Honoring athletes and identifying champions are the main focal points of the National Football Foundation's Joe Tiller Chapter of Northwest Indiana again this year.

As the chapter continues the judging process for the Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award while still accepting nominations through the end of March for the other chapter awards (see awards and nomination form on adjoining pages), many details are now in place for three important events involving our chapter this spring.

Activities begin on the afternoon of Saturday, April 18, as Purdue Gold Standard, our partner student organization, puts on its third annual Color Dodgeball For A Cause at Purdue's Horticulture Park during one of Purdue's busiest of sports days of early 2015. It will take place beginning around 3 p.m. that day, fitting in between the 8:30 a.m. Cancer Challenge 5K Run/Walk, the 1 p.m. Football Spring Game and the 6:30 p.m. Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame Dinner and Ceremony.

Then, on Friday, May 8, the chapter joins forces with Purdue's Trademarks Licensing Office to host an event, the Ryan Kerrigan/12th Boiler Golf Outing at Purdue's Birck Boilermaker Golf Complex in West Lafayette.

Following that is the chapter's primary function, highlighting our scholar-athletes and award winners at the NFF Honors Dinner "Celebrating Our Legends XI" on Wednesday, June 10, at the Purdue Memorial Union Ballrooms in West Lafayette.

COLOR DODGEBALL

The Purdue Gold Standard, which promotes philanthropy and leadership, is looking to expand on the successes of the previous two Color Dodgeball events that were held in the fall of 2012 and the spring of 2014.

The highly-anticipated student-oriented contest serves as a fund-raiser that benefits Purdue's Center for Cancer Research and the NFF Scholarship Fund. This fun-filled afternoon includes the dodgeball tournament loaded with paint, and also features free food, music and giveaways.

GOLF OUTING

The seventh annual golf outing features Kerrigan, the former Boilermaker All-American and first

round draft pick who played in the 2013 Pro Bowl representing the Washington Redskins. Several other former Purdue athletes and coaches have been invited to attend.

Many of the participants in the golf outing will be vendors, retailers and licensees of Purdue University, but there will be plenty of spaces available for NFF chapter members, students and the general public to take part. Cost is \$165 per player (\$75 for students), covering box lunch, golf cart, 18 holes of golf on the Kampen Course and an informal reception/dinner featuring a few presentations at the Voinoff Pavilion following golf. The cost is \$15 less for those who cannot stay for the reception/dinner. Most of the proceeds from the event go toward the 12th Boiler Scholarship Fund and our NFF Scholarship Fund.

HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

He is not required to continue his career as a football player.

Selection process: Nominations are accepted in early winter from high school coaches and/or administrators in the counties covered by this NFF chapter. Nominations are evaluated by the Scholar-Athlete Committee, which recommends at least one recipient per year. This recommendation must be ratified by the Board of Directors and the presentation should be made at the annual Honors Dinner. Other nominees will also be recognized at the Honors Dinner.

Indiana, who are nominated by their schools for our Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award, will be the high school guests of honor along with approximately eight or nine specialty award winners and at least two former high school coaches who will be inducted into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame that evening.

Those 19 scholar-athletes are all high school seniors who are headed to college next fall. Academically, it is an outstanding group. Thirteen of the 19 have 4.0 grade point averages or better, 12 rank in the top 10 percent of the graduating classes, eight are ranked among the top five in their senior classes, and five are on course to be either valedictorian or salutatorian at his school.

Six of those young men will be singled out by judges as finalists for the Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. The winner will be announced at the NFF Honors Dinner on June 10 and will be a candidate for the State of Indiana Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. The “competition” is based 40 percent on academics, 40 percent on athletics and 20 percent on citizenship, leadership and character.

In addition, the dinner will pay tribute to the players and managers chosen as Region 1 and 4 all-stars, all of whom will be candidates to compete for positions on the North Squad in the annual North-South All-Star Game this summer in Indianapolis.

Several previous award winners are being invited back to take part to the Honors Dinner and Silent Auction Reception.

TICKETS/SPONSORSHIPS

Table prices are the same as last year for a table of eight (\$400 for general public, \$320 for NFF chapter members and honorees’ families, and \$280 for students). Single tickets are \$60 for public, \$45 for members and \$35 for students. VIP “After-Glow” Reception tickets are \$100 each.

As a non-profit organization, this chapter has awarded more than \$175,000 in grants, scholarships and honorariums plus another \$55,000 to other charities since receiving its charter in the fall of 2004.

In addition to seeking donations and sponsorships to support the scholarship program, the chapter also receives some money (\$500 for every 50 dues-paying members in the local chapter) from the national office in Irving, Tex. In its first 10 years, this chapter has recognized 195 scholar athletes and awarded a much as \$5,000 to a top honoree.

The tax-deductible membership dues are \$40 per year or \$99 for three years, payable to the National Football Foundation. The NFF has 120 chapters and more than 12,000 members, nationally, and awards more than \$1 million in scholarships each year. The chapter is seeking partners and sponsors for scholarship packages, which are also tax-deductible.
