BURDELL COPLAN, CANTON

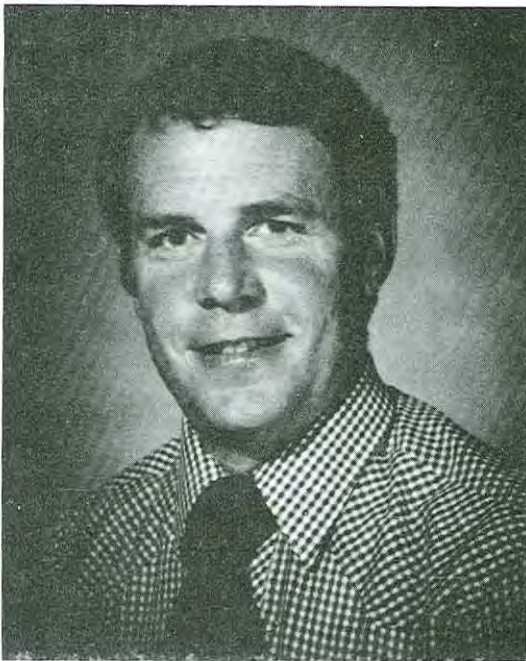

DAN BOHL, HOVEN

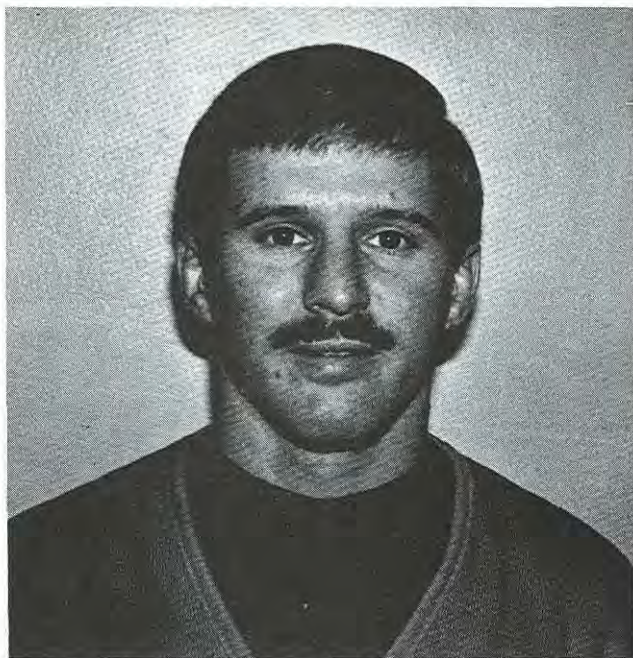


The Hoven Greyhounds boys' team dominated the state meet, despite the fact that they did not field a complete team the year before. They were ahead of the second place team by 24 points.

Six years ago Ortmann accepted a challenge involving a sport that was new to him. He has built a strong program and worked with some dedicated athletes. "Any honors I receive are a credit to this team . . . they're as hard a working bunch as any I've had the privilege to work with."

Ortmann has been at Lennox twelve years, ten as head wrestling coach and six as the cross country coach.

Hopkins' 1986 Warriors won the state Class "A" championship, and had only one loss during their season. He said it was a great way to send off the seniors on the team - the bond between coach and players is close.

He has coached the Warriors nine years and is also golf coach for both the boys and girls teams.

SANDY GREENOUGH, MILLER-WESSINGTON

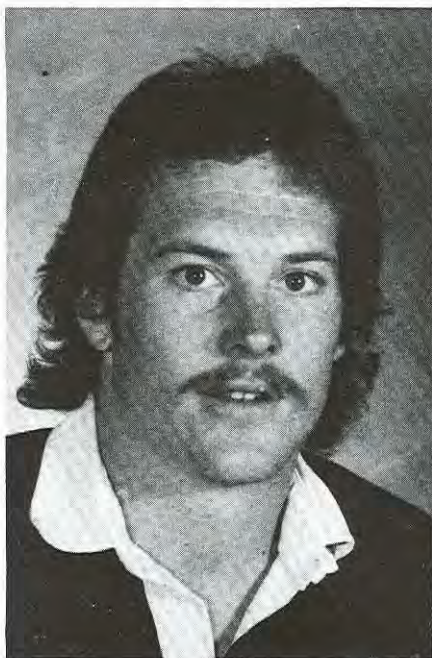


Greenough's squad finished in first place in the state "B" tourney and won four of the five triangular meets in which they competed. "It's really the team that carries you through. I have to give my girls a lot of credit. The girls put in long hours, and they're hard workers."

Greenough is a Miller native, attended Black Hills State College, and began her teaching career at Wessington. She now coaches track and gymnastics in addition to being an elementary teacher.

MIKE KADERA, SPEARFISH

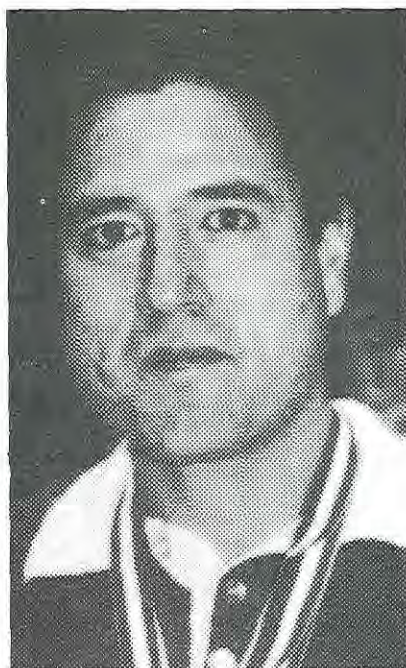


Kadera is a graduate of Douglas High School and was a wrestling standout for Black Hills State College.

He guided the Spearfish Spartans to the 1986 state Class "A" wrestling title. "Our kids wrestled up to and beyond their ability. I didn't expect us to win." The team had three individual champions.

The Pine Ridge Thorpes were the only unbeaten boys team in the state this season, with a 26-0 record. "When we lost in double overtime in the state tournament a year ago, the kids dedicated themselves to coming back and winning it all. They had a belief in themselves and me. We try to develop all-around players, and I think our program has proved that it has worked out that way."

Mendoza is a native of Eagle Butte and a graduate of Huron College.



1987 GOLF COACH OF THE YEAR
RICH HALVERSON, CLEAR LAKE



Halverson's boys' teams won their second straight Class "B" championship this year, and in these two years have won all but one of the tournaments and dual meets they entered. The Cardinal girls' teams have won four of the last five region championships.

"My thanks goes out to the dedicated athletes who have been and who are part of our golf program." A graduate of Watertown and Augustana College, he has taught and coached at Clear Lake the past 21 years.



1987 GIRLS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR
JUDY BUSCH, SIOUX FALLS LINCOLN



Busch is the only girls' coach Lincoln has had in its sixteen seasons. Her teams have been state champions in 1974, 1975, 1976 and 1987, and finished in second place in 1985 and 1986. They also have fifteen regional titles and four conference titles to their credit.

"This has been a great group to work with. They worked hard on and off the track and were so supportive of everyone else."



1987 BOYS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR
TOM MAIN, CHESTER



Chester High School raced to their first state championship this year. They won the region championship the last two years. Main gives a lot of credit to the enthusiastic assistants he has worked with.

Main joined the Flyers' staff in 1971, coaching both football and track, and in 1975 became their athletic director. He is a graduate of Hartford High School and Dakota State College.

LUNETTE BIRRENKOTT, RAPID CITY STEVENS**

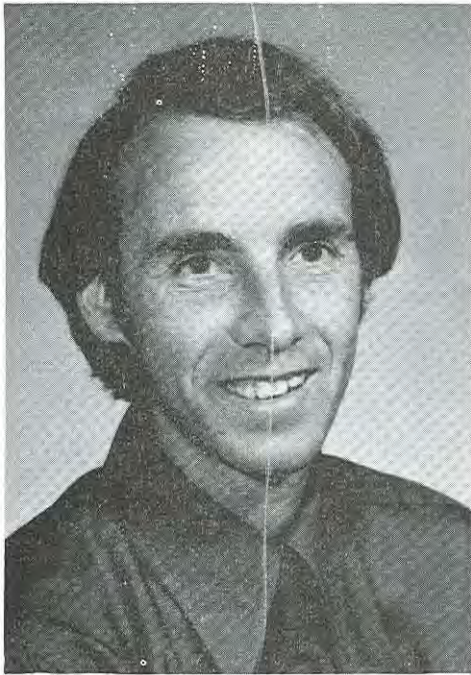


Birrenkott is a native of Lemmon, South Dakota, and a South Dakota State graduate. The Stevens Raiders, who had only one letterwinner returning from a state championship team, captured the regional title and finished second in the state tourney.

Building his teams from the ground up, over the last fifteen years, they have reached the top. This past season the girls' squad captured their first state title and were second place in 1985. Hulst's teams have taken the conference title four of the last five years. The boys' teams have placed second in a strong conference.

"This is more of a team honor - it is something for the whole team. It's important to keep a good mental attitude. To be successful, one has to play and participate and do the best possible job." Hulst emphasizes that tennis is a good lifetime sport.

“We want all of our programs to be competitive, not just one. I think it was the fact that all of our programs are getting more competitive” that he won the honor, Carney said.

The Chargers football teams played for the Class “11B” state championship in 1982 and have reached the semifinal round the last three seasons.



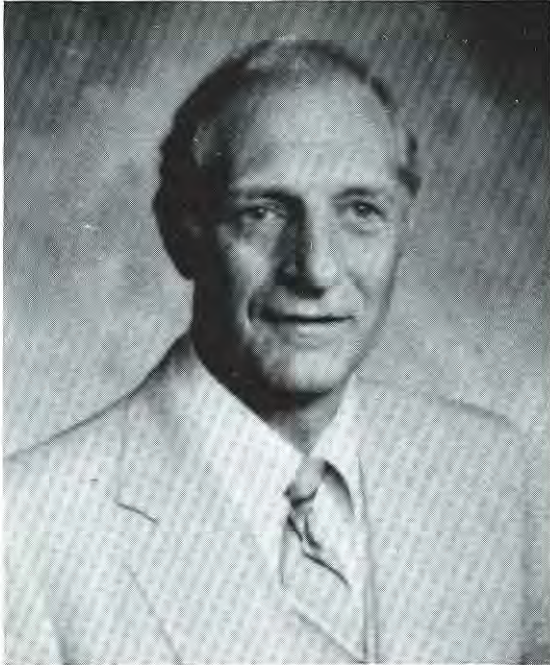
1987 SPORTSCASTER OF THE YEAR

MAX HAWK, YANKTON



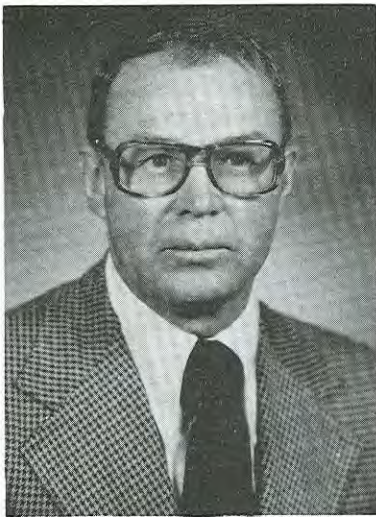
Given for outstanding contributions to high school athletics and dedication to the highest and best in high school athletics.

Hawk has received many coaching awards in the past, and it is fitting here tonight that we honor him with our Distinguished Service Award for all he has done for our association.



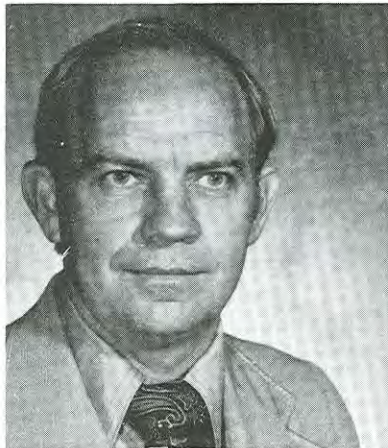
