DREW BREES, ROSEVELT COLVIN TO HIGHLIGHT JUNE 21ST HONORS DINNER; TICKETS NOW ON SALE

Former Purdue football stars Drew Brees and Rosevelt Colvin will be back in the Lafayette area on June 21 to help the Northwest Indiana Chapter of the National Football Foundation stage its third annual NFF Honors Dinner, "Celebrating Our Legends III," at the Purdue Memorial Union Ballrooms.

The event is scheduled to begin at 5:30 p.m. with a silent auction reception that also serves as an autograph session. A buffet dinner follows at 6:30 p.m. and the program at 7:30 p.m.

Ticket orders are now being received. Prices are \$30 each for NFF members and students, \$240 for a table of eight, \$40 per person for non-NFF member adults and \$320 for a table of eight for non-members.

Brees, now the All-Pro quarterback of the New Orleans Saints, will discuss his remarkable year and season, sign autographs, and present the chapter's Drew Brees Mental Toughness Award to his former teammate, Colvin, who is now a standout linebacker for the New England Patriots.

The local NFF chapter will present four other major awards at the dinner. Retiring Purdue President Martin Jischke will be honored with the NFF's Gold Medallion while Distinguished American Award will be given to Henry Rosenthal, a former owner of WASK radio station and long-time Purdue play-by-play announcer. The Outstanding Contribution to Amateur Football Award will be presented to Dr. Robert Hagen of Lafayette Orthopaedic and Sportsmedicine Clinic while the Scholar Athlete of the Year Award will be presented to one of 16 high school seniors.

The Scholar Athlete of the Year will receive a scholarship of at least \$3,000 for use next year in college. Two other finalists will receive at least \$2,000 each while every nominee will receive a minimum stipend of \$250 to be used for textbooks or study supplies. In the previous two years of this award, the chapter has distributed funds ranging from \$500 to \$4,000 to each of 15 scholar athletes. Nomination forms were sent to the head football coaches at the 30 football-playing high schools in the expanding 13-county region (Benton, Carroll, Cass, Clinton, Fountain, Fulton, Jasper, Newton, Pulaski, Starke, Tippecanoe, Warren and White) that the chapter currently represents.

"We have 16 outstanding nominees for this award this year," says Jim Vruggink, Purdue's director of special projects for university relations and intercollegiate athletics who also serves as the volunteer executive director of the NFF chapter. "The Scholar Athlete of the Year is selected based 40 percent on academic achievement, 40 percent

football ability, performance and attitude, and 20 percent leadership and citizenship. All 16 nominees will be recognized at the Honors Dinner, where the scholarship winner will be announced and a large trophy will be presented."

The chapter has approximately \$4,000 already identified for this year's scholarships and stipends. "That dollar amount will go up," says Vruggink. "We are seeking tax-deductible scholarship contributions from our members, the business community and the general public. Also, as our membership grows the dollars made available to us for scholarships go up. For every 50 members, the national office returns \$500 to us for local scholarships. Our membership has grown from 50 in the fall of 2004 when we received our charter to more than 250 this spring, already making this the largest chapter in Indiana."

The mission of the NFF is to advance amateur football at the local, state and national levels, providing grassroots support in a variety of ways.

In addition to the scholarships, Vruggink says the local chapter has gotten involved with youth football programs, helping to provide about \$3,000 in financial assistance in Rossville and Attica within the last two years.

"Our intent is to help improve the quality of the programs and to make the experience more enjoyable for the young players and coaches," says Vruggink.

Another immediate benefit of having a local chapter is to provide voting support for regional nominees in the selection process for the College Football Hall of Fame, where many fans and supporters feel Purdue is underrepresented. Prior to Mike Phipps' selection last year, just six former Boilermaker players, including three who actually completed their collegiate careers elsewhere, had been inducted into the Hall of Fame, according to Bart Burrell, the chapter president and himself a former Boilermaker.

The Northwest Indiana Chapter is one of 120 regional chapters (five in Indiana) in the National Football Foundation. The others are in Evansville, Fort Wayne, Indianapolis and South Bend. It is hoped that the Northwest Indiana chapter will eventually expand to the shores of Lake Michigan and cover points in between.

The tax-deductible membership dues are \$40 per year or \$99 for three years, payable to the National Football Foundation. MAKE YOUR PLANS TO HELP HONOR MIKE PHIPPS AT JULY 21 COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME ENSHRINEMENT DINNER IN SOUTH BEND

Former Purdue quarterback Mike Phipps will be enshrined into the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind., on July 21st and your Executive Board is trying to organize a large delegation from the Northwest Indiana Chapter to attend.

The dinner and enshrinement program will be held at the South Bend Convention Center, near the Hall of Fame, and ticket prices are \$150 each, although our chapter may qualify for a reduced rate if we sell a large enough quantity of tickets.

“Helping to get one of our former players elected into the Hall of Fame is a huge accomplishment for our chapter,” says Bart Burrell, chapter president. “Prior to Phipps getting in last year, it had been 16 years since a former Purdue player was chosen – that was Leroy Keyes in 1990.” Keyes is now an assistant director of the John Purdue Club and a charter member of the local chapter.

Phipps, a three-year starting quarterback (1967-69), led the Boilermakers to three consecutive 8-2 seasons, defeating rival Notre Dame each year. He was a first-team All-American his senior season and finished his career with 37 touchdowns and 5,423 yards passing, which were all-time Purdue highs when he graduated.

He went on to enjoy a 12-year career in the NFL, throwing 55 TD passes and 10,506 yards passing for the Cleveland Browns and Chicago Bears.

A total of seven players and four head coaches with Boilermaker experience have now been inducted.

“One of the chapter’s most important goals is to assist Purdue in supporting former players and coaches who deserve to be in the College Football Hall of Fame,” says Purdue Head Football Coach Joe Tiller, who like several members of his staff, is also a charter member of the local chapter.

Phipps’ selection to the Hall is proof positive that there is strength in numbers. The Northwest Indiana Chapter is now the largest in Indiana and among the largest in the country. With each member qualified to have a vote in the selection process, more deserving Boilermakers should be inducting in coming years. Mark Herrmann, Otis Armstrong, Lawrence Burton and Dave Butz remain on the district ballot.

The July 21 dinner highlights a three-day Hall of Fame celebration in South Bend, most of which features activities for the general public.

CHAPTER MEMBERS CAN “EARN” INCENTIVES

Members of the Northwest Indiana Chapter have the opportunity to “earn” or “offset the costs” of their NFF memberships and tickets to NFF events.

The executive board of the chapter has agreed to allow each dues-paying member a 10 percent credit of new memberships and sponsorships that he or she raises in support of the chapter.

In other words, when a member signs up a new member for the \$40-per-year or \$99-for-three years or a sponsorship, the current member gets 10 percent of that credited toward his/her next dues payment or NFF event tickets. All existing members have the opportunity to “sell” sponsorships ranging from \$100 each to \$5,000 each for advertising and scholarships for the annual Honors Dinner in June.

“As the chapter expands and takes on a larger portion of Northwest Indiana, our sponsorship totals must increase proportionally,” says executive director Jim Vruggink. “This is a volunteer organization, so we can’t pay people to help us, but we can help to offset expenses for our members.

“I hope this incentive program will encourage many of our members to seek new members and to approach businesses and companies with whom they are familiar to assist us with our worthy goals of providing grass-roots support for football in our area, including scholarships for college-bound student-athletes.”

Sponsorship information is located on the last page of this newsletter. To receive credit, a member simply needs to print his or her name at the bottom of the completed form and send it to Vruggink, who will keep a spreadsheet and forward the member’s dues to the national office or “reduce” their price/offset for tickets.

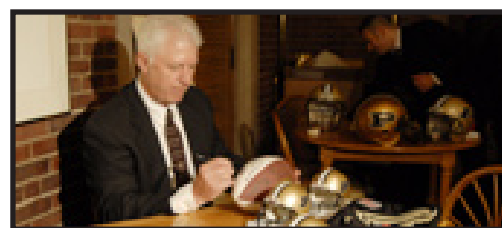

Q & A WITH NORTHWEST INDIANA CHAPTER MEMBER AND 1952 CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICAN BERNIE FLOWERS



BERNIE FLOWERS

How did you get into playing football?

I came from a blue collar area in Erie, Pennsylvania. Everybody was poor and didn't know about it. I started when I was about 10 playing against other kids who were 14 or 15 years old in the city's park. It was a great recreational activity. I think anybody who plays sandlot football will develop into a good athlete.

How much of an impact has football had on your life?

It's been with me all of my life and I am 77 years old. I am very humble to have received recognitions from all-state in high school to All-American status at Purdue, and within the last couple of years to being inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame. It can't get any better than that.

What's your biggest athletic achievement?

My biggest achievement would be scoring two touchdowns against Notre Dame, and then the following week scoring three touchdowns in the first half at Illinois in front of 70,000 people and another 10 million watching on television.

What do you like about the National Football Foundation?

I like it because this foundation helps the community and the area within our chapter. I am glad to contribute my time on a volunteer basis to sell memberships and dinner tickets because someone took care of me when I was a young athlete, and this is a way to give back in return. Here I am retired with something to do, and it doesn't get any better than this. I like being a member and being around the people of this chapter.

Our chapter has great leaders in Jim Vrugink and Tom Schott in addition to a great president in Bart Burrell. We have a fine committee that is indebted to this organization. West Lafayette is a wonderful community for people to get on board with the National Football Foundation as they welcome it because they know a portion of the membership dues goes directly towards scholarships for local scholar-athletes.

What is special about this chapter's annual June Honors Dinner?

The fact that the people who are members of the Northwest Indiana Chapter join together with a common interest is special. They are the key to success. It was wonderful to have Drew Brees and guys like Mike Phipps attend this past dinner. It's a special dinner surrounded by camaraderie and enjoyment.

HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

This annual award is intended to provide recognition to a graduating high school senior football player who exemplifies excellence as a student, an athlete and a citizen. Scholarship money from the National Football Foundation is provided to the winner as long as he is not receiving full athletic aid to attend the college of his choice. He is not required to continue his career as a football player.

Selection process: Nominations are accepted in late winter or early spring from high school coaches and/or administrators in the counties covered by this NFF chapter. Nominations are evaluated by the Scholar-Athlete Committee, which recommends at least one recipient per year. This recommendation must be ratified by the Board of Directors and the presentation should be made at the annual Honors Dinner. Other nominees will also be recognized at the Honors Dinner.

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO AMATEUR FOOTBALL AWARD

This annual award is intended to provide recognition to an individual whose efforts and activities support the goals of the National Football Foundation on the local level. The award identifies an individual who works tirelessly out of love for football and a desire to help children play the game. The award winner can be a league organizer, administrator, fundraiser, coach, doctor, athletic trainer, game official or anyone who excels in representing and supporting the foundation's fundamental creed.

Selection process: Nominations are accepted throughout the year from NFF chapter members and considered by the Awards Committee, which recommends no more than one recipient per year. This recommendation must be ratified by the Board of Directors and the presentation should be made at the annual Honors Dinner.

Selection process: Nominations are accepted throughout the year from NFF chapter members and considered by the Awards Committee, which recommends no more than one recipient per year. This recommendation must be ratified by the Board of Directors and the presentation should be made at the annual Honors Dinner.

This recommendation must be ratified by the Board of Directors and the presentation should be made at the annual Honors Dinner.

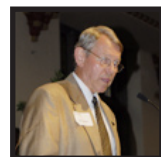
