TONIGHT'S GAME

Team USA faces Sweden here tonight in the gold-medal game of the IIHF World Junior Championship. Team USA is looking for its sixth gold-medal all-time in the World Juniors. The game will air live on NHL Network with EJ Hradek, Dave Starman and Jon Rosen calling the action.

THE LATEST

U.S. VERSUS SWEDEN

The U.S. and Sweden will meet for the 37th time tonight in the World Juniors. The U.S. has a slight 16-2-1-16-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) edge in the series. The teams have met once in the gold medal game, that in 2013 with a 3-1 U.S. win. See the complete series breakdown later in these notes.

TEAM USA IN GOLD-MEDAL GAME

The U.S. is 5-2 (W-L) all-time in the gold-medal game of the IIHF World Junior Championship. Team USA has played Sweden just once in the gold-medal game and earned a 3-1 victory in 2013 (see boxscore later in these notes).

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A group of players part of Team USA from the 2004 birth year, including **Cutter Gauthier**, **Rutger McGroarty**, **Isaac Howard**, **Frank Nazar III**, **Gavin Brindley**, **Jimmy Snuggerud**, **Lane Hutson**, **Ryan Chesley** and **Seamus Casey** were part of the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team that fell short in the 2022 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship gold medal game by a 6-4 count to Sweden. The U.S. outshot the Swedes in the game, 51-15. **Ryan Leonard**, **Will Smith** and **Trey Augustine** from the 2005 birth year were also part of that team. McGroarty had two goals in the contest and was named U.S. Player of the Game. The game featured a goaltending dual between Hugo Havelid of Sweden and Trey Augustine of the U.S. The group of 2004s above were also all on the 2020 U.S. Youth Olympic hockey team that dropped a 4-0 decision to Russia in the gold medal game.

CAREER IN WORLD JUNIORS

Cutter Gauthier has 6-16--22 in 13 career World Juniors games over two years. He is currently tied for third all-time in the U.S. record book with 16 assists, four short of the top spot of 20 shared by Trevor Zegras and Jordan Schroeder. Gauthier's 22 points are tied for fourth best all-time with James van Riemsdyk. Only Jeremy Roenick (25), Jordan Schroeder (27) and Trevor Zegras (27) have more. **Jimmy Snuggerud** has 10-10--20 in 12 career World Juniors games. His next goal will tie him for third all-time in the U.S. record books with Brian Gionta and Kieffer Bellows. Roenick holds the top spot with 13 goals.

U.S. TO HOST 2026 WORLD JUNIORS IN MINNESOTA

The U.S. will host the 50th anniversary of the World Juniors from Dec. 26, 2025 - Jan. 5, 2026 it was announced earlier today by USA Hockey. Xcel Energy Center, home of the NHL's Minnesota Wild, and 3M Arena at Mariucci, home for the University of Minnesota men's ice hockey team, will serve as the playing venues.

THREE BEST PLAYERS

Cutter Gauthier, **Gavin Brindley** and **Lane Hutson** have been named Team USA's Three Best Players of the Tournament.

WORTH NOTING

The U.S. is the home team, will wear its blue jersey and occupy the right bench ... Team USA rallied from a two-goal deficit after one to beat Sweden, 5-3 in a pre-tournament game on Dec. 21 in Angelholm, Sweden. Cutter Gauthier, who was born in Skelleftea, Sweden, and is back in the country for the first time since moving away at the age of two, had two goals and an assist in the game ... Today is day 24 on the World Juniors journey for Team USA that started with a training camp back on Dec. 13 at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan ... Including its two pre-tournament games, the U.S. has played eight games to date and won them all ... Team USA won its first gold medal in the World Juniors on this day 20 years ago with a 4-3 win over Canada in Helsinki, Finland ... Will Smith won 12/16 faceoffs (.750) yesterday vs. Finland and added a goal and an assist.

AUGUSTINE CLIMBING

Trey Augustine is 3-0 in the net for the U.S. in the World Juniors and has a 1.67 GAA and .941 save percentage. Over two World Juniors, he has eight career wins, tying him for third all-time. A victory today would vault him to third by himself. Augustine is 15-1-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) all-time in IIHF world championship play, including U18s and World Juniors. He owns a gold (2023 U18s), silver (2022 U18s) and bronze medal (2023 WJC).

NCAA LEADERS -- AS OF START OF WORLD JUNIORS

The U.S. roster features five of the top nine point-getters in NCAA hockey, including **Zeev Buium** (5-20--25) and **Gabe Perreault** (5-20--25), who are tied for fourth, and **Cutter Gauthier** (13-10--23), **Will Smith** (8-15--23) and **Seamus Casey** (4-19--23), who are tied for ninth ... **Zeev Buium** (5-20--25) and **Seamus Casey** (4-9--23) are the top two point-getting defenseman in the NCAA while **Lane Hutson** (8-12--20) is tied for fourth ... **Cutter Gauthier** is tied for second in the NCAA with 13 goals ... **Zeev Buium** (5-20--25) and **Gabe Perreault** (5-20--25) are the top two point-getting freshmen in the NCAA, while **Will Smith** is tied for fourth (8-15--23) and **Ryan Leonard** (10-8--18) tied for eighth.

WORLD JUNIORS IN SWEDEN

This year marks the seventh time the World Juniors have been played in Sweden. The U.S. has one medal to its credit in the first six World Juniors in Sweden, that being a bronze in 2007 when the tournament was held in Leksand and Mora. Team USA's roster that year included two first-overall NHL Draft picks for the first time ever in Patrick Kane and Erik Johnson. Johnson was named the best defenseman in the event and both he and Kane were part of the media all-star team.

FROM PREVIOUS GAME NOTES

Team USA scored 29 games in its four preliminary round games, the most it has scored since the current 10-team, two-group format started in 1996. The previous high was 28 (2009), followed by 26 (2010) and 25 (2021 ... Defenseman **Eric Pohlkamp**, his parents Joe and Mary, and five siblings -- including brothers Matt and Chris and sisters Sarah, Abby and Molly -- are all here in Gothenburg. It is the first time everyone has been together for two-and-a-half years. Eric's brothers Matt and Chris played college hockey at Bowling Green and then professionally in Europe ... They Said It -- from U.S. assistant coach **Steve Miller**, who is enjoying the cuisine in Sweden ... "Bread has not had a bad day here." ... **Ryan Leonard** had eights shots on goal to lead all players in Team USA's win 4-1 win over Norway on Tuesday (Dec. 26). **Gavin Brindley**, **Jimmy Snuggerud** and **Isaac Howard** each had six shots on net ... The U.S. won 73% of its faceoffs vs. Norway, led by **Will Smith** (14/17) and **Cutter Gauthier** (13/17) ... **Jacob Fowler** says **Gabe Perreault** has the best style of the line trio of Perreault-Smith-Leonard, who he plays with at Boston College ... Defenseman **Seamus Casey** likes to cook and shared his go-to dinner recipe in the U.S. World Juniors Insider yesterday (Dec. 27) ... Assistant coach **Steve Miller**, who is part of his sixth World Juniors staff for the U.S., is in charge of the penalty kill, while assistant coach **Brett Larson** is handling the power play ... **Zeev Buium**, who is the top point-getting defenseman in NCAA hockey (5-20--25), says playing roller hockey as a kid brought creativity to his game ... The U.S. roster includes seven players from Boston College, the most ever representatives from one team on a U.S. National Junior Team roster. The group includes the top four scorers on the team in **Gabe Perreault**, **Cutter Gauthier**, **Will Smith** and **Ryan Leonard** ... **Gabe Perreault**, **Isaac Howard**, **Seamus Casey**, **Gavin Hayes**, and **Carey Terrance** are all the top point-getters on their respective teams ... **Stan Wong**, who is an athletic trainer for the 22nd straight year with the U.S. National Junior Team, filled in for Santa Claus on Dec. 24 as "Stanta Claus" and distributed gifts to Team USA players. His commentary throughout the night was entertaining as always ... Check out the World Juniors Insider each day for insights into Team USA's journey at TeamUSA.USAHockey.com/worldjuniors2024 ... Both **Cutter Gauthier** and **Lane Hutson** played in the IIHF Men's World Championship for the U.S. last May where Team USA won its first eight games in the tournament for the first-time ever, before dropping its final two games in overtime (semifinal, bronze-medal game). Gauthier played in all 10 games and recorded 7-2--9, while Hutson had 2-4--6. Gauthier's seven goals were second in the tournament, just one off the lead

FIRST GOLD IN WJC WAS 20 YEARS AGO

This year's World Juniors marks the 20th anniversary of the first-ever gold medal for the U.S. in the World Juniors. That 2004 tournament culminated with a 4-3 U.S. win over Canada in the gold-medal game and included a perfect 6-0 mark for Team USA overall. Zach Parise was named the tournament MVP.

Forward **Rutger McGroarty** (Lincoln, Neb.), who returns to the U.S. National Junior Team after helping the squad earn a bronze medal a year ago, is the captain of the 2024 U.S. National Junior Team. He has also represented the U.S. twice in the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship, including helping the U.S. to a silver medal in 2022. In addition, McGroarty helped Team USA earn silver at the 2020 Youth Olympic Games. Forwards **Cutter Gauthier** (Scottsdale, Ariz.) and **Gavin Brindley** (Estero, Fla.) and defensemen **Lane Hutson** (North Barrington, Ill.) and **Ryan Chesley** (Mahtomedi, Minn.) are serving as alternate captains. All four were part of the 2023 U.S. National Junior Team.

THE JOURNEY

The U.S. began its 2023 World Juniors journey with a camp in Plymouth, Mich., at USA Hockey Arena with 29 players looking to gain a spot among the final 25-man U.S. roster for the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship. Below is a look at some of the key moments to date.

TEAM USA IN WORLD JUNIORS

Entering the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship, the U.S. holds a 156-11-6-121-11 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time record in world junior championship play. Most recently, Team USA went 4-1-0-2 in the 2023 tournament and earned the bronze medal. To date, Team USA has earned 14 podium finishes, including five gold medals (2004, 2010, 2013, 2017, 2021), two silver medals (1997, 2019) and seven bronze medals (1986, 1992, 2007, 2011, 2016, 2018, 2023). The United States has medaled in six of the last eight tournaments, the best medal stretch in the history of the country.

ON NEW YEAR'S EVE

Including this 2024 World Juniors, the U.S. is 21-10-1 (W-L-T) all-time on New Year's Eve in the World Juniors including wins in its last six opportunities. The U.S. has played Canada 10 times on New Year's Eve, the most of any opponent with Finland (7) and Sweden (4) next.

ABOUT THE STAFF

ABOUT VANBIESBROUCK

John Vanbiesbrouck is the general manager of the 2024 U.S. National Junior Team, marking his sixth straight season serving in the capacity. The 2007 U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame inductee has previously represented the United States as a player on nine occasions, including one Olympic Winter Games (1998), two Canada Cups (1987, 1991), four men's world championships (1985, 1987, 1989, 1991) and two world junior championships (1982, 1983). A full-time employee of USA Hockey, Vanbiesbrouck began his duties as assistant executive director of hockey operations for USA Hockey on June 4, 2018. His responsibilities include oversight of all of USA Hockey's international efforts, including its men's, women's and sled programs as well as the National Junior Development Program.

ABOUT CARLE

David Carle is serving as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the first time. In his sixth season as head coach of the University of Denver's men's ice hockey team in 2023-24, Carle has led the Pioneers to three NCAA tournament appearances overall in his tenure as head coach at DU, including the 2022 NCAA title. He had a 116-53-13 overall record in his first five campaigns with the Pioneers, which included a COVID-shortened season in 2019-20. Prior to being named head coach, Carle served four-and-a-half seasons as an assistant coach with Denver (2014-18), joining the program in 2014 following a season-and-a-half as an assistant coach (2012-14) with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League. As a player, Carle was recruited to play at Denver and spent four seasons (2008-12) as a graduate assistant coach after a medical diagnosis forced him to retire from his playing career. A 2008 NHL Draft-eligible prospect, Carle was drafted in the fourth round, 203rd overall, by the Tampa Bay Lightning.

USA Hockey has a talented group of assistant coaches, including NCAA Division I head coaches **Brett Larson** (St. Cloud State University) and **Garrett Raboin** (Augustana University), University of Minnesota associate head coach **Steve Miller** and David Lassonde, who serves as the national goaltending coach for USA Hockey. The ADM places a heightened emphasis on skill development and long-term athlete development principles, providing a blueprint for the best possible youth hockey experience.

At the younger age levels, it looks like fun and constant motion in small spaces. The ADM encourages station-based practices, small-area games and cross-ice competition to deliver more repetitions, more puck touches and more skill development per hour of ice time. It provides the most efficient, most engaging development path for children, keeping them both in the game and on a path toward their full potential.
