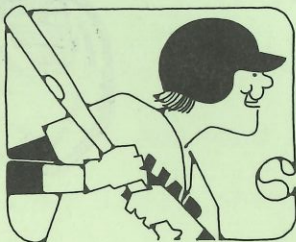

PACMEN NIP BUMS 8-7

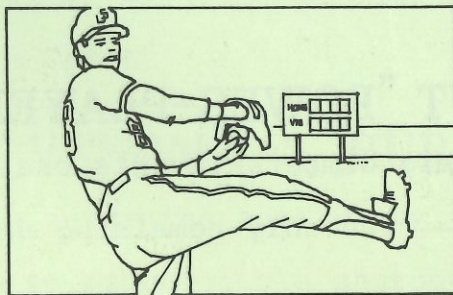

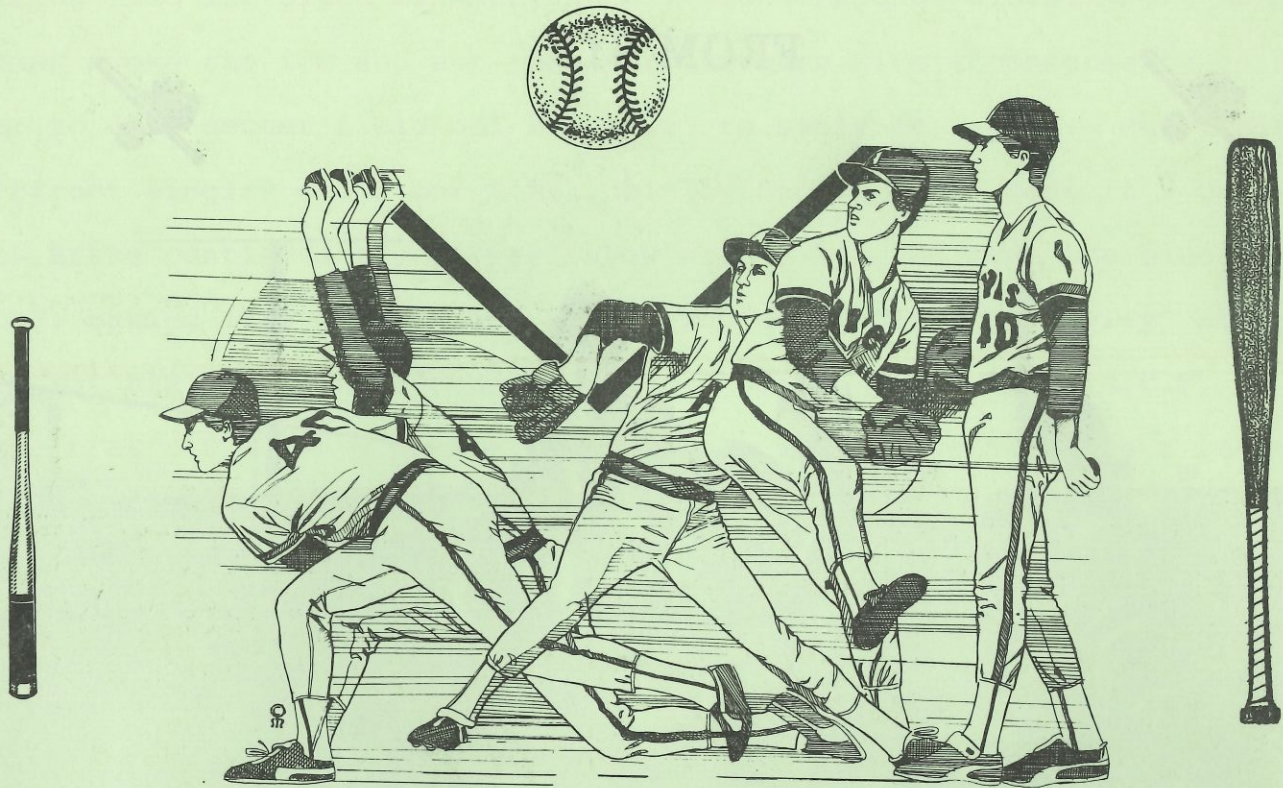
