With three convenient locations in Harmarville, Warrendale, and Bethel Park, BladeRunners has established itself as the industry leader for all your skating needs. Harmarville was opened in 1992 and was the first twin-ice facility in Pittsburgh. Due to the enormous popularity of this facility, two more locations were developed. The Warrendale facility was opened in 1994 and Bethel Park in 1995. In September 2003, a third rink was added to the Harmarville location. The new rink has seating on both sides of the arena and is one of the largest hockey venues in Western Pennsylvania. This multi-purpose facility offers ice activities in the winter and in-line activities in the summer.



The facilities are home to over 6 amateur associations, 15 high school organizations, 200 high school hockey games, 45 adult hockey teams, 4 men's and women's college hockey programs, 3 figure skating programs, 25 youth and adult in-line teams, and numerous in house skating and hockey programs.

BladeRunners has hosted several national competitions in both hockey, in-line, and figure skating since 1992. In 2005, the Harmarville location in partnership with California University of PA hosted the ACHA Division III Men's National Hockey Championships. The BladeRunners Bethel Park has served as the Vulcan's Hockey Club home since the 2004 hockey season.

On May 16, 2012, Geraldine Jones was named acting president of California University of Pennsylvania.

Ms. Jones graduated from California State College in 1972 and earned her master's degree at California in 1980.

She began her career in education as a second-grade teacher in the Albert Gallatin School District, in Uniontown, PA.

She returned to California in 1974, serving as program director for Upward Bound for 20 years and as chair of the Department of Academic Development Services for 11 years. She was associate dean of the College of Education and Human Services for two years before serving as dean from 2000-2008.

In July 2008, she was named provost and vice president for academic affairs, positions she held until being appointed as acting University President.

A member of the Cal U Alumni Association board of directors, Jones has received numerous honors, including the Cal U Alumni Association's John R. Gregg Award for Loyalty and Service, the Black Alumni Association's Outstanding Service Award, and the Community Service Award given by the Minority Students Association at Penn State Fayette.

In 2010 Jones was one of 50 'Women of Excellence' honored by the New Pittsburgh Courier, one of the oldest and most prestigious black newspapers in the United States.

Jones is a lifelong member of Mt. Zion AME Church of Brownsville, Pa., where she has been the church pianist since age 14. She has been married to Jeffrey B. Jones for 38 years; they have two adult daughters and a granddaughter.

Vulcans Highly Await The 2012-13 Season

Cal looks to get over the hump of back-to-back ACHA Semi-Final appearances.

Excitement is around the Cal U hockey team as they begin the 2012-13 season.

The Vulcans will look to build off a second straight ACHA Semi-Final exit towards their second ever ACHA National Championship. With a mixture of youth and experience last season the Vulcans vaulted themselves to their sixth straight Kaliena Cup and CHE Championships. While also earning a second place finish in the Atlantic Region to automatically qualify for the ACHA National Tournament.

This season the Vulcans return two ACHA All-Atlantic Region players, ACHA Atlantic Region Coach of the Year and the CHE Most Outstanding Forward.

Overall the team will return 15 players from last years team that went 28-5.

While the Vulcans return a number of veterans from a season ago they must also replace eight key contributors.

Lost are Captain Nick Posa, Nate Bohn, Shane Bickar, Josh Werner, Jason Hughes, Mitch Faust, Josh York and Dylan Barber.

Posa and Bickar were both named ACHA 1st and 2nd team All Americans respectively. Both players led the Vulcans on and off the ice last season.

Posa recorded 38 points on the season putting him at 215 career points for fifth all-time and most by a Vulcan defenseman.

Bickar had his best statistical season posting a GAA of 2.65 and a SV% of .917. He ranks first all-time in both of those categories for career records among Vulcan goaltenders.

Both Posa and Bickar were the final two remaining members from the Vulcans

2007-08 ACHA National Championship team.

With Bohn, Hughes, Werner and Faust gone the Vulcans will need to replace not only four forwards but four of the top six scorers from the 2011-12 campaign.

In one of his best statistical seasons Bohn recorded 52 points making him seventh all-time on the Vulcans points list with 139.

Werner also eclipsed the 100 point mark last season with 32 points. Not only will the Vulcans miss the scoring from Werner but the added leadership he provided on and off the ice.

Faust and Hughes round out the list of forwards the Vulcans will look to replace this season. Faust leaves the Vulcans only four points shy of recording 100 for his career.

On the defensive side other than Posa the Vulcans lost Barber and York.

Barber spent only one season with the Vulcans but proved to be reliable appearing in 30 games.

York, managed to play 31 games this season and shed the memories of three injury past seasons before the 2011-12 campaign.

While replacing the leadership and scoring will be a large task for the Vulcan coaching staff the biggest question mark may become the teams goaltending.

The Vulcans will start the season with three netminders in Zach Stewart, Boyd Zinger and Cody Patterson.

Stewart returns as the teams leading goaltender from a season ago. Last year he appeared in eight games going 7-1 with a 3.10 GAA and .868 SV %.



Senior Tim Gleason was selected to the ACHA All-Atlantic Region team for the third straight year.

In need of stability in net, Stewart will look to provide the Vulcans with just that on his short experience from last season.

Also contributing in net this season will be Zinger. Last season Zinger anchored the goaltenders on the CHA team.

He appeared in 15 games going 12-3 with a 3.68 GAA and a SV% of .890.

Zingers excellent play last season was a major contribution to the CHA team's first ever league championship.

Patterson rounds out the goaltenders. Last season he saw 11 minutes of action saving all nine shots faced.

On the defensive unit the Vulcans will again be anchored by Tim Gleason, John Miller, Cory Beam, Craig Eddy and Tim Mooney.

Gleason returns as the only captain from last years team. As a senior Gleason will look to provide leadership as well as offensive production having already accounted for over 100 points in his career.

As one of the most balanced players on the team Miller will look to provide stability to the Vulcan defensive unit.

In two seasons Miller has never missed a game.

Last season Mooney doubled his playing time becoming a staple on the Vulcans back line. This season Mooney will yet again look to contribute to the Vulcans in multiple ways.

Eddy only saw action for half the season appearing in 12 games.

Rounding out the returning defensemen is Beam. Not an offensive minded defenseman Beam will add the physicality for the Vulcans defensive unit.

The Vulcans returning forwards are anchored by six sophomores, one junior and one senior.

Ryan Abbott, Kevin Claybaugh, Justin Locante, Zach Milnarcik, Jeremy Pell and Brett Young are the sophomores.

Leading the way is Locante who led the Vulcans in almost every statistical category last season.

Along with leading the Vulcans offensive attack, Locante will look to provide more of a leadership role this season.

Pell produced his first full season last year after taking the 2010-11 season off. In 2009-10 Pell only appeared in seven games.

Last season Pell finished strong providing a spark to the Vulcans offensive attack heading towards the playoffs.

Claybaugh and Milnarcik both electrified the ice with their speed and ability to produce short handed.

Abbott appeared in all 33 games last season scoring five goals.

Young is hoping to find himself in the lineup every game this season after only appearing in 20 games last season.

Junior Tom Graw saw his totals skyrocket in his Sophomore season.

His 15 goals last year are good enough for second highest among returning forwards.

The lone senior is Shane lerardi.

lerardi was a constant in the Vulcan lineup for a third straight season posting 22 points.

This season lerardi will also serve as the clubs President off the ice.

There will be ten newcomers to the Vulcans roster this season.

Zach Alaimo, Trevoer Morrin and James Johe will help sure up the defensive unit.

The new forwards are comprised of Mitch Fernandez, Neil Isler, Mike Marconi, Robert Robison, Neil Stewart, Ben Zalewski.

Players aren't the only areas the Vulcans will be looking to replace for the upcoming season.

Assistant Coaches Jan Battista and Jeff Moyer will not return to the bench.

Both Coach Battista and Moyer were on the Vulcan coaching staff for the past three seasons.

Before joining the CHE coaching staff, Coach Battista spent three seasons as the CHA team Head Coach. Coach Moyer spent two season as the CHA Assistant Coach.

Moyer also played for the CHE team from 2002-07.

Joe Powell and Dan Tonini have been hired as the new Assistant Coaches for the Vulcans. Powell and Tonini previously played for the Vulcans and were members of the 2007-08 ACHA National Championship team.

On their quest for a seventh straight Kalliena Cup and CHE Championship the Vulcans will face a number of familiar opponents.

As usual the Vulcans will have 12 CHE league games. The team will also travel to participate in the Empire Classic Showdown and the Penn State Brandywine Tournament.

New this season on the Vulcans schedule are Youngstown State University, University of Richmond, Alvernia University and Hope College.

The Vulcans matchup with Hope College will be a rematch of last years ACHA Quarterfinal in which the Vulcans won 4-3.

Other non-conference opponents this season will include three games against Neumann University, Penn State Brandywine and Richard Stockton University.

SEASON REVIEW



In the 2011-12 season the Vulcans used a mixture of veterans and newcomers to record one of their best seasons in history. For a sixth straight season they won the Kaliena Cup and the College Hockey East Playoff Championship. The Vulcans again were awarded a spot in the ACHA National Tournament by finishing in second place of the Atlantic Region. During the National Tournament the Vulcans were able to go 3-0 in pool play advancing to the ACHA National Semi-Finals for the second straight season. Unfortunately that is where the Vulcans season would end as they fell to the eventual runner-up Davenport University giving the Vulcans their second straight overall third place finish.

The Vulcans success this season was not limited to the team as many players received league, regional and national honors. Seniors Nick Posa and Shane Bickar were selected as ACHA First and Second Team All-Americans respectively. They were also joined on the ACHA Atlantic All-Region team by Justin Locante, Nate Bohn, Tim Gleason and Head Coach Justin Berger who won his third straight ACHA Atlantic Region Coach of the Year award. Being honored with CHE awards were Locante for Most Outstanding Forward, Posa for Defensive Player of the Year and Bickar for Goalie of the Year.

During the season the Vulcans were led by the outstanding play from Freshman Justin Locante. In only his first season he recorded 41 goals and 34 assists for 75 points. Goaltender Shane Bickar, voted team MVP, also left his imprint on the season. He posted season bests in almost every goaltending category in club history. On the season he was 21-4 with a 2.65 GAA and a save percentage of 91.7%.

Heading into next season the Vulcans will look to replace key players from this season and years past. Some of those players include the 5th leading scorer of all-time in Nick Posa, one of the most decorated goaltenders in club history in Shane Bickar and two 100 point scorers in Nate Bohn and Josh Werner.

History

The hockey club at California University of Pennsylvania has been in existence for many years, but its past history is certainly not one of great success and accomplishment. In 2002, however, that legacy was broken. That year, Jamison Roth teamed with advisor Chuck Bohn to breathe life into the forgettable program. What has happened since has been a rise to excellence that has placed Cal U among the top hockey programs in the region and nation. The future promises a bright future for Cal U Hockey.

Cal U joined the College Hockey East (CHE) for the 2002-03 season and immediately established itself as a team to be reckoned with by winning the 2003 CHE Provisional Tournament Championship. That same year, Cal U joined the American Collegiate Hockey Association (ACHA) at the Division III level. The CHE team (CAL 1) is still a member of CHE and ACHA today. The CHE currently consists of teams from western Pennsylvania and western New York, while the ACHA DIII level is approximately 140 teams from colleges and universities across the nation. Cal U is currently the six time defending CHE conference champion (07,08,09,10,11,12). The program also won the University's first ever male national team championship, as the Vulcan's won the 2008 ACHA Division III National Championship. The ACHA holds its annual national tournament every March at various locations across the country. California University of PA hosted the 2005 ACHA DIII National Championships in Pittsburgh where the team finished 7th overall.

Hosting the 2005 National Tournament in Pittsburgh went a long way in strengthening the relationship the hockey club has with the University. While the team is unable to provide scholarships to its players, the University does provide the team with the financial and academic support it needs to operate effectively. The club is still run by the players, who pay dues each semester and form a Board of Directors to oversee its operations.

After starting the 2002 season with only 12 players, the Cal Hockey Club has grown to over 60 men players strong, warranting the formation of a second men's team. The Collegiate Hockey Association (CHA) was formed in 2004 with Cal U's second team as one of four founding members. The purpose of the CHA team is to provide another level of play for Cal's hockey players that isn't quite as competitive and doesn't require quite the same time commitment as the CHE team. That doesn't mean the CHA team is just an afterthought, though, proven by its run to the CHA Championship Games in 2005 & 2010 and first ever CHA Championship in 2012.

The 2008-09 season marked the inaugural season of our women's program. The team accomplished unprecedented success in its first season by winning its regular season and playoff conference championships. In winning the regular season crown, the team finished with a perfect 10-0-0 conference record. The women participate in the Delaware Valley College Hockey Conference (DVCHC) and nationally in the ACHA Women's Division II. The women's team has now won a DVCHC Division II Championship in 2009 and the DVCHC Division I Championship in 2011. This past season the team qualified for the ACHA Division II National Tournament for the first time in club history.

All teams practice and play their home games at The BladeRunners Ice Complex in Bethel Park, PA. The rink is located about 30 minutes from campus. Cal Hockey also has many banners and posters throughout the rink to demonstrate this rink as the club's home. The Cal logo is also painted in the ice for all spectators and players to view. BladeRunners hosts around a dozen CHE games, ten CHA games and 8-10 Women's games each season, while each team plays about the same number of road games each year in preparation for their respective post-seasons.

On Saturday April 4th, 2009 the California University of Pennsylvania Ice Hockey club honored General Manager Jamison Roth by retiring his number. Roth's retired number becomes the first in the clubs history.

In 2002 Jamison led the resurgence that brought the club back and on the path toward prominence where it currently sits today. Serving as the General Manager and Captain Jamison was able to oversee the building of the CHE team along with the addition of the CHA team and then the women's team.

Although, Roth's accomplishments were not limited to his off the ice work. He is one of the most decorated players in club history and ranks near the top in mostly every statistical category. After playing in 126 games Jamison finished with 171 goals and 125 assists for 296 points averaging 2.35 points per game. On the power play he recorded 55 goals for a total of 110 power play points. During his five years he managed to score 17 game winning goals. All of those currently have him ranked second overall. Jamison's 18 short-handed goals are the best in the club history.

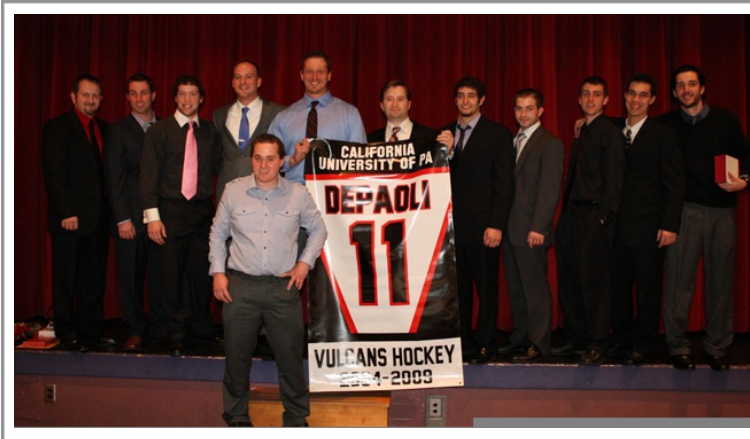
Jamison has also received numerous awards for his on and off the ice accomplishments. In 2003-04 he was named the CHE General Manager of the Year. After the 2006-07 season the ACHA honored Jamison by naming him to the ACHA Atlantic All-Region first team, and was also an ACHA Academic All-American. He was also honored by the CHE in 2006-07 when they awarded him the Student Athlete of a Lifetime renaming the award the Jamison Roth Student Athlete of the Year.

During his five years he also served as the teams captain for four seasons while serving as an alternate captain for one season.

Jamison still serves as the teams General Manager and is now the Director of Sports Clubs at California University of Pennsylvania.



For the second time in club history the Vulcans will raise a players name into rafters at the Bethel Park BladeRunners as BJ DePaoli's number 11 jersey was retired on Saturday April 14, 2012. At the clubs annual banquet General Manager Jamison Roth made the announcement that DePaoli would become the second player to have their number retired by the club. Prior to Saturday Roth's number 6 jersey was the only other retired number since he was given that honor in 2009.



The retiring of DePaoli's number does not come as a surprise as he is arguably one of the greatest players in club history. In his five-year career DePaoli set and broke numerous offensive records and was one of the best players in the ACHA year in and out. Currently BJ holds the club career records for points, goals, assists, plus/minus and hat tricks.

While playing 122 games in those five years BJ recorded 179 goals and 234 assists for 413 points. He is the only player to record over 400 career points and his 413 points give him a 67 point advantage over Ryan Jones's 346. BJ also holds an astounding career plus/minus of 152 and has had 26 hat tricks. Per game for his career he averaged 1.46 goals, 1.91 assists and 3.38 points. BJ also ranks second all-time in power play goals and points along with being in the top five in short-handed and game winning goals.

DePaoli's numbers did not go unnoticed as he received numerous national and regional awards. Three times he was named an ACHA Division III Academic All-American. Twice he was named the ACHA Division III Atlantic Region Player of the Year, first team ACHA Division III All-American and first team ACHA Division III Atlantic All-Region. Once he was named second team ACHA Division III Atlantic All-Region, first team ACHA Division III All-Tournament Team and second team ACHA Division III All-Tournament Team. His most notable award came after the 2007/08 season when he was named the ACHA Division III National Player of the Year.

The awards were not limited to the ACHA as he was named the CHE Most Outstanding Forward three times and once the CHE Playoff MVP. BJ was also once voted by his teammates as the Cal U Most Valuable Player.

In the 2007/08 season BJ served as the teams captain when he was a member of the only ACHA Division III National Championship team in club history.

"BJ was a quiet person and didn't speak up too much, but he led by his actions on the ice" said Head Coach Justin Berger. "He was the type of player that could control a game when he put his mind to it as he did in the 2007/08 National Semi-Finals against Northern Colorado. He was instrumental in our early successes at Cal and helped it gain the recognition it gets today. He was one of the players that cut the path for classes after him to make wider."
