Over Memorial Day, Gretchen and I traveled with some friends to New York City to celebrate Gretchen's birthday and to have the adventure of exploring the "City that Never Sleeps." What an amazing place New York is—way too much to get my head around in a few short days. From the beauty of Central Park to the bustle of Times Square, the hub of Rockefeller Plaza, the food of Chelsea Market (home to Food Network for you foodies), all the way to the majesty of the rising 9/11 Memorial—it is stunning to take in.

The highlight of the trip, however, (for me) was a trip to Madison Avenue Baptist Church, a progressive American Baptist neighborhood congregation (it's tagline is "Not your Average Baptist Church") to hear a facebook friend of mine, the Rev. Susan Sparks preach. Susan was a trial lawyer, a stand-up comic and now a vibrant, faithful pastor of a very diverse New York City congregation. I became acquainted with Susan through her most recent book*; she is a good theologian. After a long walk on a beautiful Sunday morning, we were warmly welcomed at the front door of the church. It was a more-familiar-than-I-expected worship service, full of music, prayer and a fabulous sermon.

The quote from Thomas Merton served as the central focus of the message and it has stayed in my head for the past couple of weeks. I especially like the thought "I believe that the desire to please you (God) does in fact, please you." I have often longed to please God—from the deep, abiding commitment that fueled my ordination to the fleeting, everyday thoughts I have just

in the moment.

There is something tremendously reassuring about this thought - that simply my desire to please God is enough and that the living out of that desire is important—but perhaps secondary to the desire itself. It allows me to be gracious to myself, forgiving and lighthearted about my mistakes, inabilities and shortcomings. It also honors my desire, and, actually brings about more desire.

I have never tried to please God as some way to affect my own salvation but, like the desire to please the people of my life, it is an aspiration born out of love. Who else would I want to please more than the One who made me, surrounds me, walks with me, graces me and who has given me every good thing I have ever enjoyed? I desire to please God out of a sense of gratitude for each and every day—each and every sacred day of this all-too-short life of mine.

Gratitude is the result of awareness, and it is the expression of faith.

I often wonder about the end result of my preaching and teaching. I would guess that one way to look at it would be to say I want to connect people with God in a loving relationship that produces gratitude for this sacred life.

New York was great for a lot of reasons. Reminding me of Thomas Merton's wisdom was an unexpected gift.

STEWARDS OF GOD'S ABUNDANCE



The Business section of a recent Sunday newspaper was headlined "The Age of Austerity." The subheading read "Young or old, people are worried that the recovery is not for real and likely to be short-lived." Then the economic column on that same front page started out "Few things cause more generalized public anger than a spike in gasoline prices. This has been especially sharp in Minnesota, and we are still in the unusual position of having prices higher than the national average." Living here, in the St. Croix Valley, gas prices have an immediate effect on our personal finances because we are so reliant on our cars with few or no mass transit options.

Yet, there is an imbalance and discomfort because we continue to be immersed in a culture of consumerism. We're encouraged to want more, new, better, regardless of need, and we're led to believe that everyone else is on that path and probably ahead of us.

Despite the overpowering role of money all around us, it remains the one thing that has been extremely hard to talk about in church and in personal relationships. We can talk about and support each other in our pain, disappointments, illness and heartaches of many kinds. If we are weighted down and burdened with worry about our personal finances, it can be hard to see and feel God's abundance. We should be able to talk about that too, without shame or judgment or question of motive.

What if we really live and support each other with our sixth Characteristic of Vibrant Stewards? "Vibrant Stewards embrace financial health as an expression of faith. We allow money to flow to and through our lives in ways that nourish us and our world." God calls us to be disciples as whole persons, all the time, engaged in all aspects of life on earth. And in this day and age, life on earth involves money.

So, this month, consider this question: Who is your financial advisor? Or, do you think you don't have enough money to have a financial advisor?

Each of us should have a financial advisor, no matter how young or old we are, how much or how little money we have. For some it can be parents, but for others it can be grandparents, aunts or uncles, or special friends and mentors. Five- year-olds need financial advisors. New graduates and college students need financial advisors. Young people getting married face all kinds of new financial challenges as they combine incomes, desires, needs and different experiences with money.

It has been proven that money does not create happiness. Not having enough to meet daily needs, or not being able to manage money well can, however, result in a great deal of angst. Having wise and knowledgeable counsel and mentoring support in financial matters – a financial advisor – helps us to become financially healthy.

In this column and the "Living in Gratitude" section of Trinity's website, we will continue to share resources for financial health. We strive to become as supportive to each other in financial matters as we are in others.

In the Presence of Angels

About 18 years ago, Pastor Chuck Claus organized a small group for retirees here at Trinity. As the group formed they began to plan their calendar of activities; they also elected to explore possible mission projects. Pastor Chuck found an interesting project through Prison Fellowship called Angel Tree. This program seeks donors to provide Christmas gifts for the children of prisoners. Gloria Williamson and her husband, Tom, stepped forward to lead Trinity's Angel Tree Christmas mission program. "We just thought Trinity should be doing some prison ministry" said Gloria with a smile and a twinkle in her eye, "And then we decided that Trinity would provide gifts to the children of 75 prisoners."

Since that initial start, back in the 90s, Trinity has delivered Christmas joy to over 1100 children. This ministry quietly appears in the Narthex each year after Thanksgiving as a small Christmas tree decorated with angel tags bearing the names and ages of the children. Congregation members select the tags, buy and wrap the presents and volunteers deliver them to the children the Sunday before Christmas.

A few years into the ministry, Gloria decided to expand the scope of the effort to include a \$20 gift card for the caregivers of each child since they too could use a little Christmas love and joy. While Trinity has been providing gifts through the Angel Tree program for 15 years

under Gloria's leadership, she will be the first to say she is not alone in this mission. To date, there has been an enthusiastic team of angels surrounding her providing over 4,000 hours of service. Gloria always stresses that the success of this ministry is because of the wonderful team members who have continued to serve year after year.

During the worship services on Sunday, May 12, a representative from Prison Fellowship recognized Gloria's dedication to this ministry, as well as the generosity of the congregation that has faithfully responded each year to purchase the presents and gift cards.
