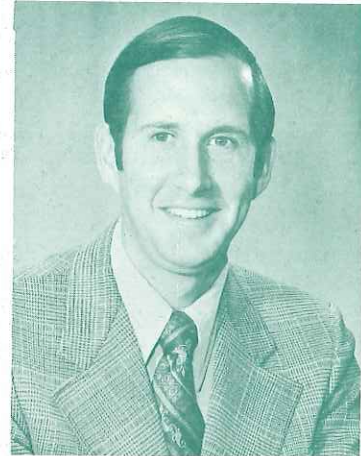

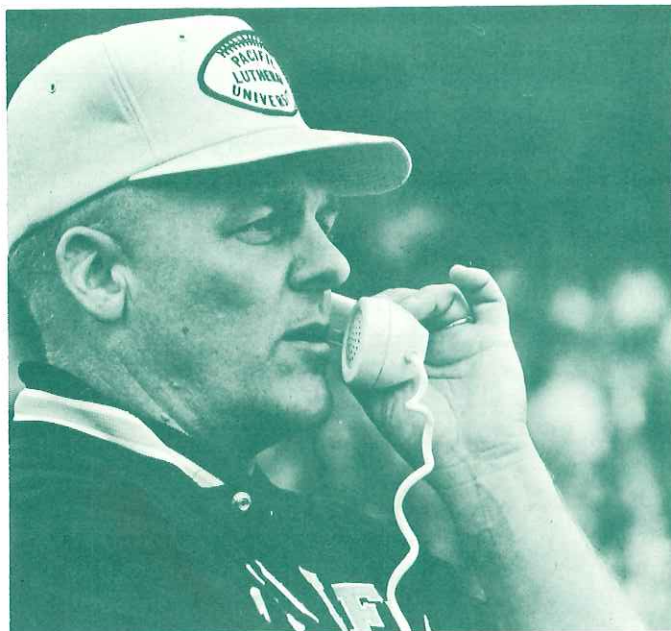

Creation of a "PHD" football program — Pride, Hustle, and Desire — requires the services of a learned grid architect. Craftsman Frosty Westering has embellished his football theories through the formal educational process and practical on-the-field construction.

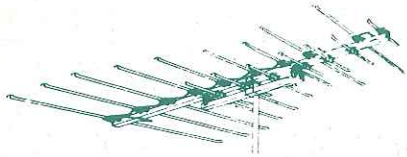
Dr. Westering, whose advanced degree is from Colorado State, is the builder, innovator, motivator, and strategist who secured, in his second PLU campaign, the Lutes' first outright Northwest Conference grid crown since PLU joined the league in 1965.

An offensive end at Northwestern and U. of Omaha, Frosty compiled a 47-21-3 prep record in his native Iowa. After eight years it was on to Parsons College where, in 1962, following a 10-0 season, he was named Iowa Collegiate Coach of the Year. Frosty carried the Athletic Director's portfolio at Parsons and later at Lea (Minn.) College.

Frosty, who is married and has five children, sports a 56-32-2 collegiate coaching record.

Not the Opener for Bengalums, But Nightcap of Doubleheader

A legendary New York baseball manager's malaprops were recorded for posterity — a twisted rhetoric called Stengelese. Steve Harshman, successful and articulate coach of the Alumni team has his own word game going tonight — called Bengalese.

Surprisingly, there is a baseball parallel here.

Because Harshman, PLU's Jack Hewins Senior Award winner in 1972, is also the coach of the Pierce County Bengals, a power in the semi-pro Northwest International Football League and because twelve ex-Lutes play for such aggregation, tonight's Varsity-Alumni clash may not be the typical fraternal confrontation. In a departure from the norm, at least one-third of the roster is organized and synchronized.

Lest we pass it by — the baseball connection. Well, the Bengals, 4-0 in conference action going into this week's game, played a league contest this noon in Monroe, so for a dozen players this represents the second game of a twin-bill.

Smacked 27-7 last year, the Alums will build around the Bengal nucleus of end Dave Roller, tackles Bill Krieger and George Van Over. George and fellow 1973 Little All-Northwest Selection Randy Shipley, a guard, will plant their collective 515 pounds next to center Dave Bennet and guard Stan Pietras.

The Alum running game will feature fullback Dan Pritchard, who amassed 2039 yards during his Lute career which concluded in 1972. Ex-Lutes, now Bengals on defense include tackle Bob Jones, linebacker Steve Adelson, plus backs Kurt Snow, Doug Jansen and Bob Holloway.

At least three former Lute All-Americans, linebackers Gary Nelson and Gary Renggli plus defensive end Ross Boice will complement the Bengalums.
