JACK SCHRAM Varsity Head Coach

Jack enters his seventh year as the Head Varsity Football Coach at Miramonte High School. He was a Varsity Assistant Coach at Miramonte from 2006-2010 working primarily with the offensive/defensive lines and was heavily involved in the offensive game plan. Last year Jack doubled as the Head Boys Golf coach at Miramonte. Prior to coming to Miramonte, Jack was the Head Varsity Football Coach at Encinal High School from 1990-2005. In 1988-89 he was the Varsity Line Coach and Head JV Coach. In addition to football Jack also coached track, wrestling, and golf at Encinal. He has also coached baseball and basketball for middle school athletes. He has been involved with both the boys and girls

Lacrosse program at Miramonte, helping the girls win their first NCS championship in 2015. Jack was a three-sport letterman in football, wrestling, and track at Alameda HS in Lakewood, Colorado. 
SEKAI GREER DB/RB Coach

The Mats got off to a rough during the first half, being down 21-0 at halftime. But that does not mean there were not good plays being made. Henry Vacakis had a great 24 yard run to pick up a first down on a key 3 & 3 play. The O-line created a big hole for him with some great downfield blocking. Keilan Stone made a great catch and run to pick up 33 yards. Sam Walker was hit in the backfield on a key play in the first half but somehow managed to pick up some positive yards. Walker and Childers also had some great stops in the first half on 3rd and 4th down to prevent Clayton Valley from scoring more points. With time running out in the first half, Vacakis made another big play, running for 45 yards, but an interception ended the drive with the Mats down 21-0.

But we won the second half 21-20!





The Mats had a critical 3rd and 1 and Peter Stehr got 1 yard plus 31 more for the first down to keep the drive alive. We ended up scoring our first touchdown of the game on this drive with a 1 yard throw from Clark to Will Cassriel. With the third quarter winding down, we had a critical 4th & 2, and Vacakis pounded his way for a first down but ultimately we did not get any points out of this drive.

The start of the fourth quarter was sparked with great defense. Ben Schmiedt deflected a pass that was almost picked off. AJ Fraser came in at QB and orchestrated a strong drive with passes to Ethan Fischler and Cassriel and ultimately finding Fischler in the end zone on an 8 yard dart to give the Mats their second touchdown of the evening. With time winding down Greg Austin recovered a fumble and Tyler Lowe ran it in from 1 yard out for a touchdown and final score of 41-21.

Way to fight Mats!





Miramonte 21 Alhambra 7

The Mats got on the board in the first with a 9 yard TD run by Peter Stehr. Henry Marken made the extra point to give the Mats a 7-0 lead. The defense played great held the bulldogs scoreless for the first quarter. Sam Walker and Jake Hassard came up with some big hits on "The Bus". No points were scored in the second quarter for either team as the Mats were pinned down at the one yard line to start the quarter. Clark to Khan kept the drive alive and set up a 4th and 1, while Stehr picked up three to move the chains. The drive ultimately stalled at the end of the first half with an interception in the end zone. Mats up 7-0 at the half!

The Bulldogs got on the board first in the third quarter with a 16 yard TD run by the bus to tie the score at 7-7. But on the ensuing drive deep in Bulldog territory, Stehr ran it in from the 15 yard line for the touchdown to give the lead back to the Mats. After the extra point by Marken, the Mats were winning 14-7. At the end of the third quarter the Mats were on top 14-7.

With 11:47 seconds left in the game the announcement over the loud speaker was made that Brad Zwhalen had lost his credit card. That seemed to inspire Nick Miller on defense as he came up with a big play on defense and a tackle for a loss. As the Bulldogs were driving deep into Mats territory they lost the ball and the Mats came up with a key takeaway to keep the Bulldogs out of the end zone. On the ensuing Mats offensive series, Clark hit Ethan Fischler for a 64 yard TD pass. Welcome back Ethan! After the PAT by Marken, the Mats lead 21-7, which ultimately was your final score.





**Miramonte 47 Alameda 6
Friday, Sept. 15th, 2017
ORINDA, CA**

Mats' Varsity football swatted the Alameda Hornets in week four with a 47-6 victory where everyone contributed. The Mats' defense played to perfection, shutting out Alameda's offense and yielding only 26 total yards. Sam Walker led the defense with ten tackles, and Peter Stehr, Ben Schmiedt, Keilen Stone, Travis Armistead, and Quinn Rochette each made four or more. Armistead and Will Cassriel frustrated Hornets' drives with an interception each. The only points Alameda managed to muster came on special teams—a 75-yard kickoff return with 31 seconds to go in the first half.

On the other side of the ball, the Mats' offense was led by its line, which dominated the trenches, enabling the team to roll for 341 rushing yards, 190 passing yards, and seven touchdowns. Stehr enjoyed a career night with four touchdowns, one receiving and three rushing, including a 60 yarder at the beginning of the 3rd quarter to put the Mats up 40-6 and force a running clock. In all, Stehr ran for 138 yards on seven carries, averaging an astounding 19.7 yards per carry. Henry Vacakis made his presence known with two rushing touchdowns and 78 yards on seven carries. Quarterback Xavier Clark marked an efficient night, completing 11 of 15 passes for 185 yards and two touchdowns. His longest completion was a perfectly placed 49-yard fly down the left sideline to Cassriel, and his second longest pass was to Walker in the flat, who then stretched it into a 31-yard touchdown by dancing through a swarm of Hornets. On the Mats' final drive, running backs Jason Paucar, Tyler Lowe, and Jack Hansen finished strong, each rushing for about 15 yards per carry. Kicker Henry Marken had a busy and successful night with five PAT's.



FROSH Update

The Mats freshman football team came together to put in their best performance of the season, even if the final score was not on our side. The Mats faced an impressively large Vacaville Bulldog team. The first quarter started slow for both teams. The Mats first opportunity came when O Lewis recovered a fumble on a punt return. The Mats were unable to capitalize on the fumble, and turned the ball back over on downs. The defense (including multiple sacs by Garner and impressive tackles by Straub, Smith and Fouch) held the Bulldogs to a 0-0 at the end of the first quarter.

The second quarter opened with a Bulldog touchdown and conversion. After a quick possession, the Mats fumbled on the snap, giving Vacaville excellent field position. The Bulldog quarterback scored immediately, bringing the game to 0-14. Our boys swiftly responded when Browne ran 65 yards to score for Miramonte: 7-14. On the kick-off, the Bulldogs had an impressive run-back, which was stopped by Foster with a shoestring tackle. Again, with strong field position, the Bulldogs scored. 


FROSH Update

The Matadors celebrated their first Victory of the season, defeating the Alameda Hornets 26-0.


With less than 3 minutes to go in the first quarter, Mollahan had a great run to get the ball into the end zone. At the end of the first, the Mats led by a score of 6-0.
