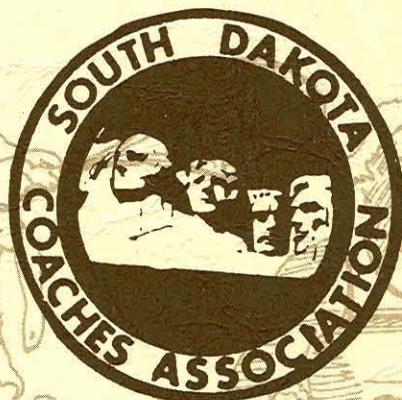

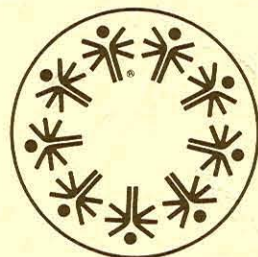

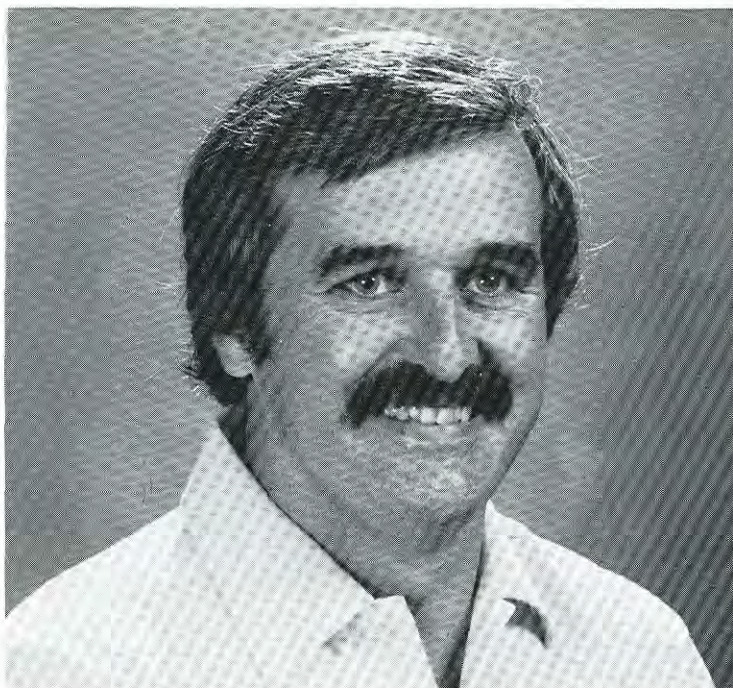
1984 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR

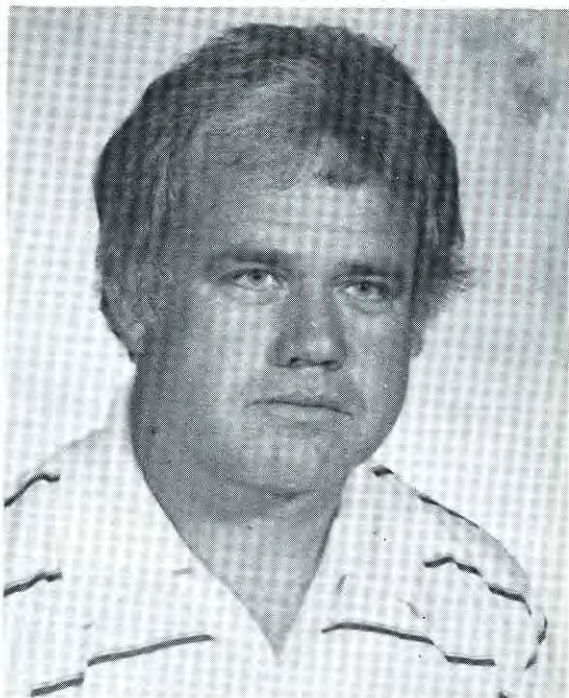
1984 GIRLS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR

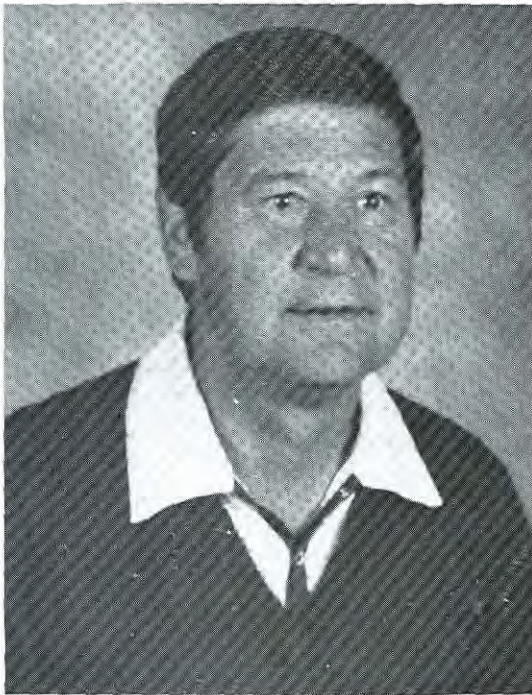
1984 GOLF COACH OF THE YEAR
