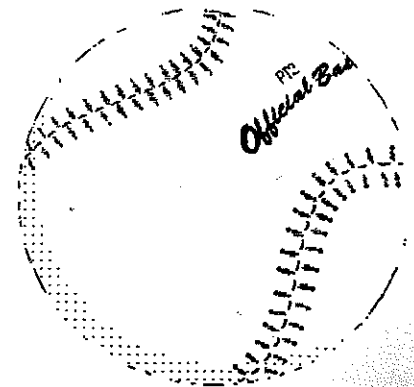

## South Beach Averages 1st Loss By Beating The Black Magic, 7-3

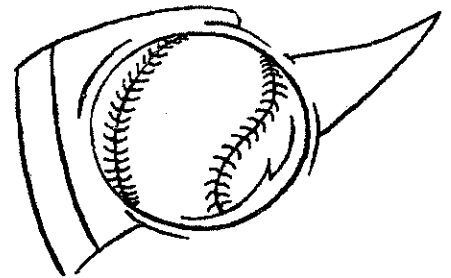

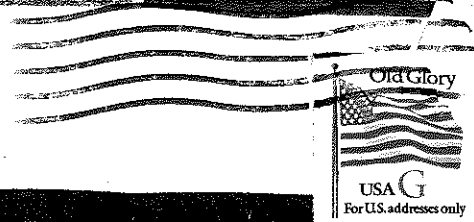
