TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team will take on Finland today in the quarterfinals of the 2025 IIHF Men's World Championship in Stockholm, Sweden. All Team USA games air live on NHL Network.

THE SERIES VS. FINLAND

The U.S. and Finland play today for the 69th time in the IIHF Men's World Championship. Finland has a 33-2-2-23-8 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) advantage in the series. The teams last met in the 2023 men's worlds with Team USA gaining a 4-1 victory. Below is a look at the series since 2005.

QUARTERFINAL HISTORY

The U.S. has advanced to the quarterfinals of the world championship for the 14th straight time. Team USA is 9-2-4-12 (W-OTW-OTL-L) in 27 previous quarterfinal appearances. Quarterfinal games have been played in the tournament since 1992 (with the exception of 1997, 1998 and 1999) and the U.S. has qualified all but twice. The U.S. is 1-5 against Finland in QF play.

RANDOM BITS

One of the trucks carrying Team USA's equipment from Herning to Stockholm broke down, delaying the U.S. practice time yesterday from 4 o'clock to 5:45 p.m. ... Team USA did not have a morning skate today. It had a team meeting and stretch at its host hotel late this morning ... Three players enter today with a four-game point streak, including captain **Clayton Keller** (2-4---6), **Drew O'Connor** (1-3--4) and **Zach Werenski** (1-3--4). Werenski has a point in each of the four games he's played in the world championship after arriving in Herning on May 12 and playing in his first game against Norway on May 14 ... The U.S. is playing for just the fourth time ever on May 22 in the men's worlds and is 0-3 all-time (2021/FIN/1-2/Prelim Rd; 2016, RUS/2-7/Bronze Gm; 2014/CZE/3-4/QF) ... The U.S. has scored at least five goals in all but one game of the world championship.

THINGS

The U.S. is the home team today, will wear its blue jerseys and occupy the left bench ... **Mason Lohrei**, **Isaac Howard** and **Hampton Slukynsky** will not dress today ... The U.S. has advanced to the men's worlds semifinals in three of the last four tournaments ... The U.S. beat Finland, 3-2, in a shootout in the bronze-medal game of the 2013 men's worlds at The Globe in Stockholm. **Alex Galchenyuk** had two shootout goals, including the decisive tally, and **John Gibson** made 36 saves. The U.S. also won bronze here in 1949 ... The U.S. is looking for its seventh win of the world championship today. The 1939 team was the first to win at least seven games and five others have accomplished the feat since (2013, 2015, 2018, 2021, 2023) ... Today's game is the eighth over the last 12 days for the U.S.

LAST TIME OUT

The U.S. last played on Tuesday (May 20) and gained a 5-2 win over defending world champion Czechia. **Frank Nazar** had two goals and an assist, while **Andrew Peeke** (1-1--2) and **Zeev Buium** (0-2--2) also recorded multi-point games.

FROM PREVIOUS VERSIONS OF GAME NOTES

Dylan Larkin and his wife Kenzie welcomed their first child on May 19 -- Lennyn Marie Larkin. Dylan Larkin has played for the U.S. in five men's world championships, and was also part of Team USA for this past February's 4 Nations Face-Off ... Team USA has advanced to the quarterfinals of the IIHF Men's World Championship for the 14th straight year ... Team USA finished 4-2-0-1 in the preliminary round in the 2018 men's worlds played in Herning. The U.S. beat Czechia in the quarterfinals of that tournament (3-2), before dropping a 6-0 decision to Sweden in the semifinals. Team USA finished with a 4-1 win over Canada in the bronze-medal game ... U.S. defenseman **Mason Lohrei** started watching tennis a few years back and is hooked. He now plays with his buddies in the off-season regularly and shares that his favorite American player is Tommy Paul and he also enjoys watching Carlos Alcaraz and Jannik Sinner ... **Joey Daccord** made 26 stops in Team USA's 5-0 shutout of Denmark on May 9. The U.S. had one shutout in last year's world championship, that a 5-0 blanking of France when **Alex Nedeljkovic** made 10 saves in the U.S. net. It was the most saves in a shutout win in the world championship for a U.S. goaltender since **Jeremy Swayman** stopped 33 shots in a 3-0 win over Switzerland in the quarterfinals of the 2022 tournament in Tampere, Finland ... **Ryan Warsofsky** is the head coach of Team USA in the world championship for the first time. He was an assistant coach for the U.S. entry in the 2023 world championship where the team won its first eight games in the tournament for the first time ever ... **Mike Vellucci** is leading the U.S. power play, while **Kevin Dean** is in charge of the U.S. penalty kill ... U.S. defenseman **Brady Skjei's** wife's sister is engaged to Carolina Hurriganes netminder Frederik Andersen, who is from Herning. Skjei was here in Herning last summer with family and will return next summer for the wedding ... A total of 13 players part of Team USA have previously played in the IIHF Men's World Championship. The group includes **Matty Beniers** (2021), **Mikey Eyssimont** (2023, 2024), **Conor Garland** (2021, 2023), **Cutter Gauthier** (2023), **Clayton Keller** (2017, 2019), **Michael Kesselring** (2024), **Drew O'Connor** (2023), **Andrew Peeke** (2-23), **Shane Pinto** (2024), **Brady Skjei** (2016, 2017, 2019), **Jeremy Swayman** (2022), **Tage Thompson** (2018, 2021), and **Zach Werenski** (2018, 2024) ... **John Vanbiesbrouck**, who oversees all international hockey for USA Hockey and is part of the management staff of the U.S. Men's National Team, played in 31 career games in the men's world championship, the most of any netminder in U.S. history ... U.S. forward **Mikey Eyssimont** has become a big tennis fan over the past few years. He plays a couple of times a week in the off-season.

HOSTING WORLD EVENTS

The U.S. is hosting the **IPC World Para Ice Hockey Championship** May 24-31 in Buffalo, N.Y. The eight-nation tournament features the best sled hockey players in the world and returns to the U.S. for the first time since 2015. The U.S. has won three of the last four gold medals in the world championship and has medaled in 11 of the 13 world championships contested all-time. The U.S. will also be hosting the 50th anniversary of the **IIHF World Junior Championship** in Saint Paul and Minneapolis, Minnesota, Dec. 26, 2025 - Jan. 5, 2026. Team USA has won the last two gold medals in the World Juniors.

TEAM USA'S ALL-TIME MEN'S WORLDS MEDALS

The U.S. has won 13 medals in the men's world championship, earning gold once (1933), silver four times (1950, 1939, 1934, 1931) and bronze on eight occasions (2021, 2018, 2015, 2013, 2004, 1996, 1952, 1949). Of Team USA's eight bronze medals, six were claimed by winning bronze-medal games while two came via tournament standings and round-robin play.

HAT TRICKS

Tage Thompson had a hat trick to help the U.S. to a 6-5 overtime win over Norway on May 14. The last hat trick prior to Thompson's was a three-goal performance by **Brady Tkachuk** in last year's 10-1 triumph over Kazakhstan in the preliminary round on May 19. And prior to Tkachuk was a three-goal effort from **Cutter Gauthier** in a 9-0 victory against France on May 22, 2023.

NTDP IMPACT

A total of 14 players on the U.S. Men's National Team roster played at USA Hockey's highly acclaimed National Team Development Program in Plymouth, Mich. (greater Detroit). The group includes **Matty Beniers**, **Zeev Buium**, **Logan Cooley**, **Cutter Gauthier**, **Hampton Slukynsky**, **Isaac Howard**, **Clayton Keller**, **Mike McCarron**, **Frank Nazar**, **Brady Skjei**, **Will Smith**, **Tage Thompson**, **Alex Vlasic** and **Zach Werenski**. Slukynsky played just three games at the NTDP in 2022-23, while both Tage Thompson (2014-15) and Zach Werenski (2013-14) competed one season. The others players went through the traditional two seasons of the program.

ZACH WERENSKI

Defenseman **Zach Werenski** joined Team USA late morning on May 12. He would have likely played against Switzerland that day, however, his equipment did not arrive. Werenski, who is serving as an alternate captain for the U.S., played for Team USA in February's 4 Nations Face-Off and was also part of the U.S. squad in last year's world championship. He plays for the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets and is one of three finalists for the Norris Trophy as the league's top defenseman after registering 82 points (23G, 59A) in 81 games played. Werenski is Columbus' nominee for the King Clancy Memorial Trophy, which is presented annually to the NHL player who best exemplifies leadership qualities on and off the ice and has made a noteworthy humanitarian contribution in his community. He played one season at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program before embarking on a two-year stint in college hockey at the University of Michigan.

GENERAL MANAGER KEALTY

Jeff Kealty, general manager of the U.S. Men's National Team, is the assistant general manager of the NHL's Nashville Predators. He played college hockey at Boston University and competed for Team USA at the 1996 IIHF World Junior Championship. Kealty played one full season of professional hockey for the IHL's Milwaukee Admirals following his time at BU.

GAUDREAU REMEMBRANCE

Team USA's lockerroom includes a tribute to Johnny and Matthew Gaudreau who died tragically on August 29 when they were struck by a motor vehicle while riding their bicycles. Above the door where Team USA exits, an enlarged helmet decal with Johnny and Matthew's numbers is in place. And a small version of the decal is on the back of the helmet of Team USA's players (and has been used on helmets of U.S. teams at all levels in international play this season). In addition, Johnny's jersey hangs in Team USA's lockerroom. Johnny played in last year's IIHF Men's World Championship and broke the all-time U.S. career marks for points and assists, both which were previously held by Patrick Kane. Johnny scored the last goal of his superstar career on May 19 against Kazakhstan in Tampere, Finland.

THE JOURNEY

U.S. players and staff arrived in Frankfurt, Germany, on May 2 from their home bases in the U.S. and took the 2.5-hour journey via charter bus to Dusseldorf, Germany, where the U.S. had a three-day camp that culminated with its lone pre-tournament game vs. Germany on Sunday (May 4) -- a 5-2 victory fueled by two goals each from Tage Thompson and Frank Nazar. Team USA flew with Team Germany on May 5 to Herning.

IN DENMARK

The only other time the IIHF Men's World Championship has been staged in Denmark was in 2018 when Team USA went 6-2-0-2 and earned a bronze medal on the strength of a 4-1 victory over Canada in the bronze-medal game. The only player on this year's team who played in that tournament is **Tage Thompson**, who in 10 games, had 1-2--3. U.S. assistant coach **Adam Nightingale** was part of the 2018 team as video coordinator, while massage therapist **Peewee Willmann** was also part of the 2018 squad in the same capacity. That 2018 team also included **Johnny Gaudreau**. In addition, a jersey of the late Jim Johannson (who had oversight of all U.S. teams in international play for USA Hockey) was part of the team photo. Johannson passed away in January 2018, just prior to the Olympic Winter Games. **Patrick Kane** served as captain of the 2018 U.S. Men's National Team and was named tournament MVP (the only U.S. player to ever earn the honor), while contributing a U.S. single-tournament record 20 points, including eight goals.

LEADERSHIP

Clayton Keller is the captain of Team USA. He serves as the captain of the NHL's Utah Mammoth. Keller has played for Team USA on the world stage in five previous world championships at various levels, including two men's world championships (2017, 2019). The U.S. has four alternate captains in **Zach Werenski**, **Brady Skjei**, **Tage Thompson** and **Conor Garland**. The four have competed in a combined nine men's worlds.

WARSOFSKY AMONG THE YOUNGEST

LEGENDARY STAN WONG

Stan Wong marks his 57th appearance on the staff of a U.S. team on the international stage here in Herning. He is part of the Team USA staff for the 18th IIHF Men's World Championship and has worked the last 23 IIHF World Junior Championships. He has also been an athletic trainer for the last five U.S. Olympic men's hockey teams, 10 Deutschland Cup squads and for Team USA at the 2012 Youth Olympic Games. Wong was inducted into the Professional Hockey Athletic Trainers Hall of Fame in June 2015.
