

## WYSA Game Day Requirements

### Players and Spectators

Players must maintain a social distance whenever not in competition. This includes whenever being addressed by coach or match official (e.g., for equipment check).

All players not on the field of play during a match will be required to wear a mask.

Players and spectators may only consume drinks or snacks they have provided for themselves. No team snacks.

Prior to, during and following a training or match there will be no handshakes, high fives, or other unnecessary contact; even within the team.

All spectators in attendance at a match will be required to wear a mask. Any spectator who cannot meet this requirement may observe from a vehicle and/or be absent from the fields/facility until the match is completed.

Measure ensuring spectators and players not actively participating in a match are at least 6 feet apart unless those spectators are within the same family unit.

No more than two spectators per player are allowed at a match if spectators are allowed

Players or coach should sanitize their hands each time they come off the field

### Coaches

Coaches will be required to wear a mask during matches and during trainings wherever possible.

### Additional Items

Carpooling to a match or training outside of a family unit is not recommended.

Any player or coach exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms of any kind must refrain from participation for 10 days or until medical clearance through a primary care provider has been acquired.

Measures for taking player, coach and spectator attendance at each match. Each team is responsible for their own group's attendance. (Home club not required to take attendance for all players/spectators.) This should include contact information (phone number and email) for each individual.

Each club is responsible for compliance for their own members. Home club or game officials will not be enforcing compliance.

**Each home team is required to communicate the facility and local requirements regarding spectators and if they're allowed.**

### Team Check-in

Referees should not exchange documents (rosters, passes) with the coaches—Coaches should possess player passes and rosters during the game.

No player/team lineups prior to kickoff, the team coach should ensure that all players are wearing shin guards, proper cleats, register and have a player pass.

Each player can show his/her player pass to the referee but should return the pass directly to the coach and not the referees.
