STRONG SUMMER

Since May 1, Reno has lost just three times. The boys in blue have gone 10-3-2 in that stretch, with just one of the three losses coming at home. Reno went 1-0-2 in May, 4-1-0 in June and is currently 1-0-0 in July to earn the mark.

LOOKING FOR REVENGE

San Antonio is one of just three teams to beat Reno since May 1. Los Azules dropped a match in San Antonio on June 8, falling 3-2.

RIISING UP THE TABLE

Reno sits four points ahead of Fresno for second place in the USL's Western Conference. 1868 trails Phoenix Rising FC by just three points for first place in the conference, and is tied for the third most points in the whole league. Reno's 50 goals on the season are good for third in the league as well.

CHASING HISTORY

With 11 matches left to go in Reno's third season, the team owns 46 regular season wins. The total is tied for third all time in USL history for a club's first three seasons. If 1868 can earn four wins in the final 11 matches, the team will become just the second ever to win 50. Reno can also become just the sixth team ever to make the playoffs in each of their first three seasons.

1868 FC SET TO HOST SAN ANTONIO FC

BOYS IN BLUE FELL 3-2 AT SAN ANTONIO IN JUNE

RENO, Nev. – Reno 1868 FC is back playing at Greater Nevada Field this weekend, taking on San Antonio FC. Reno has won two in a row, and seven of their last eight. When Reno travelled to San Antonio on June 8, Los Azules fell 3-2.

"I think that was a game where it was a tale of two halves," said head coach Ian Russell. "I thought we had a good first half, we were up 2-1 going into halftime and then they were the better team in the second half. They made some adjustments and I think this time around we'll be ready."

Reno is coming off of a 2-1 road win at Rio Grande Valley FC last weekend. Defender Thomas Janjigian headed in his first career goal off of a Seth Casiple corner kick, and Aidan Apodaca scored on a wide-open breakaway.

Reno has been in the midst of a scorching summer stretch. Since May 1, the boys in blue are 10-3-2. One of those three losses was San Antonio, and since then the team is 7-2-0.

San Antonio's last result was a 3-2 home loss to Sacramento Republic FC, their first loss since June. San Antonio went 3-0-1 in the month of July, and currently sits in 12th in the western conference. San Antonio's 27 points are just two short of El Paso Locomotive FC, the team currently in the 10th and final playoff spot.

Reno enters the match as the second-best team in the western conference, trailing first-place Phoenix Rising by just three points. Third-place Fresno trails 1868 by four points.

At home, Reno has gone 7-1-3 this season, including four shutouts in their last six matches at Greater Nevada Field.

"The teams confident," said Russell. "We've been winning a lot of games."

Kickoff is set for 7:15 p.m. PT, and the first 1,000 fans in attendance will receive a free 1868 FC shirt. The match will be streamed on ESPN+, and tickets are available at reno1868fc.com or the Greater Nevada Field ticket office.

TECHNICAL STAFF



IAN RUSSELL **HEAD COACH**

Russell played for the University of Washington and later started his professional career with the Seattle Sounders of the USL First Division in 1998 and 1999. Russell was drafted by the San Jose Earthquakes in 2000 and continued to play seven seasons in MLS. Six of those seasons came with the Earthquakes, where Russell helped the team win two MLS Cups in 2001 and 2003. In 2008, Russell returned to the Earthquakes as an assistant coach, a position he held for eight seasons. He helped lead the club to the postseason twice, while earning the Supporters' Shield for best regular season record (19-6-9) in 2012. Russell was also instrumental in the Quakes' international and collegiate scouting efforts, and briefly helped oversee the club's youth development as the academy's technical director. He served as the Earthquakes interim head coach for the final two games of the 2014 season and holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license.



CASEY TATE **ASSISTANT COACH**

Tate joined the Reno 1868 FC staff in 2017 and served as an Assistant Coach under Head Coach Ian Russell for the inaugural season. He came to Reno 1868 from the University of Nevada where he spent 8 seasons as the Assistant Coach for the Wolf Pack Soccer program, being promoted to Head Coach Interim for the 2016 season. Tate helped lead the Pack to two postseason appearances and in 2016 posted the program's highest win total since its inaugural season in the Mountain West Conference. He has also been involved in the Reno/Tahoe youth soccer community for the past eight years and was the Director for several elite local clubs.



CHRIS MALENAB **ASSISTANT COACH**

Malenab joined Reno 1868 FC in 2018 after spending four years as an assistant coach and video analyst at Sacramento Republic FC. During the 2014 inaugural season of the Sacramento Republic FC, Malenab served as an assistant coach to Predrag Radosavljević (Preki) during the club's championship campaign. From 2015 to 2017 Malenab served as video analyst for the Sacramento Republic FC under head coach Paul Buckle. Malenab started his coaching career coaching and serving as technical director at various youth clubs in the greater Sacramento area while coaching high school soccer. Along with his youth coaching experience, Malenab has served as an assistant coach at the college level, at Cosumnes River College (NJCAA), California State University Stanislaus (NCAA D-II) and San Joaquin Delta College (NJCAA).
