In Memory

KATHERINE A. LARSON



Kathie graduated from Lincoln High School in Sioux Falls, SD in 1974. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Augustana College in 1978 with a major in physical education along with her coaching certificate. Kathie began her teaching career with the Sioux Falls Public Schools as an elementary physical education teacher, as well as being the assistant gymnastics coach for Lincoln High School from 1975-79.

In 1980, Kathie was the head gymnastics coach for the University of North Dakota while completing her graduate work in physical education with an emphasis on counseling and guidance. During her time at UND, her team placed first at the Division II Regional Tournament and qualified two in the all-around competition for Nationals. This was the first time in history a UND gymnastics team qualified for nationals.

Kathie moved back to Sioux Falls after one year at UND to begin a long and successful career as an educational assistant in biology and gymnastic coach. As the assistant gymnastics coach for Lincoln High School from 1980-1991, along with head coach Lolly Forseth, Lincoln won nine regional championships, three runner-up state titles, and four state championships. Kathie won the "Assistant Gymnastics Coach of the Year" award by the South Dakota Gymnastics Coaches Association three times; 1988, 1989 and 1990. Kathie took over as the head gymnastics coach at Lincoln High School from 1991-1996.

Kathie believed strongly in professional growth and involvement in the state and national sports associations. Some of Kathie's professional affiliations were:

- South Dakota High School Coaches Association – 20 years
- South Dakota High School Coaches Association Board of Directors – 8 years
- South Dakota Gymnastics Judges Association – 20 years
- South Dakota Gymnastics Coaches Association – 20 years
- National High School Athletic Coaches Association – 16 years

Kathie attended eleven National High School Athletic Coaches Association clinics. The SDHSCA held a special place in Kathie's heart. She cherished the friendships that she developed amongst her peers throughout the state and nation.

In 2010 Kathie Larson's sister, Linda Larson, started the Kathie Larson Coaches' Grant Program. The purpose of this grant is to provide financial assistance to members of the South Dakota High School Coaches Association to attend national coaching/athletic clinics, conferences or seminars. One grant must be awarded to a female, one awarded to a gymnastics coach and the remainder can be head or assistant athletic coaches or athletic directors. If no female or gymnastics coaches apply those grants may be awarded to other applicants. An individual must be a member of the SDHSCA and can only receive this grant once every five years. 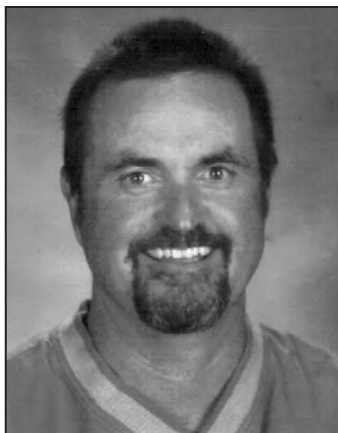

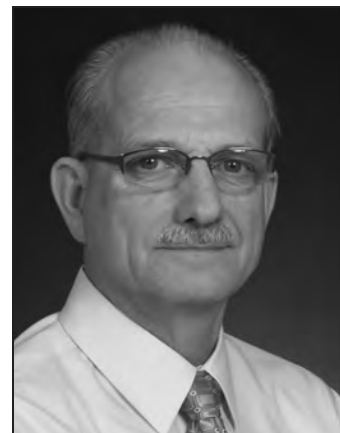

2010 Girls' Cross Country Coach of the Year

Scott Peterson

Sturgis

State champions evolve wherever Scott Peterson coaches. In 2010, Peterson's Sturgis Scoopers won the state Class AA girls' cross country championship along with the Greater Dakota Conference title.

Sturgis' Madeleine Takahashi won the "AA" individual state cross country crown in 2007 and 2009. Peterson's teams have placed in the top 10 at the state cross country meet each year since he took charge of the program in 2002. He was named GDC girls' coach of the year in 2007 and 2010. As an assistant coach in track concentrating on distance events, three of his athletes have won the "AA" 1600 meter title – Jessica Engel 2007, Takahashi 2009, Kahlie Peterson 2010. He coached hurdlers at Rapid City Stevens from 1996-2000, including state champion Erin Erickson in 1996.

Tim Franz resigned from the classroom in 2010 but he could not walk away from his passion for coaching. He served as an elementary special education teacher at Redfield for 16 years. He was the assistant varsity football coach from 1996-2003, and since 2004 has been the head coach for boys' and girls' cross country. He guided the boys' team to runner-up honors in 2007, third place in 2008, and to the state Class A championship in 2009. Redfield/Doland again took second place in 2010. He plans to continue coaching. "I have been coaching athletics for the past 16 years and truly enjoy the time I get to spend with the students," he said. "Hopefully, I made a difference in their lives. I know that they have definitely made a difference in mine and I thank them for that. I will treasure this award as I do all the memories that were created over the years."

2010 Football Coach of the Year **Brian Hermanson** Sioux Falls Washington

Paying close attention to detail is foremost in Brian Hermanson's coaching style. The result has been back-to-back State Class 11AA championships and a 26-game winning streak. "Hermie" has compiled a 63-13 record in six seasons as the Warriors' head

coach. He has been recognized as coach of the year by the South Dakota Associated Press, the South Dakota Football Coaches Association, and the Greater Dakota Conference (GDC). His teams were GDC champions in 2009 and 2010 and were state runners-up in 2007 and 2008. The Warriors' dominance is evident in the 549-62 margin by which they outscored the opposition in 2010. The awards are gratifying, but "Hermie" counts returning to his alma mater as the head coach and experiencing state championships with his son and his friends among his major coaching moments.

2010 Volleyball Coach of the Year **Anita Boeck** Arlington

Locally, regionally, and nationally, Anita Boeck is recognized as a superior volleyball coach. In 2009, she was designated as High School Coach of the Year by the American Volleyball Coaches Association. She was chosen High School Girls Coach of the Year for 2010 by the South Dakota Sports Writers' Association. She is a five-time winner of Region Coach of the Year honors. Boeck has completed 21 years as the head coach at Arlington, compiling an impressive 584-192-10 record. Since 2002 the Cardinals have scored seventh, third, and runner-up finishes in state championship play, and in 2010 closed out the decade by capturing first place. "Through the years I have worked with incredible student-athletes, who executed on the court and in the classroom. Each one taught me a little about volleyball and a lot about life," said Boeck.

2011 Wrestling Coach of the Year **Wade Rausch** Webster Area

A difficult decision to move from Ipswich to Webster last fall produced a gratifying result for Coach Wade Rausch. He guided Webster to the Class B championship in 2011, the Bearcats' sixth state

crown. In addition, the Bearcats' Logan Storley won the 171-pound crown bringing his career total to six. He joins Freeman's Kirk Wallman (1984-89) and Alabama's Michael Sutton as the nation's only high school wrestlers to claim six state championships. At the conclusion of the season, Storley received the Junior Dan Hodge Trophy presented annually to the top high school wrestler in the nation by the Amateur Athletic Union and WIN magazine. Storley capped the season with a 42-1 record, bringing his career mark to 262-3. "He is a phenom," said Rausch. "I was privileged to have him on the team and be a part of his career."

2011 Gymnastics Coach of the Year **Lynn Gudmundson** Deuel



The Deuel Cardinals are no longer runners-up. In 2011, Coach Lynn Gudmundson's Cardinals posted a state Class A record score of 144.645 to claim their first-ever gymnastics championship. Thus the Cardinals ended Madison's run of consecutive state gymnastics championships at 16, a national record. Deuel had settled for runner-up honors behind Madison in 2009 and 2010. Deuel's Sam Wiekamp won the all-around title for the third time in the last four years. Teammate Meaghan Sievers was the runner-up. Gudmundson helped coach the women's gymnastics team at Valley City State for five years. He has coached at Deuel for 20 years. "Our success in the past few years is in direct correlation with the building of our gymnastics facility and athletes that compete," Gudmundson said.

2011 Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year **Mark Stadem** Brandon Valley

Saving the best for last may not be Mark Stadem's coaching trademark, but his Brandon Valley Lynx played at their highest level during the 2011 state Class AA girls' basketball tournament. The fourth-seeded Lynx raced past Mitchell and Rapid City

Central to set the stage for a championship showdown with Sioux Falls O'Gorman. Led by junior Heidi Hoff, Brandon Valley claimed its first state crown and ended the season with a 17-9 record. Stadem has guided the BV program since 1997 and has taken the Lynx to eight state tournament appearances. The Lynx were runners-up in 2009. Stadem was chosen Region 5 girls' basketball coach of the year in 2007, 2009, and 2011. He currently serves as second vice-president of the South Dakota Basketball Coaches Association. He began coaching in 1989 and joined the BV staff in 1994.

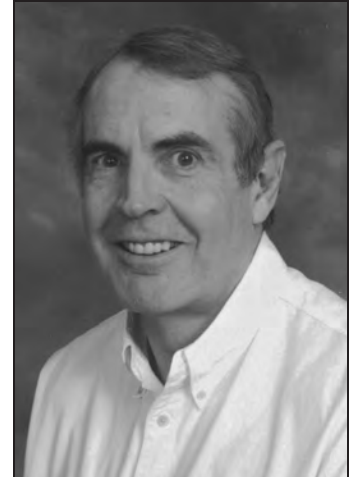

In 1984, his involvement expanded to clock operator for all O'G sub-varsity football games and now includes all games contested at McEneaney Field. Twenty-nine years ago he designed a computer statistics package for boys' basketball and later began compiling statistics for all team sports. He has since authored a complete history for all O'G sports and fine arts activities. He also coached Bantam Baseball for eight years and was involved in the 1984 Olympic Torch Relay.

Duane Whalen

These days, longtime administrator/coach/teacher, Duane Whalen can be spotted wearing a white coat at state high school events in Rapid City. He is the executive secretary of the OFFICIALS, an organization supplying manpower to athletic events hosted by the Black Hills' largest community. Whalen is also the chairman of the sports recognition banquet sponsored annually by the OFFICIALS. In addition to honoring high school and college male and female athletes, the OFFICIALS also induct three individuals into the Rapid City Sports Hall of Fame. While serving as the athletic director at Rapid City Stevens, Whalen managed some 40 state high school events. He is a member of the Rapid City Sports Hall of Fame and the South Dakota Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Hall of Fame.

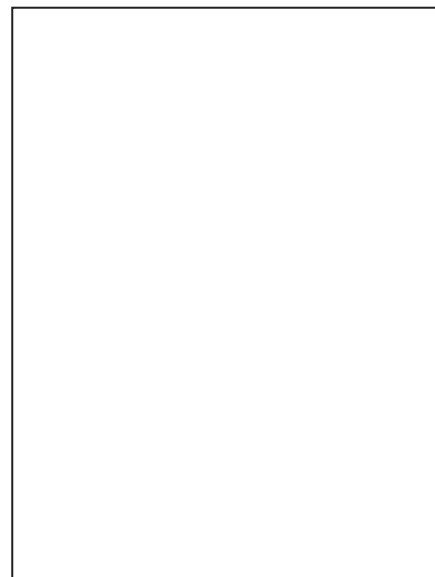

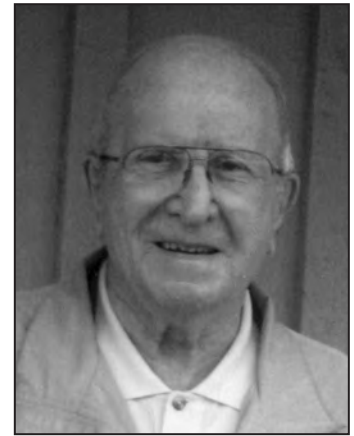

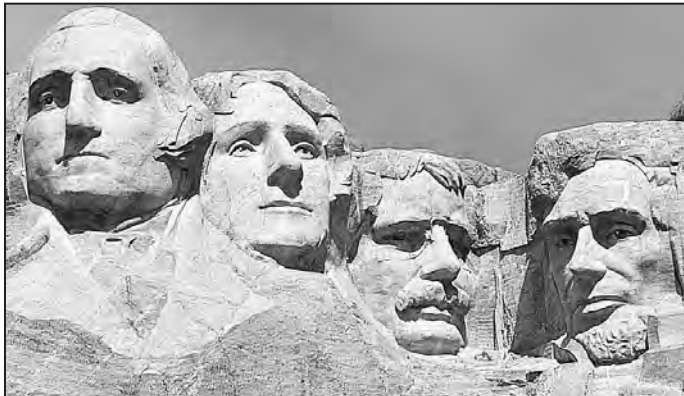
