SHARING IS CARING

Reno has three players with six or more assists, including Raul Mendiola's team-leading seven. Mendiola ranks fifth in the USL, while Corey Hertzog and Duke Lacroix each have six, tied for 12th in the USL

DISCIPLINE, DISCIPLINE, DISCIPLINE

Reno's season total of 41 yellow cards and just one red card are among the fewest in the league. Only Portland has no red cards, and only seven (out of 36 USL teams) have fewer yellow cards.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK

Austin Bold FC is in its first season in the USL, and is making a push for a top four seed in the western conference playoffs. Austin trails Reno by seven points with just six matches left each, and will look to avenge an early season defeat in the clubs' first-ever meeting.

CAREER YEAR

With six matches to go, forward Corey Hertzog owns 13 goals. The total is just one short of tying his career high of 14, set in 2017 with Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC. That year, Hertzog earned All-League second team honors. This season, Hertzog was named July's Player of the Month. Hertzog's six assists on the season are also a career high.

DYNAMIC DUO

Matt Bersano ranks 19th in the USL with 54 saves, and JT Marcinkowski ranks 23rd with 48. No other club has two keepers ranked in the top 25. The pairing has combined for six clean sheets on the season, including five at Greater Nevada Field.

CHASING HISTORY

With six matches left to go in Reno's third season, the team owns 47 regular season wins. The total is third all time in USL history for a club's first three seasons. If 1868 can earn three wins in the final six matches, the team will become just the second ever to win 50. Reno can also become just the sixth team ever to make the playoffs in each of their first three seasons.

MUSOVSKI'S TWO GOALS NOT ENOUGH TO COMPLETE COMBACK

FRESNO CONVERTED PENALTY IN 94TH MINUTE TO WIN

RENO, Nev. – Fresh off of a two goal performance on Saturday night, Reno 1868 FC forward Danny Musovski broke a franchise record with four goals and an assist tonight en route to a 5-0 Reno win. The UNLV grad is the first in franchise history to score four goals in a match, and set a new career high for goals in a season with 9.

"Much needed, we've had a couple tough results," said head coach Ian Russell. "Coming out and getting a win is pretty big for us. It gives us more confidence as a team."

Musovski found his rhythm early, scoring in the fourth minute to give Reno a 1-0 lead. The assist came from Brent Richards, his third on the season but not his last of the evening.

The early goal was the first time since August 3 at Rio Grande Valley that Reno scored first in a match. The boys in blue entered the match 8-1-3 in matches where they score first. The goal was also the earliest goal from 1868 FC this season, besting Corey Hertzog's seventh minute goal against LA Galaxy II in June.

The 1-0 score would hold for all of 22 minutes, as Richards and Musovski would connect again in the 26th minute to make it 2-0. The next minute, Musovski would find Seth Casiple to set up Casiple's fifth goal of the season. The assist was Musovski's first of the season, and extended the lead to 3-0.

Musovski would strike quickly yet again, scoring off of a Corey Hertzog assist in the 30th minute. The assist was Hertzog's sixth on the season, and brought the score to 4-0.

With just four minutes to go in the first half, Musovski would put a bow on the incredible performance, scoring his fourth goal of the night off of Richards' third assist of the night.

"Danny's a player that's really finding his form, I'm happy for him," said Russell. "He's worked hard and he's a good finisher."

In the second half, 1868's defense secured the win. Tacoma would earn a penalty kick in the 47th minute, but Matt Bersano would save it to preserve his clean sheet. The save was one of four for Bersano, who turned 27 today. Bersano's birthday gift was his third clean sheet of the season, and the team's fifth at home this season.

Reno would finish the match outshooting Tacoma 20-18, including 10 shots on goal. Los Azules move to 8-4-5 in matches where they outshoot their opponent.

Only three other times in 1868 franchise history has a player scored three goals in a match, the most recent being Lindo Mfeka in September of 2017. None of the previous three hat tricks were completed before the 30 minute mark, Dane Kelly's second hat trick ended with the third goal in the 35th minute. Musovski's third goal tonight came in the 30th minute.

"It was a good game for all of us," said Musovski. "I'm getting in the same positions, I'm just getting good service from my teammates. My job is to put it in the back of the net."

Richard's three assists are a career high for one match, and more than double his previous season total of two.

The club's five goals are a season high, and the highest mark since September 23, 2017.

The match would also feature the USL debut of German midfielder Mattia Trianni. Trianni was signed by 1868 FC last week, and tallied two shots on target in eight minutes of action. Recent signing Luis Parade-la tallied three shots in 35 minutes of action off the bench.

The boys in blue will look to keep the momentum rolling into Austin, as the lads travel to Texas to take on Bold FC on Sunday. Kickoff is set for 4:00 p.m. PT, and the match will be streamed on ESPN+.

TECHNICAL STAFF



IAN RUSSELL **HEAD COACH**

Russell played for the University of Washington and later started his professional career with the Seattle Sounders of the USL First Division in 1998 and 1999. Russell was drafted by the San Jose Earthquakes in 2000 and continued to play seven seasons in MLS. Six of those seasons came with the Earthquakes, where Russell helped the team win two MLS Cups in 2001 and 2003. In 2008, Russell returned to the Earthquakes as an assistant coach, a position he held for eight seasons. He helped lead the club to the postseason twice, while earning the Supporters' Shield for best regular season record (19-6-9) in 2012. Russell was also instrumental in the Quakes' international and collegiate scouting efforts, and briefly helped oversee the club's youth development as the academy's technical director. He served as the Earthquakes interim head coach for the final two games of the 2014 season and holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license.



CASEY TATE **ASSISTANT COACH**

Tate joined the Reno 1868 FC staff in 2017 and served as an Assistant Coach under Head Coach Ian Russell for the inaugural season. He came to Reno 1868 from the University of Nevada where he spent 8 seasons as the Assistant Coach for the Wolf Pack Soccer program, being promoted to Head Coach Interim for the 2016 season. Tate helped lead the Pack to two postseason appearances and in 2016 posted the program's highest win total since its inaugural season in the Mountain West Conference. He has also been involved in the Reno/Tahoe youth soccer community for the past eight years and was the Director for several elite local clubs.



CHRIS MALENAB **ASSISTANT COACH**

Malenab joined Reno 1868 FC in 2018 after spending four years as an assistant coach and video analyst at Sacramento Republic FC. During the 2014 inaugural season of the Sacramento Republic FC, Malenab served as an assistant coach to Predrag Radosavljević (Preki) during the club's championship campaign. From 2015 to 2017 Malenab served as video analyst for the Sacramento Republic FC under head coach Paul Buckle. Malenab started his coaching career coaching and serving as technical director at various youth clubs in the greater Sacramento area while coaching high school soccer. Along with his youth coaching experience, Malenab has served as an assistant coach at the college level, at Cosumnes River College (NJCAA), California State University Stanislaus (NCAA D-II) and San Joaquin Delta College (NJCAA).

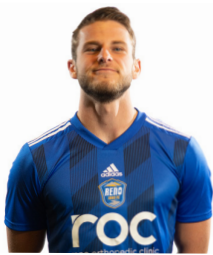

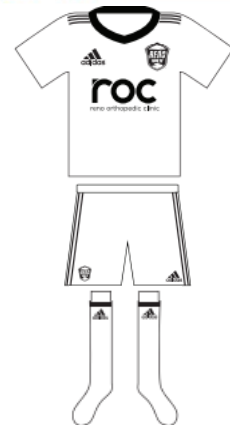
