All youth divisions play 2 days 8A-5P.

Players may earn bids for the 2026 Championships from June 25, 2025 until June 7, 2026. Bids will help players start in Power Pools but bids* do NOT guarantee a team starting in the Power Pools. ALL TEAMS, WITH OR WITHOUT BIDS, are welcome to register for the p1440 Nationals. Club Directors, bring your entire club! We have divisions for everyone.

***Why do players need to earn a bid?** p1440 might be the first to tell you that players should be playing for competition, first and foremost, not the bid. Typically, more than the top quartile of teams that register for the p1440 Nationals will have a bid or have earned a significant [TruVolley](#) score (which measures NCAA and World Tour.) Therefore, players should be playing the toughest competition to help earn a higher TruVolley score, like the [Futures Tour](#), and earn the best finishes for 5 events.

Pairs Seeding/Format: p1440 prides themselves as one of the few associations that has a universal seeding system. Both Class of 2026 and 2028 Divisions will be based on TruVolley score for the top quartile seeding along with the most p1440 points. Class of 2030 and younger will be based on p1440 points only. However, p1440 reserves the right to "wildcard" teams with exceptional [TruVolley](#) scores. All remaining teams + non-bid winners will start in Qualifying Pools. All teams are eligible to earn their way up to play in the Gold Playoff for the National Championship Trophy. The National Championship will be 2 days with up to 4 divisional brackets (depending the number of teams) ...VolleybALL for ALL!

Why are the most competitive teams playing each other in Round 1 of the p1440 Nationals? Unlike any other Nationals, p1440 created Power Pools for Round 1 in order to avoid the top seed versus the bottom seed. Teams playing the toughest competition is exactly what a National should be and the more tougher match ups that teams play only helps teams get ready for the next level in college. Power Pools give teams the best opportunity for the highest seeds in the Gold Playoffs. Qualifying Pools may have less tougher teams to get to the Gold Playoffs; however, teams are only able to earn the lesser quartile seeding in the Gold Playoffs.

15U = Class of 2029 and younger

14U = Class of 2030 (8th grade and younger)
