contest as a senior, leading Germantown to a 27-0 mark entering today’s title game.

“I found out when coach (Steve) Showalter today

me (Friday) during shoot-around,” Fischer said. “I can’t believe it happened this year with so many good players in this class . . . Duane Wilson, Matt Thomas, Nick Fuller and on and on.

“It’s an honor to win the award.”

Following in the footsteps of recent Mr. Basketball winners Sam Dekker of Sheboygan Lutheran (2012), Nimrod Hilliard of Madison East (2011), T.J. Bray of Catholic Memorial (2010) and Jeronne Maymon of Madison Memorial (2009), Fischer stepped up his game during his senior season to become an absolute nightmare for opponents to defend.

Fischer’s ability to score with either hand in the lane, coupled with his smooth perimeter jump shot, make him an extremely difficult match-up for opponents. Toss in the facts he’s 7-feet tall, runs the floor well and competes with high energy it becomes easy to see why he’s scored 25 or more points 10 times this season. Friday evening in a Division 1 state semifinal match-up against Oshkosh North at the Kohl Center, Fischer finished with 32 points, 16 rebounds and six blocked shots to lead the Warhawks to an 80-60 victory.

“Being a coach and a former player myself, I got awards because our teams won games,” coach Showalter said. “When you compare guys who are equal, a guy who has led his team to victory over and over and over . . . that is more important than individual stats. Luke has done that throughout his career at Germantown.”

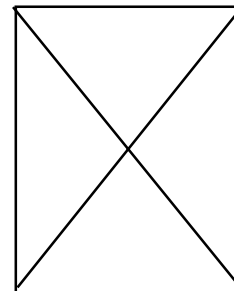

2013 COACHES ADVISORY NOTES

Season Regulations

Coaching Contact: Long discussion on the amendment being advanced to the membership for a vote at the Annual Meeting (unlimited summer contact). Chris Zwettler indicated that the Badger Conference boys' coaches were opposed to the amendment but the girls' coaches were in favor of contact. Mitch Hauser indicated that their girls' program is experiencing numbers problems and that fewer and fewer girls are three-sport athletes. It was noted that a conversation with the operators of the Great Northwest Basketball League should be held in the near future to discuss the impact youth basketball is having on participation numbers at the high school level. Motion by Chris Zwettler, second by Mike Flanagan, to recommend coaches be allowed to have individual workouts with up to four players (all levels) at a time for one-hour sessions, Monday through Friday from June 15 to July 15. Passed unanimously.

Season Placement: Discussion about the order of the girls and boys tournaments for the coming years - committee was in favor of the girls tournament returning to its placement prior to the boys tournament in 2015 and keep the order of girls first followed by boys.

5th Quarter Waivers: The committee reviewed the 5th quarter waiver approvals for the 2012-13 season. It was noted that some schools do not understand that if they sponsor three levels of play, the 5th quarter waiver is

good only when they play schools that are also sponsoring three levels of play. Waiver should not be used when competing against schools that sponsor only two levels of play.

Mercy Rule: Motion by Mike Flanagan, second by Jim Myers to recommend the addition of a mercy rule for only varsity games when the following occurs: 1) after the 3rd quarter anytime the point differential reaches 40 points, clock will run continuously unless a time-out is called. 2) Rule would apply during the regular season and tournament series. 3) If the differential drops below 40, clock still runs continuously until the game is over. Passed unanimously.

Tournament Procedures

6 Days Rest: Motion by Chris Zwettler, second by Michelle Peplinski, to recommend that a waiver provision be provided whereby schools could request relief from the six-day rule when weather forces games to be cancelled during the course of the tournament series. It was noted perhaps a one-hour restriction on the length of practice could be part of the waiver. Passed unanimously.

Half-Bracket Voting: Deb Hauser reported that a change in how schools will vote on the half brackets for the tournament series will be changed in all team sports. When the brackets are released, they will be shown in the half bracket format. Schools will be asked to vote to

retain the half bracket format. If not enough schools vote to retain the half bracket, brackets will be split into smaller regional groupings.

Division 1 Sectional Seeding: A request to seed the entire Division 1 sectional grouping was presented. Discussion included a recommendation to send it back to the WBCA as a possible survey question. It was noted that perhaps a majority of the Division 1 coaches would not support the seeding of the entire sectional grouping.

Division 1 Sectional Hosts: Motion by Chris Zwettler, seconded by Mitch Hauser, to recommend no Division 1 school be allowed to host a sectional semi-final or final game at their school if they are also playing in that game. Motion passed unanimously. This would be consistent with what occurs in other divisions at the sectional level. It was noted that many of the Division 2 schools have gyms large enough to host these Division 1 sectional games.

Seeding Meetings: Discussion included the preference of the committee to keep face-to-face meeting format along with the current weekend of the meetings. The concerns of travel and having a week's worth of games not included in the seeding results were thoroughly discussed. No changes recommended. The committee suggested that language be added to the seeding information that would require the group of split into two groups of 14 or more schools are involved. Also, if a coach is going to be late to a seeding meeting, the coach must call the seed meeting host to indicate the reason they are late in order to avoid losing the use of the box and hosting privileges. Showing up late or after the meeting has concluded should result in the coaching losing the use of the coaching box and all hosting privileges.

Number of Schools in Regional Grouping: Motion by Chris Zwettler, seconded by Mitch Hauser, to set a limit on the number of schools from the same conference that can be part of any regional grouping. Motion passed 6-1. It was noted that this will increase travel in certain areas of the state in order to separate conference schools.

3-Person Officiating Crew: Motion by Jim Myers, seconded by Michelle Peplinski to recommend all WIAA tournament games (boys and girls) be officiated by 3-person crews. Passed unanimously.

Official Basketball: Coaches were provided samples of the Spalding TF1000 Classic basketball and THE ROCK. It was the consensus that the improved TF1000 Classic is the ball of choice.

State Venue Review

Green Bay: Site lines excellent, prices everywhere very family friendly, atmosphere very good for girls basketball, everyone friendly and welcoming. Concourse a bit jammed after games making it a bit difficult to leave. Very positive experience.

Kohl Center: Parking still continues to be an issue, cost of the shuttle from Alliant is of concern. Still a great venue for the boys' tournament.

Shoot Around: Motion by Chris Zwettler, seconded by Mike Flanagan, to restore the shoot around on either Wednesday or Thursday morning at no added cost to the WIAA. Schools would have the option to participate and would be responsible for any lodging costs. Passed unanimously.

NFHS Rules

18 Minutes Halves - Motion by Chris Zwettler, seconded by Mark Gustafson, to support the move to halves if and when adopted by the NFHS. Passed unanimously.

Block/Charge Circle: Coaches were supportive of a rule change that would place the block/charge circle on the high school court to assist officials in making the call.

Shot Clock: Motion by Mitch Hauser, seconded by Mark Gustafson, to recommend Wisconsin implement a 35-second shot clock. Passed unanimously.
