TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team faces Russia at Minsk Arena at the 2014 International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship. It's an early showdown for first place in Group B as both teams have won their first two games.

ALL-TIME vs. RUSSIA

Team USA is 4-1-0-5-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) against Russia in the IIHF Men's World Championship. Last year, the nations squared off twice. In the preliminary round, Russia posted a 5-3 win. The U.S. bounced back with an 8-3 quarterfinal victory. **Craig Smith** tallied five assists in the win and **Jacob Trouba** scored once. Against the Soviet Union, the U.S. was 0-0-0-28-0.

BALANCED SCORING

Team USA's nine goals have been scored by eight players. Only **Jacob Trouba** has multiple goals. On Saturday, **Peter Mueller**, **Craig Smith** and **Tyler Johnson** scored in the 3-2 win over Switzerland.

Overall, 14 players have at least a point through two games. The defense corps has 3-4=7 totals.

JOHNSON CONTINUES FIRST-YEAR SUCCESS

Tyler Johnson, a Calder Trophy finalist as NHL Rookie of the Year, is off to a fast start in his first IIHF World Championship. He has four points (1-3) in two games to lead the U.S. He posted two assists vs. Belarus and the game-winning goal plus an assist against Switzerland. Additionally, he has been Team USA's top faceoff man, winning 56% of his draws.

FIRST LINE PRODUCTION

Three goals and five assists have come from the trio of **Brock Nelson** (1-1=2), **Tyler Johnson** (1-3=4) and **Craig Smith** (1-1=2). They have posted two of the team's four power-play goals.

POWER PLAY PROWESS

The U.S. ranks second in the tournament with a 36.4% power-play success rate. Team USA was 1-for-5 against the Swiss, with **Craig Smith**'s marker tying the game 2-2 early in the third period. Against Belarus, **Brock Nelson**, **Jacob Trouba** and **Jake Gardiner** scored on the man-advantage.

PENALTY KILL PICKS UP

Team USA stopped all five Switzerland power plays, including one in the final seconds to preserve the 3-2 win. Overall, the U.S. is 6-for-7 (.85.7%).

TIP-TOP THOMAS

Goaltender **Tim Thomas** has kicked out 94.0% of the shots fired at him through two games and boasts a 1.50 goals against average. Following his 27-save showing against Switzerland, which included a sprawling glove save with six seconds left in the game, Thomas was named Team USA's "best player" in the postgame ceremony.

FRESH LEGS

Team USA's two youngest players, defensemen **Jacob Trouba** and **Seth Jones**, lead the team in ice time. Trouba has averaged 25:11 per game, while Jones is at 22:33. Split up during five-on-five play, the duo plays together on top U.S. power-play unit. Trouba has two goals and an even plus/minus rating, while Jones has an assist and a +2 rating.

TRACKING TROUBA

Twenty-year old **Jacob Trouba** notched the 19th and 20th points of his international career by scoring twice against Belarus. He has nine goals and 11 assists in 35 IIHF contests. In five previous IIHF events he has won three gold medals -- 2011 & 2012 Men's Under-18 World Championship, 2013 World Junior Championship -- and a bronze medal -- 2013 Men's World Championship. He also competed at the 2012 World Junior Championship.

IIHF GOOD TO GAUDREAU

In his first IIHF Men's World to defeat Finland, 3-2, in a shootout high-Championship contest, **Johnny** lighted by **Alex Galchenyuk**'s heroics. **Gaudreau** tallied a game-high three Overall, captain **Paul Stastny** led the points (1-2) against Belarus. At the team with seven goals and 15 points.

2013 IIHF World Junior Championship, Gaudreau led the tournament with seven goals and he finished with nine points as Team USA won the gold medal.

FIRST TIMERS FIND SUCCESS

Fourteen of 20 forwards and defensemen made their U.S. Men's National Team debuts versus Belarus. Jake Gardiner, Johnny Gaudreau, Colin McDonald and Brock Nelson each scored a goal. Tallying assists were Danny DeKeyser, Jimmy Hayes, Kevin Hayes and Tyler Johnson (2). Gaudreau also had a pair of assists.

· CAPTAINS AMERICA

Justin Abdelkader is serving as captain of the 2014 U.S. National Team. He is playing in his second Men's World Championship (2012).

Craig Smith, who is playing on his fourth straight U.S. Men's National Team, will serve as a full-time alternate captain. Colin McDonald and Tim Stapleton will split the role of Team USA's second alternate captain. McDonald will wear an 'A' when the U.S. wears white, and Stapleton will don an 'A' when the U.S. wears blue.

2013 RETURNEES

Jeff Petry, Craig Smith, Tim Stapleton and Jacob Trouba were members of the 2013 U.S. Men's National Team that won the bronze medal in Stockholm, Sweden, by topping Finland, 3-2, in a shootout. Smith led Team USA with 10 assists, while his 14 points were second-best on the squad. Stapleton chipped in two goals and three assists. Trouba had a goal and two helpers. Petry did not record a point.

2013 MEN'S WORLDS RECAP

The 2013 U.S. Men's National Team (6-1-0-3, W-OTW-OTL-L) captured the bronze medal in Stockholm, Sweden, earning Team USA's first medal since 2004. After placing third in the preliminary round, the U.S. topped Russia, 8-3, in the quarterfinals before falling to Switzerland, 3-0, in the semifinals. Team USA bounced back to defeat Finland, 3-2, in a shootout highlighted by **Alex Galchenyuk**'s heroics. Overall, captain **Paul Stastny** led the team with seven goals and 15 points.

Of particular note are **Craig Smith**, who has played in a team-high 21 Men's World Championship games, and **Tim Thomas**, who is participating in his seventh tournament. Only Eric Weinrich (9) and Mark Johnson (8) have played for more U.S. Men's National Teams than Thomas.

DEVELOPING CHAMPIONS

Team USA has medaled in 11 con- 30 Brock Nelson (NYI-10) secutive IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championships and 12 out of 13 tournaments (gold-8, silver-3, bronze-1). Seven players on the 2014 U.S. Men's 44 Drew Shore (FLA-09) National Team have contributed to that 45 Jeff Petry (EDM-06) success.

- Seth Jones and Jacob Trouba won 60 Jimmy Hayes (TOR-08) aold in 2012.
- · Jake McCabe, Connor Murphy, Jones and Trouba won gold in 2011.
- Drew Shore earned gold in 2009.

- Peter Mueller claimed gold in 2005. All seven players were part of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program based in Ann Arbor, Mich.

CALDER TROPHY FINALIST

Tyler Johnson is one of three finalists for the NHL's Calder Memorial Trophy in 2013-14. He tallied 24 goals for the Tampa Bay Lightning, tying for most by a rookie this season. Johnson's 50 points (24-26) ranked third among firstyear NHL players. He would be the first American to claim the Calder Trophy since Patrick Kane in 2007-08.

Johnson tallied a pair of assists for Team USA in its 6-1 win vs. Belarus on Friday.

BROTHERS HAYES

Brothers Jimmy (24) and Kevin (22) Hayes are teammates for just the second time of their careers. The duo from Dorchester, Mass., played at Boston College together during the 2010-11 season. Jimmy represented Team USA at the 2007 IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championship (silver medal) and 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship, while Kevin is making is Team USA debut. Furthermore, they are cousins of former NHLers Keith Tkachuk and Tom Fitzgerald.

NBC Sports Network will televise each of Team USA's games at the 2014 IIHF Men's World Championship. All seven preliminary round games will air live. Additionally, all Team USA preliminary round games will be streamed live online through NBC Sports Live Extra.

TEAM USA COACHING STAFF

Peter Laviolette is serving as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team for the third time. Previously, he led Team USA at the 2004 and 2005 IIHF Men's World Championships, leading the team to a bronze medal in 2004.

He was the head coach of the 2006 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team in Torino, Italy. He then served as an assistant coach for the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team in Sochi, Russia.

Also, he served as an assistant coach for the United States during the 2004 World Cup of Hockey, where he helped Team USA to the semifinals.

Joe Sacco is serving as an assistant coach of the U.S. Men's National Team for the third time (2009, 2010).

In 2013, Sacco was head coach of the U.S. squad that won the bronze medal at the IIHF Men's World Championship in Stockholm, Sweden, and Helsinki, Finland.

Phil Housley is serving as an assistant coach for the U.S. Men's National Team for the second year in a row and

third time overall. Last year, he helped Team USA win the bronze medal in Stockholm, Sweden, and Helsinki Finland. He was also an assistant in 2011.

In 2013, Housley was head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team that won the gold medal at the IIHF World Junior Championship in Ufa, Russia.

He was an assistant coach for the U.S. National Junior Teams in 2007 and 2011, helping each team collect a bronze medal.

Don Granato is an assistant coach for the U.S. Men's National Team for the first time.

He has been a head coach at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program since the 2011-12 season, having led the U.S. National Under-17 Team in 2011-12 and 2013-14, and the U.S. National Under-18 Team in 2012-13.

He will serve as an assistant coach for the 2015 U.S. National Junior Team.

MANAGEMENT TEAM

The 2014 U.S. Men's National Team is under the direction of the U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group, including NHL general managers Stan Bowman (Chicago), Paul Holmgren (Philadelphia), **Dean Lombardi** (Los Angeles), David Poile (Nashville), Ray Shero (Pittsburgh) and Dale Tallon (Florida); Calgary Flames president of hockey operations Brian Burke; Pittsburgh Penguins pro scout Don Waddell; and Jim Johannson, USA Hockey's assistant executive director for hockey operations. Tom Kurvers, senior advisor to the general manager of the Tampa Bay Lightning, joins the group in 2014. The U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group was formed in February of 2007 to assist USA Hockey with the selection of players and staff of U.S. Men's National Teams, including the Olympic Team.
