| 1 |  BELOIT TURNER TROJANS | Turner has four 1st Team and two 2nd Team All-Conference players returning, all of whom are great ball players. |
| 2 |  WAUTOMA HORNETS | Jack Eagan has already verbally committed to Indiana as a junior. He was 11-1 with an ERA of 0.53 as a sophomore. He has help... four others were named All-SCC. |
| 3 |  BIG FOOT CHIEFS | Picked to finish 2nd behind the favorite Beloit Turner, Brett Morris a pitcher/third baseman, hit .450 and will be be a top pitcher. |
| 4 |  DENMARK VIKINGS | Newsly inducted Hall of Fame Coach Bill Miller, returns a team largely intact that went 25-3 last season. Picked only behind West DePere, ranked 8th in DI. |
| 5 |  JEFFERSON EAGLES | Jefferson lost many of their players from the DII State Championship team but return a vital cog in Nick Schrader. He hit .437 and named 3rd team All-State in 2014. |
| 6 |  SAINT THOMAS MORE CAVALIERS | They won Metro Classic and return the majority of their pitching and starters. Short-stop Luke Roubik will lead their offense in a tough conference. |
| 7 |  ASHLAND OREDOCKERS | The Oredockers may play in the frozen north but their game is hot. They won the Duluth based Lake Superior Conference and have every player returning this year. |
| 8 |  GREEN BAY NOTRE DAME TRITONS | Notre Dame plays all D1 competition, which has been a huge advantage for them. They went to State last year and look to return with 2/3rds of their lineup returning. |
| 9 |  ELLSWORTH PANTHERS | Hall of Fame coach Steve Block has another great squad put together this year. The Panthers will be led two 1st Team All-Conference players Brady Yanish and Nick Taranto. |
| 10 |  WAUPACA COMETS | The Comets are once again picked to win the Eastern Valley. Coach John Koronkiewicz returns most of his staff and starters intact. |
| 11 |  FREEDOM IRISH | Waupaca's chief competiton, the Freedom Irish and Comets will battle for the Eastern Valley in 2015. Coach Adam Fox returns half of his pitching and six starters. |
| 12 |  PRAIRIE DU CHIEN BLACKHAWKS | Coach Mark Pedretti has built one of the best DII programs in the State at PdC. The Blackhawks return 2/3rds of their lineup, including Brando Cheek, who hit .347. |
| 13 |  LODI BLUEDEVILS | Lodi, one year removed from their State Championship, will continue to be solid under head coach Kip Nordstrom, a 2014 Hall of Fame inductee. |
| 14 |  EDGERTON CRIMSON TIDE | Mike Gregory's Crimson Tide is in the tough Rock Valley South and will have to go through Jefferson to take the Rock Valley North. Two-thirds of the lineup returns. |
| 15 |  RACINE LUTHERAN-PRAIRIE LP'S | Racine Lutheran-Prairie is picked to finish behind Saint Thomas More. Coach Bob Mallwitz returns 90% of last year's innings from a team that was 15-8. |
| 16 |  WISCONSIN DELLS CHIEFS | The Dells run of SCC Championships ended last year with the ascension of Wautoma. To get on back on top, Coach Mike Michalsky will have to ride his two 1st Team All-SCC players. |
| 17 |  HAYWARD HURRICANES | The Hurricanes return two of the three 1st Team All-Conference picks in the Heart O'North. Coach Mark Berquist returns almost all of his players from last year's 15-6 team. |
| 18 |  MANITOWOC RONCALLI JETS | Roncalli was 13-6 in 2014 and return over half of their lineup from that team. Picked to challenge Saint Mary Central for the Olympian crown. |
| 19 |  PRESCOTT CARDINALS | The Cardinals have one of the best programs in western Wisconsin. Coach Jeff Ryan has another Brookshaw, Michael, who hit .521 in 2014. |
| 20 |  CATHOLIC MEMORIAL CRUSADERS | Switching from summer ball to spring ball and the Wisconsin Little Ten, the Crusaders won the Classic 8 last summer with a record of 21-11. They are excited for DII. |
