After lengthy SHSAA Executive Meetings on Sunday, April 5 and Monday, April 6, it was decided to cancel the remainder of the Spring sports season due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The RHSAA has followed suit, meaning:

- All RHSAA Badminton league, City Championships at Martin Collegiate and Luther College, Regional playoffs and Provincial Championships in Nipawin, SK scheduled for Saturday, May 9, 2020 have been cancelled.
- Track and Field Coaching Clinics, mini-meets, pole vaulting clinics, City Championships and the SHSAA Provincial Championships scheduled in Yorkton on Friday, June 5 and Saturday, June 6 have been cancelled.
- Golf that was scheduled to start in May and culminate with our City Championships at the Murray Golf Course on Tuesday, June 2, 2020 has been cancelled, as have our beginners and elite programs.

The decisions made by the RHSAA were done with careful consideration, as each of its member schools are deeply invested in school sport activities and its student athletes. Given the many factors involved as they pertain to each activity and program, the RHSAA made decisions they believe were in the best interests of student-athletes, coaches, schools, host sites and most importantly the health and well-being of all involved regarding the recent COVID-19 pandemic. Although there are student athletes that have missed out on opportunities to participate in RHSAA and SHSAA activities for the next three months, the health and welfare (physical, mental, emotional) of all involved are the most important factors. The RHSAA reserves the right to reopen discussions about the possibility of May and June school sports, should official public health direction in Saskatchewan change.
