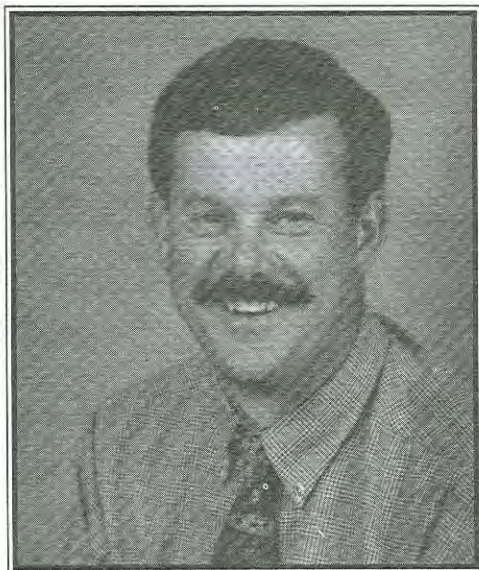
"Getting the team together was a task," Flaagen said. "We never had our full team on the course at the same time during the season until the state meet."

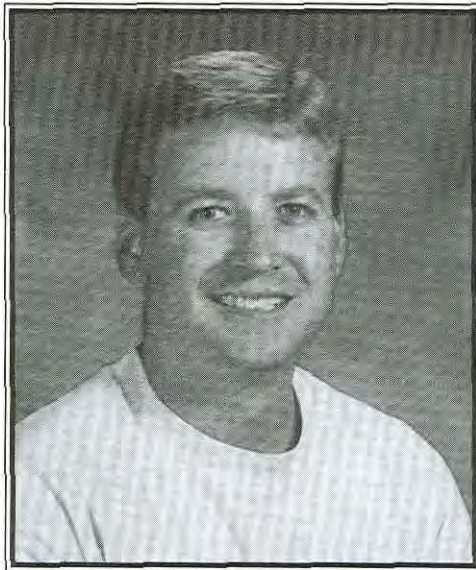
"We have been pretty consistent through the years," Heitmann said. "I try to get the kids to do the best they can and enjoy it."

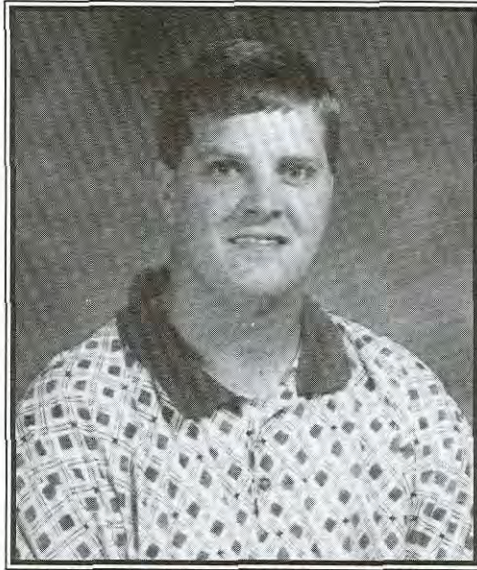
In one year at Canton and three in Vermillion, Skatrud has compiled a .741 win-loss average.

1998 BOYS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

BRAD THORSON

Brandon Valley



Brad Thorson's third year as the head basketball coach of the Brandon Valley Lynx would be hard to duplicate. But the Canton native led his team through an even better season in 1997-98. The Lynx repeated as Eastern South Dakota champions in a highly competitive field, with two wins over the favored Mitchell Kernels during the regular season highlighting the route. Then Thorson's team made it to the state meet with a convincing District 2AA championship, their second in a row.

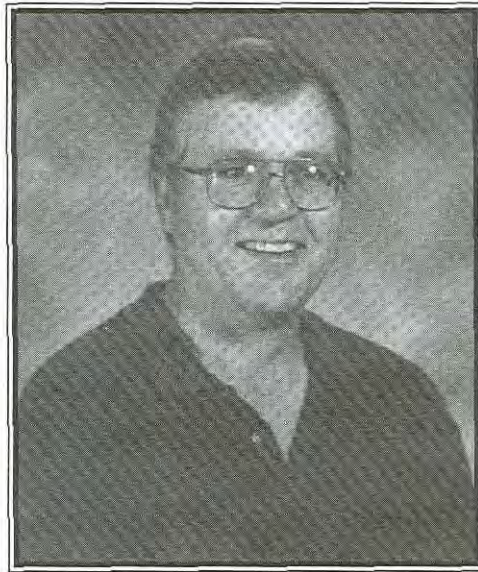

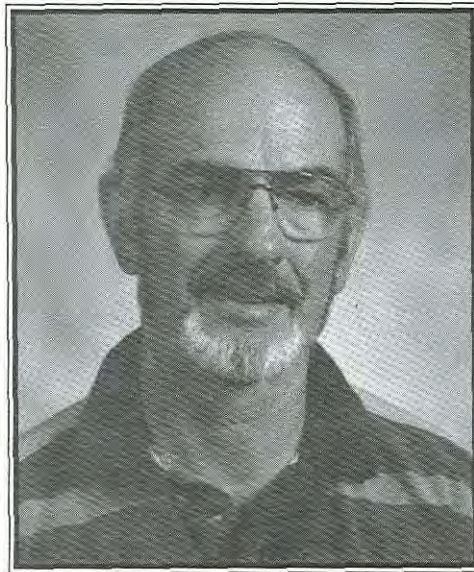

Watertown



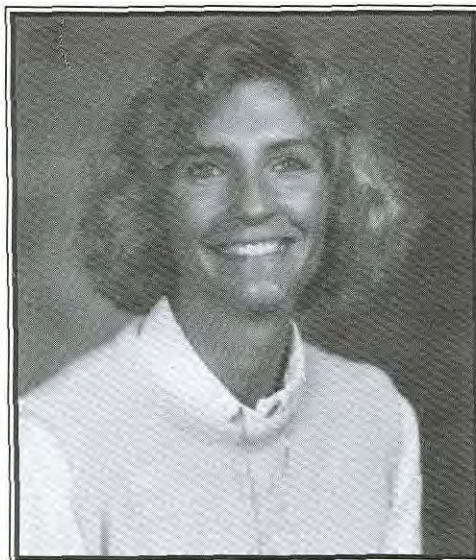

Chris Dummermuth coached her Lincoln High Patriots to their fourth straight championship this past spring.

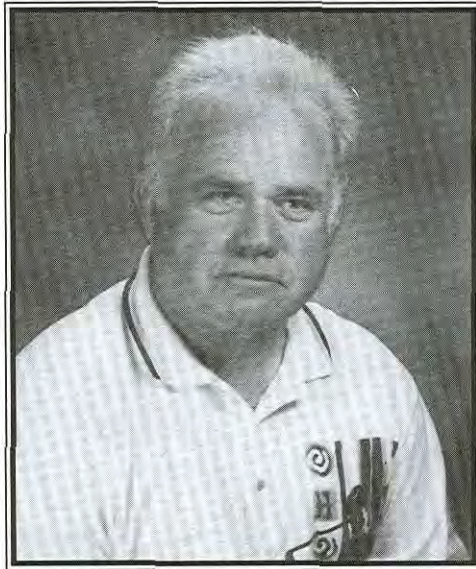

Bob Judson has been recognized for years as one of South Dakota's premier basketball coaches. Judson, a graduate of Huron College, first made the headlines in 1973 when he guided the Huron Tigers to a State Class A Championship. He then joined an exclusive club when he took his Pierre Governors to their last state title in 1982, becoming one of a very few people who have two state titles with two different teams.

After racking up a win-loss record of 291-190 in basketball, Bob turned to track and field coaching to close out his long career. He has assisted with the Pierre Governors for nearly twenty years, and his hurdlers are consistently among the state's best. An assistant for the past 33 years, Judson now adds this Assistant Coach of the Year plaque to his basketball laurels.

Cheryl Huddleston has coached in the Hot Springs system for twenty years and has, says head coach Dave Scott, "made outstanding contributions to our track and our cross country progress". Sioux Falls



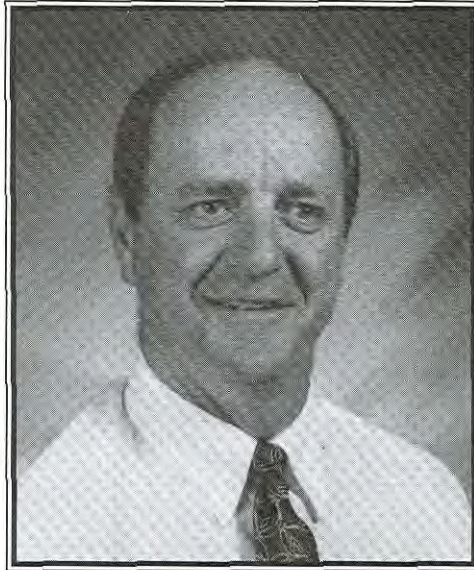

"I try to keep the entire athletic program in perspective," Haar said, "keeping all the programs on an even keel and being as fair as I can be regardless of gender."

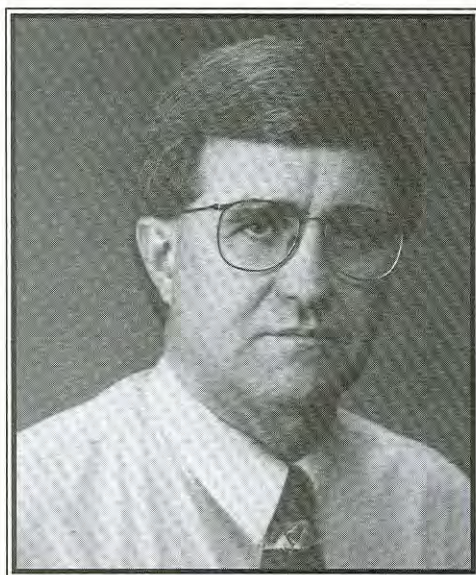

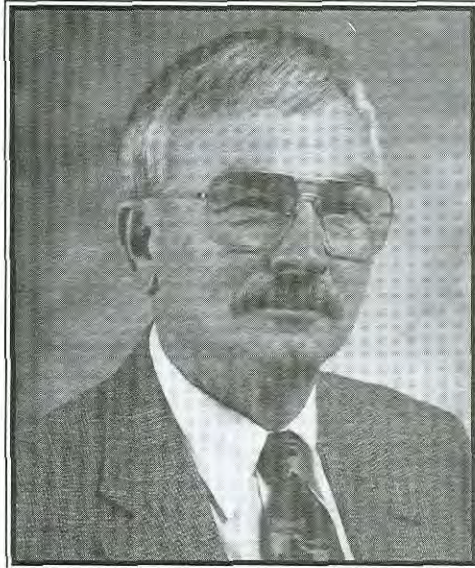


1998 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD
