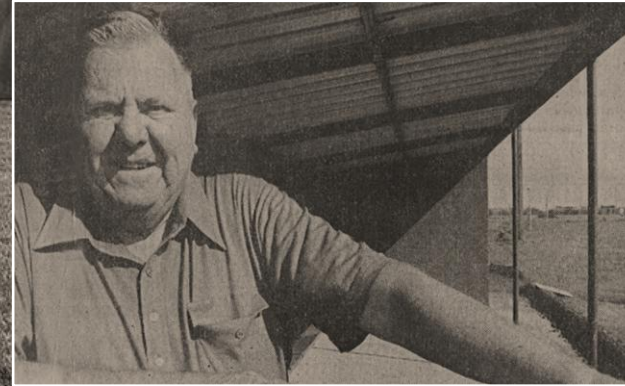
DGF Baseball History

BOB MARSHALL: THE PIONEER OF DILWORTH BASEBALL

Some may know him as the man of Dilworth baseball, others may know him as the guy the Dilworth baseball field is named after, and some may not know him at all. His name is Bob Marshall (photo below), and it might be what we don't know that's most important.

Bob Marshall Field (The Bob as players have coined it.)

Bob Marshall Field in Dilworth was built in the late 1970's. Virgil Hegeholz (owner of Clay County State Bank in Dilworth) led the effort to build a baseball field on the current site. Also involved were Mike Parker and Gary Haskins. Both Mike & Gary were involved in ownership of the bank. American Legion members and Dilworth Jaycees members provided volunteer labor. Mike Griffin, Jerry Anderson and Mike Stalboerger were heavily involved in building Bob Marshall Field during those early years. Prior to Bob Marshall Field being built, the Post 397 American Legion team and the Dilworth Babe Ruth team were playing on the southeast part of town (where the Red River Recovery Center is today.) When the original Silver Spike restaurant and motel were built, baseball had to be relocated. They contracted with Musco Lighting of Muscatine, IA for the original lights.

The Sport of Baseball has been a longstanding and treasured activity in the communities of Dilworth, Glyndon and Felton through the years dating back to the 1940s, if not before.

Railroad man and Army veteran Bob Marshall played an active role in the American Legion program in Dilworth starting in the mid-40s where he was active running the program for about 30 years.

The Glyndon and Dilworth Babe Ruth programs were added through the years for the JR High (13-15) aged players to prepare them for American Legion. Ed Gorilla played an integral roll in the Glyndon Babe Ruth program. During the early years, Glyndon and Dilworth played in the Moorhead Babe Ruth League with teams like Moorhead's Highway Host, Knights of Columbus, FM Asphalt and Sportland to name a few. When Dilworth, Glyndon, Felton kids all began playing as one DGF Babe Ruth program, the Lake Region League became home playing the likes of Hawley, Frazee, Barnesville, Breckenridge and others to the east.

For 21 years, Glyndon was home to the Glyndon Braves amateur baseball team that played on a baseball field where the Rebels Varsity softball field is today. Gerald Hegene was the skipper of the Amateur team.

The Dilworth Green Hill Post 397 team for years played in the Norman-Becker-Clay League vs teams like Moorhead, Ada, Norman County West, Barnesville, Audubon and others. The DGF Post 397 team later became a member of the MN Lakes Conference as teams and Leagues evolved playing more teams to the east in Lake's country.

In 2013, the DGF Legion Baseball Club was founded to sponsor the DGF Post 397 American Legion program with the DGF Babe Ruth program moving over from the School's Community Ed program a couple of years later.

The DGF Athletic Club was started in 2014 to offer the elementary aged players an evening program with more tournament opportunities.

The DGF Legion Baseball Club and DGF Athletic Club merged into a single Club sponsoring American Legion, Babe Ruth and Cal Ripken baseball in September 2023 serving all summer baseball programs ages 9-18.

The DGF Baseball Club is on its fourth year of offering summer baseball to our DGF students. It's our responsibility to keep this baseball tradition alive and well in our community that treasure's its baseball.

The DGF Baseball Club with the help of fundraisers, donations, volunteerism and efforts from local contractors. The renovations have begun on the Bob Marshall 2.0 project in the Fall of 2025 and will continue into 2026. The Club formally introduces an 8U program in the Cal Ripken program.



Summer Programs

The DGF Baseball Club is the Official Sponsor of DGF Post 397 American Legion Baseball, Babe Ruth League Baseball and Cal Ripken Baseball for players ages 8-18 who attend school in the Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton Public School District.

The DGF Baseball Club offers summer baseball programs for players ages 8-18 in (DGF) Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton.

The DGF Baseball Club and the DGF High School/Middle School Baseball programs work synonymous with each other to create a consistent and continuous baseball experience from Spring through Summer baseball for its participants.

The three programs offered in DGF in the summer are: American Legion Baseball, Babe Ruth Baseball and Cal Ripken Baseball. Each of the programs have age requirements and are explained on the following pages in more detail.

Your player's birthdate is the deciding factor for program/team eligibility over what grade they are in at school in the American Legion and Babe Ruth programs. In the Cal Ripken program, your player's birthdate is important when it relates to playing on a tournament team for a tournament trail (State, Regional, etc). As for local League play, we have some flexibility of allowing a player to play with his classmates in his grade.

Regardless of your players age, you will register them for 2026 summer baseball using the www.DGFbaseball.org website.

AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL

This program offers a 19U Senior Legion team and a 17U Junior Legion team. A player's eligibility is determined by their birthdate as of January 1. Use the Legion Age Chart on page 9 to determine if your players is Senior and/or Junior Legion team eligible. Players in the American Legion team have typically just completed 10th, 11th or 12th grade or are an eligible Super-Senior.

BABE RUTH BASEBALL

This program offers 16U and 14U team(s). A player's eligibility is determined by their birthdate on May 1. Use the Babe Ruth Age Chart on page 9 to determine if your player is 16U or 14U eligible. Players in Babe Ruth have typically just completed 7th, 8th, 9th or possibly 10th grade.

CAL RIPKEN BASEBALL

This program offers 8U, 9U, 10U, 11U and 12U team(s). These age levels are typically players just completing grades 2-6. The program offers practices and League games through the Red River Valley League here in the FM area. This program also offers a more competitive component with Tournament Team opportunities playing in weekend tournaments and State & Regional Tournaments.

AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL



The DGF Baseball Club will sponsor a Senior and Junior American Legion Baseball Team. “DGF Post 397” will play in Minnesota Division II Baseball. Our Senior and Junior teams will play a regular season schedule, invitational tournament(s) and a post season tournament schedule.

Rosters

The determination of team rosters will be the decision of the American Legion Baseball coaching staff. These roster decisions are based on a player’s age, skill level, commitment, effort, and attitude. If tryouts are needed these will be scheduled to help the coaching staff determine player rosters. Final rosters are due to the State of MN by June 15, 2026.

Staff

The American Legion Baseball team(s) will consist of the following staff: Team Manager, Head Coach and Assistant Coach(es).

Practices

American Legion Baseball practices are typically held in the late afternoon or evening. Practice times are scheduled by the team’s coach. Practices are mandatory and player dress/uniform is determined by the team’s coach. Practice facilities at Bob Marshall Field in Dilworth will be used.

Games

The DGF Post 397 Sr. Team will play in the MN Lakes Conference as well as playing non-league games which will consist of single games and doubleheaders. Post 397 attends 1-2 invitational tournaments during the regular season. Games are typically in the evening. The regular season will be followed by a Northwest Sub-State and State Tournament play pending advancement.

The DGF Post 397 Jr. Legion team will play a separate schedule of games determined by the

coaches to give our younger players game competition to improve skills for advancement to the Sr. Legion level the next season. The Jr. Legion team will compete against similar aged teams in the area. The Jr. Legion division does have a Northwest Sub-State and State Tournament for post-season play.

Double-Rostering

Players can be double-rostered meaning they can be placed on the Sr. and Jr. Legion team rosters if selected to double roster by the coaches. See Legion Age Chart on page 9 for rostering eligibility.

The DGF Baseball Club will sponsor Babe Ruth teams for the 16U and 14U age divisions.

The program is open to all players wanting to participate and learn the game of baseball. There is no cutting of players. Player participation is encouraged.

Rostering

The determination of team rosters will be the decision of the Baseball Directors & Coaches.

Evaluation/Tryout Session

This practice session will be scheduled to determine team rosters. After learning as much about all registered player's skill levels, work ethic, attitude, along with their age, final rosters will be determined and posted to the Club website.

A Babe Ruth team may consist of (15) maximum players for regular season and District level play.

If the number of player registrations warrants two teams at the 16U and/or 14U age levels, we will roster an "A" and "B" team at each level.

Practices

16U and 14U practices are typically held later afternoon/early evening. Practice times are scheduled by the team's coach. Practices are mandatory and player dress/uniform is determined by the team's coach. Practice facilities at Bob Marshall Field in Dilworth will be used.

Games

The 16U and 14U Team(s) will play league games in the Lake Region League. Any additional non-league games will be scheduled by the Baseball Directors. The 16U and 14U Team(s) will participate in the District post-season tournament, with possible advancement to a MN State Babe Ruth Tournament.

Typically, practices and games are held during the week with weekends off, unless a weekend tournament(s) is scheduled.

Coaches

The Club works to hire 1-2 coaches for each team. These are paid positions.

Double Rostering

Players can be double rostered on a Legion team and Babe Ruth team by rule if selected to do so by the Baseball Directors and Coaches.

CAL RIPKEN BASEBALL



NEW

The DGF Baseball Club will offer an **8U** program in Cal Ripken in 2026. The 8U age players will practice 1-2 nights a week and play League games two nights a week. This is a great way to get introduced to the sport of baseball with our 8-year-old division. (See Age Chart on page 9.)

Season Length

Early May through mid July. (8-9 Weeks)
Practices will start about 2-weeks ahead of scheduled games (weather dependent).

Roster Size

Maximum of 12-15 per League team.
Maximum of 12 per Tournament team.

SEASON BUILDERS

The volunteer coaches at each age level will have a scheduled pre-season meeting with the Club Baseball Directors to plan, roster, schedule, and select Tournaments for their age level. These Season Builder meetings will give each age level the best plan of action for your registered set of players.

The DGF Baseball Club will sponsor Cal Ripken teams in the 8U, 9U, 10U, 11U and 12U age divisions.

The program is open to all players wanting to participate and learn the game of baseball. There is no cutting of players. Player participation is encouraged.

The DGF Baseball Club will register our Cal Ripken League teams in the Red River Valley League (RRVL) under Fargo Youth Baseball. The Club will place our League teams in a division that best fits their skill level. These League games are played in the Fargo-Moorhead-West Fargo area fields.

Rostering

The determination of team rosters will be the decision of the Club Baseball Directors and Volunteer Coaches. Rosters for League teams and

Tournament teams are done at Season Builders.

Coaches

If you are interested in coaching, please indicate that on your player's registration. Coaches are volunteers at the Cal Ripken level. Our Coaches will have the opportunity to attend a pre-season Club Coaches Training to better educate you on your role as a Cal Ripken coach.

Practices

The goal for each Cal Ripken team is to have 3-4 contact days per week with their team. If two nights consist of games, there will be 1-2 practice nights determined by the team's coach.

League Teams

Players on League teams will practice as a team 1-2 nights per week with 2 nights of RRVL League games (No weekend tournaments). We offer League teams at all age levels 8U-12U. The 9U age level players that are on a League team will also have the option to play on a weekend tournament team that will play 3-4 tournaments during the summer. The Club reserves the right to recruit from the 8U level (if needed to form a full 9U Tournament Team roster only) based on interest and evaluations. There is an additional \$100 fee if rostered on a Tournament team.

League Games

The 9U & 10U League games will be played on Monday & Wednesday evenings. The 8U, 11U & 12U League games will be played on Tuesday & Thursday evenings. The tentative start dates for League games are May 18, 2026 (for 9U & 10U) and May 19, 2026 (for 8U, 11U & 12U). The RRVL League schedule will be put together in the April timeframe and released when ready.

Tournament Teams

Players have the option of registering for a Tournament team, instead of a League team, within their eligible age level (10U, 11U & 12U only). Tournament teams will not be registered with Fargo Youth Baseball in the RRVL. These Tournament teams will consist of 12 players selected through interest and/or a tryout/evaluation process.

Tournament teams will play double headers weekly with area towns and be registered for weekend Invitational Tournaments. Tournament teams are also eligible to register for a State, Regional, World Series tournament trail. The Tournament Team registration has a greater time commitment due to the weekend tournament participation.

This year’s day-long event will be hosted by DGF on Friday, June 26, 2026.

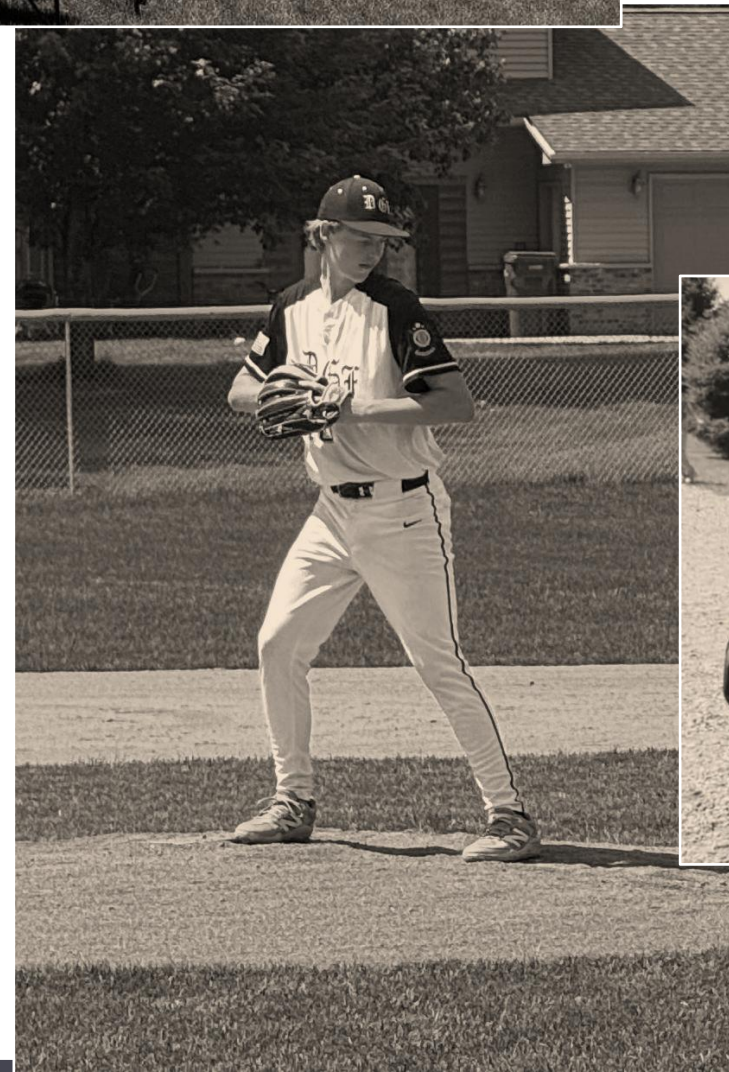
The schedule of games for each age level will be finalized closer to the event date and posted to our Club Website and social media sites.

FUNDRAISER

Raffle Tickets

This fundraiser requirement is for American Legion and Babe Ruth players only.

Cal Ripken players are not required to participate but can purchase Raffle Tickets if you would like to help with this Club Fundraiser.

The following annual fundraiser is conducted by the DGF Baseball Club to fund its baseball programs. This fundraiser is a requirement for American Legion and Babe Ruth Baseball registered players.

There will be top seller opportunities to earn cash incentives for select raffles below.

Raffle Tickets

All players in American Legion and Babe Ruth Baseball are required to sell 20 tickets (2 books of 10). The tickets are sold for \$10 each with chances to win multiple cash prizes. A \$200 non-refundable payment is collected online for the raffle tickets when registering online. Families with 2+ players participating need to sell a minimum of 30 tickets (3 books) with a \$300 deposit.

Drawing

This season, we will hold the drawing live at our Stag. The Stag is scheduled for 7pm Thursday, March 19th at the TAK Music Venue in Dilworth, MN.

Top Sellers

If an individual sells 5 books of 10 tickets (50 tickets) the player earns \$100 cash.

NEW CONCESSIONS AND RESTROOMS

Through community, school and contractor partnerships along with fundraising efforts, we were able to kickoff Bob Marshall Field renovations immediately after the 2025 season wrapped up.

We are very excited to share things are on track and will be ready for Spring 2026 at Bob Marshall Field!

This includes: the new concession stand and restrooms, new backstop wall, net and concrete patio/seating area in front of current grandstand. The backstop wall was moved closer to home plate and extended from dugout to dugout; the net structure also covers that entire space with a 25ft high fabric net for improved spectator safety and visibility of the game. The dugouts were painted, and dugout roofs were re-shingled. Fair or foul? It will now be easier to tell with the new 35' foul poles installed.



And, More...

Additional “unseen” work was completed to dramatically improve the drainage all around the home plate area on the field surface as well as the adjacent spectator areas.

A new asphalt walkway was created into the seating areas from the parking lot eliminating any uneven surfaces and creating a seamless path into the complex.

More work will happen in the Spring to button up some final landscaping items along with potential additions to the entrance area.

Stay tuned for Fall 2026 as phase two, the “Lion’s Den”, a covered patio seating area is being planned. This will be an exciting new (in the shade) space to watch baseball!
