High School Timeline



9TH GRADE

- Start the planning process now! Get with Your school counselor and take the right courses and earn the best Grades possible
- Find Your High School's list of NCAA-approved Core Courses at eligibilitycenter.org/courselist
- Sign up for Free Profile Page at eligibilitycenter.org for info on NCAA requirements

10TH GRADE

- If You fall behind academically, ask Your counselor for help finding approved courses you can take to catch up
- Monitor Your Eligibility Center account for the next few steps
- At the end of the Year, Ask Your Counselor to upload your Transcript to Your NCAA Eligibility Center Account.

11TH GRADE

- Check with Your counselor to make sure You are on track to complete the required number of NCAA approved courses and graduate on time with Your class
- Take the ACT or SAT and submit Your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999
- Make sure Your SPorts Participation information is correct in Your Eligibility Center Account
- At the end of the school year ask Your counselor to upload your current Transcript to your NCAA Eligibility Center Account

12TH GRADE

- Complete your final NCAA approved core courses as You prepare to graduate
- Take the ACT or Sat again if needed
- Request Your final amateurism certification beginning April 1 (Fall Enrollment) or Oct 1 (Winter Spring enrollment) in Your NCAA eligibility account
- After You graduate, ask your counselor to upload your Final Transcript with proof of Graduation
- Remember, Only students on the NCAA Div 1 or 2 schools institutional request list will receive a cert.

The Offer Game - Committable Vs. Uncommittable Offers

Committable Offers

- Simply put it is an offer that the University will accept a commitment on from a prospect.
- An offer can go from Committable to Uncommittable if you wait to long or if the Coach decides on a different prospect.
- At its core, a committable offer is a promise between a coach and Prospect to award a scholarship to play football at the coach's university. At the FBS level all football scholarships are full-ride, meaning they cover tuition and its related fees, room, board and books. Non-head count sports at the Division I level and lower level football schools, like Division II, can offer partial scholarships, which may cover just tuition or just room and board.

Uncommittable Offers

- There are two types of non-committable offers. The first is the one coaches offer prospects without having any intention, at that moment, of accepting a commitment. The other is the commitment the coaches would have accepted had the prospect jumped on the opportunity sooner, but the offer expired because there were only a certain amount of spots for the position and those spots have been taken.
- Avg Power 5 program "offers" 200 or more offers for 25 spots
- 2019 101,000 offers were issues to fill 12,000 spots.
- Can an offer go from uncommittable to committable? Definitely, and it happens all the time. Maybe a prospect is fifth on a team's chart at a position where they can only take two prospects. Maybe they offer six, but only the top 2-3 can actually commit right away. When the top couple guys start committing elsewhere, though, now that PSA who was fifth on the team's chart moves up into the magic range and his offer, whether he recognizes it or not, becomes committable.

What Is the Transfer Portal?



- **Established In 2018 to simplify transfers for college athletes**
- **Players no longer need school permission to enter**
- **Over 3,000 players enter annually, creating a "free agency" effect**

- **Fewer Scholarships: Colleges prioritize experienced transfers over high school players**
- **More Competition: Recruits now compete against seasoned college athletes**
- **Alternative Paths: JUCO & prep schools are more common options**
- **Recruiting Plan Is Crucial: Exposure, academics, and flexibility are key to**

New 2025 NCAA FBS Roster Limit Rule



- **DIV 1 FBS Rosters will now be limited to 105 players**
 - **Most FBS 2024 rosters had 120 - 130 players including walk on's**
 - **15-25 players will need to find a new place to play via the Portal**
- **DIV 1 FBS Football scholarships will increase from 85 to 105**
 - **New limits on roster size with the ability to offer scholarships of every player on the roster, suggests a potential end to the “Walk On” athlete**
- **Impact on Recruiting**
 - **Coaches will be much more selective at the High School Level**
 - **Cut players from FBS rosters will filter down in the FCS, D2 & D3 levels making it harder for HS athletes**

WHAT IS AN NCAA ID?

Your NCAA ID is one of the ways NCAA coaches and compliance staff can add you to their **institutional request list**. Being placed on a Division I or II school's institutional request list means you are being recruited and notifies the Eligibility Center to complete an academic evaluation for you after all of your required documents have been submitted.

Have Reasonable Expectations - Know the Numbers

- 3% of ALL HS football players will receive some sort of scholarship grant or aid to play football in college.**

- 1% of ALL HS football players will receive a Division 1 football scholarship.**

- 80% of all scholarship, grants, and financial aid money is given out at the D2/D3/NAIA and Junior College level.**

- 26% of all scholarship, grants, and financial aid recipients are no longer on scholarship in what would be their sophomore year.**

• Make your grades! Do as well as you possibly can in all your classes.

• Have a great off-season. Improve as much as possible.

• Sign up to take the tests. Let us know when you get your scores in.

• Be realistic in your expectations.

• Keep the TEAM first and remember that the more success we have as a TEAM, the more rewards there are for everyone. The further we go in the playoffs, the more exposure you will get.

• Represent yourself well when coaches come on campus. Spring football is big.





Bottom Line

- #1 – HS Coaches or the School cannot get your player a scholarship
- Recommend based on requirements of the university – HT/WT/Speed/ Grades etc.
- D1 usually takes care of itself – they will decide if you can play or not
- D2/D3/NAIA – coach can help sell these kids if they have grades and character
- The college coach's mortgage payment is based on whether he can see talent
- They will do their homework.
- Three things we as coaches can vouch for and they will ask about..
 - 1- Academics
 - 2- Work Ethic
 - 3- Character
- Be Proactive!
- Recruit the school you want to go too.
- Find a school where you will be comfortable if football goes away.**
