The victory extended Chicago's current win streak to a season-high seven games ... Four rookies tallied goals in the win ... The Chicago power play went 2-for-6 (33.3%) and the penalty kill was a perfect 5-for-5 (100%).
- **Gunnarwolfe Fontaine** charted a multi-point game with a goal and a helper. He now has 19 points (10G, 9A) on the year. Over the two-game series against Madison, Fontaine tallied two goals and three assists.
- Liam Devlin reached the back of the net for the second time this season.
- Tyler Carpenter extended his point streak to five games (3G, 3A) with a power-play tally.
- **Josh Doan** scored his second of the season, a shorthanded tally. He now has a three-game point streak (2G, 3A).
- Matt Coronato notched a goal in the win to push his season total to 10 points (4G, 6A).
- Brendan Brisson extended his point streak to five contests (4G, 4A) with a goal.
- John Spetz picked up a two-point outing with a marker and a helper.
- Uula Ruikka (3A), Sean Farrell (2A) and John Jaworski (2A) each registered multi-assist games.
- Jack Babbage and Sam Colangelo recorded assists in the win.
- **Victor Ostman** made 14 saves to pick up the victory. His record now stands at 9-2-0-0 on the year.
