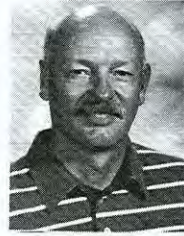

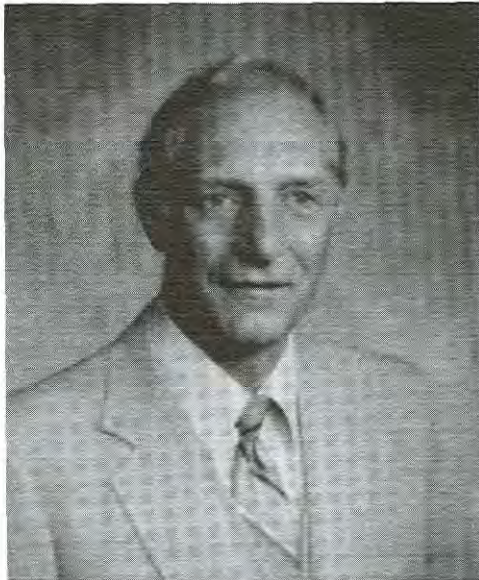

1994 FOOTBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
MAX HAWK, Yankton

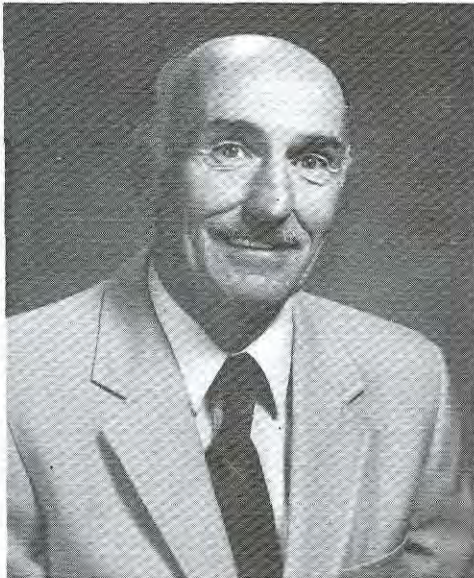


Max Hawk's Bucks put the frosting on the cake at the Dakota Dome last November when they won the Class 11AA football championship by outlasting a talented Rapid City Stevens team 34-31 in a triple-overtime thriller. That was the cap to another undefeated season and was the 28th gridiron victory for Hawk's glorious 38-year career - a record that stands alone at the top as a South Dakota all-time best.

Hawk, who coached for eight years in Scotland and for 30 more in Yankton, has announced his retirement. His final team not only gave him his third playoff championship, but his 17th E.S.D. Conference football crown and was the fifth undefeated team during his career.



1994 BOYS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR
DAVE SCOTT, Hot Springs



The Hot Springs boys' cross country runners saved the best for the last. After going without a victory all fall, Dave Scott's Bison won a surprising gold medal with the state Class A championship in Pierre last October.

"We were unknown, but we knew we were pretty good," said Scott, who won the state coaching honor for the first time.



1994 GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR
DON LHOTAK, Bonesteel-Fairfax



When the Bonesteel-Fairfax students said that they wanted a cross country team in 1992, veteran coach Don Lhotak, a USD/Springfield graduate, grabbed the reins and quickly made the eager runners an area power in the sport.

This year, in only their third season, the Bonesteel-Fairfax girls finished second in the girls' state State Class B cross country meet; and the boys' team grabbed third. The high finish for the two teams gave them the coveted combined state championship - and it gave their respected longtime coach the state's Coach of the Year honor.



1994 GIRLS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
TIM PFLANZ, Wakonda



Tim Pflanz stepped into some big shoes when he took over the Wakonda girls' basketball program in 1992. Ron Flynn had led the Warriorettes to an unprecedented five-year domination of the sport - including a state record 101-game win streak. Pflanz quickly led Wakonda back to the top, winning another state championship and racking up a 24-2 record following two 17-4 years.

"The girls were hungry and were willing to work hard," was the comment of Pflanz, a native of Belden, Nebraska, and a Mount Marty College graduate.



1995 GYMNASTICS COACH OF THE YEAR
LINDA COLLIGNON, Madison



When Linda Collignon led the Madison Lady Bulldogs to a slim championship victory over Stanley County this year, it was the first time that the Madison girls had ever captured any state title.

Coach Collignon says that respect and communication are her two big coaching "anchors". "It's really because of my team that I am getting the coach's award," she modestly said. "It's really a compliment to them."



1995 VOLLEYBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
JOYCE FARRELL, Madison

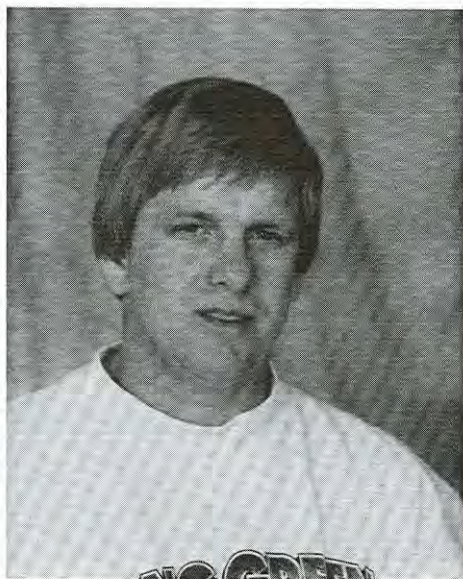


Longtime Madison coach Joyce Farrell spurred her Lady Bulldogs to a late-season drive that culminated in the SD State Class A Volleyball championship. For their success she has been named the Volleyball Coach of the Year.

"I really appreciate all the girls who have allowed me to work with them and to accept what they are told in order to improve their skills and to believe in themselves," commented the 24-year coaching veteran.



1995 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR
RICK JENSEN, Pierre



The Pierre Governors, coached by nine-year veteran Rick Jensen, won the E.S.D. Conference championship, were the top team in the Rapid City Invitational Tournament, and grabbed fourth place in the hotly-contested State Class A wrestling tournament.

“We’ve worked hard to build from the youth wrestling on up,” commented Jensen. “We are now starting to reap some benefits from the hard work of the wrestlers, the parents and the coaches who have been involved.”



1995 BOYS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
MARV McCUNE, De Smet



Marv McCune, who starred with the fine De Smet basketball champions in the early 1970's, successfully led his Bulldogs to the 1995 state Class B championship. For this he has been selected as Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year.

McCune had previously been nominated for the post-season honor when his team won the state B title in 1987 and when his football team brought home the grid title in 1981.

"Personal recognition is not as important as getting the kids to live up to their potential - both on the court and off," McCune commented.



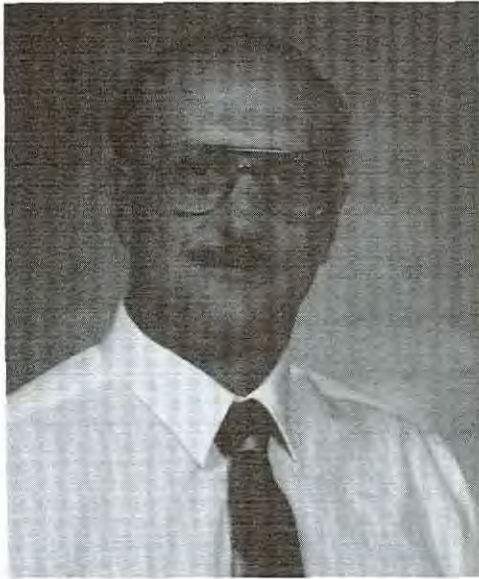
1995 GIRLS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR
GENE BROWNELL, Aberdeen



Gene Brownell, who has spent eighteen years coaching track athletes, at both the junior and senior high levels, has been named the Girls' Track Coach of the Year. Now the head girls' coach at Aberdeen Central High, Brownell led the Golden Eagle girls to team championships in both the E.S.D. Conference and in the tough Region 3AA competition this past spring. In the hotly contested Class AA in the rain-plagued state meet his girls placed fifth.



1995 BOYS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR
JIM SATTLER, Menno



Veteran coach Jim Sattler, who undertook the rebuilding of a weak Menno track program thirteen years ago, has been named the Boys' Track Coach of the Year for the second time. His perennially strong Wolves have won nine straight regional track championships - a mark that he feels surpasses even the two straight state Class B titles that they won in 1989 and 1990 - a feat that resulted in Sattler's first Coach of the Year award.

"It really doesn't matter what kind of coach you are if you don't have the athletes and the support of the community and the school," he commented.



1995 TENNIS COACH OF THE YEAR
GAYLE KLEIN, Mitchell



In spite of a series of nagging injuries, Gayle Klein led her Mitchell girls' tennis team to a third-place finish in last fall's state tournament. She then, this spring, rolled to a second place finish with the Kernel boys' team, winning the E.S.D. Conference title on the way. For these outstanding achievements, the veteran Klein has been named Tennis Coach of the Year.

Klein credited the dedication and determination of the students/athletes in achieving their best season ever. "The boys and girls really wanted to do well this year. We felt that we had the talent to go far, and we surpassed anything that any previous Mitchell tennis team has accomplished," she commented.



1995 GOLF COACH OF THE YEAR
JIM SORENSEN, Beresford



Jim Sorensen, the Golf Coach of the Year, has developed the Beresford High School golf program into perennial state champion contenders. The Watchdog girls won their sixth state title this spring. He has led the boys to three championships since his first season in 1971.

"We have been fortunate to have a number of good athletes take part in our program," Sorensen said. "We have also been getting good numbers, as we average having fifty kids coming out for the golf team."



**1995 ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR
IN BOYS' SPORTS**

RAY KOOISTRA, Yankton High School



A member of the Yankton High School staff for 29 years, Kooistra, a Dakota State graduate from Salem, was praised by longtime associate, head Buck coach Max Hawk. "Ray's teaching of football skills and discipline has greatly added to the total football program in Yankton."

Kooistra, who has retired following the 1994-95 school year, has also been very active in the Yankton High track and field program - boys and girls. He even spent a couple of years as the head track coach.

Hawk added, "In all of Ray's seasons as our sophomore football coach, he never had a kid quit the program. That's a real tribute to his value as a teacher."



1995 ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR
IN GIRLS' SPORTS

MARY ELLEN LUIKENS, Scotland



Mary Ellen Luikens, a Dakota State graduate from Waverly, has been involved in girls' basketball at Scotland since the sport became a viable part of the state's sports scene in 1975. In addition, she has helped with the track and volleyball program for the Highlanders.

Tom Schlimgen, longtime head coach at Scotland, pointed out, "The fact the the girls call Mary Ellen 'Mom' speaks for the level of respect and fondness the girls have for her."



**1995 ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR
IN JUNIOR HIGH/MIDDLE SCHOOL SPORTS**

KENN ANDERSON, Sioux Falls



Kenn Anderson, who has been actively coaching at Edison Middle School in Sioux Falls since 1957, is the first middle school coach to be honored by the S.D.H.S.C.A. Anderson coached football, basketball and track before becoming the school's athletic coordinator sixteen years ago.

"It's quite an honor," said Anderson. "I think that it's great the the coaches' association is recognizing middle school as being a part of the whole picture."



1995 ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OF THE YEAR
LOWELL GILBERTSON, Arlington



Gilbertson has spent 27 of his 33 years in education at Arlington, where he is a teacher, coach and athletic director. During his tenure, the Cardinals have won 68 conference, 27 region, twelve district and four state championships.

1995 SPORTSCASTER OF THE YEAR
SCOTT KOOISTRA, Yankton



Scott Kooistra, who has been the “Voice of the Bucks and Gazelles” for the past ten seasons, has been named Sportscaster of the Year. Kooistra, a native of Kalamazoo, Michigan, has a positive attitude in his play-by-play coverage. “I don’t like to cut down other teams,” he said. “I like to push the kids and their accomplishments. While I don’t think that it’s wrong to root for the home team,” he added, “I do think it is wrong to knock the other team.”

Scott has provided coverage in track, football, cross country, basketball, gymnastics and volleyball as well as golf and wrestling for fans in the Yankton area.

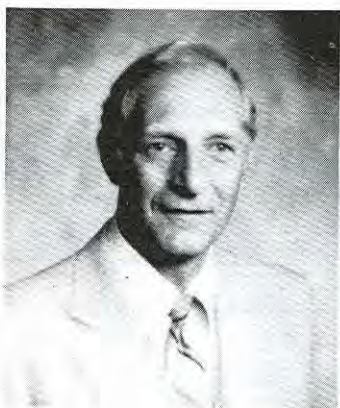
