# GLORY DAYS

The Redmond boys basketball program has a proud and decorated history. But its finest days unquestionably occurred during a 6 year period starting in the fall of 1987, when Redmond won two straight state championships and reached the tournament's "final four" 5 times. "It was as good a run as any team has ever had on the Eastside," said Gary Patterson, who starred for the Stangs from 86-89. "We felt like we really put Redmond on the map."

Like any great team, the Mustangs (who repeated the title feat in 1988 and 1989) were a product of years of hard work, focus, and chemistry. "From the 4th or 5th grade on, people knew who we were," said David Rockwood, the steady-handed point guard on both championship teams. "We were all close when we were young -- me and Jack (Estep) and JT (D'Amico) played up (a year) and we got used to winning. We created a winning culture. Nobody cared about points or stats -- all we wanted to do was win. And by the time we got to high school (with Patterson) - we knew we were going to win state -- twice."

Guided by second-year head coach (and future high school hall of fame inductee) Jerry Koester, the 1987-88 team may have had the best single-season in Redmond's history. The

versatile Stangs crushed their competition, finishing 27-2, losing only to a nationally ranked Tennessee team (at a tournament in Hawaii) and a head-scratching defeat to a lowly Interlake team. "Practice the next day (after that loss) was definitely not awesome," said Rockwood, "But it helped us a lot." The Stangs, with renewed focus, rolled through the conference, district, and state tournament, setting a new mark for post-season margin of victory. "We were so deep that we couldn't even (individually) put up big numbers," said Patterson, "most of us only played half the game." The Stangs defeated a talented Ferris team to win the school's first state crown, and the team was rewarded with a downtown parade, a trip to the capitol and a meet with the governor, front-page coverage in local papers and huge rallies on campus. "It was a big deal, said Patterson, "the community really rallied behind us. Great fans and great support."

Bringing most of their talent back (and with key additions, including future Redmond head coach Brian Lund) the Stangs were brimming with confidence in 1988 as they looked to defend their title. "Never a doubt that we'd do it again," said Rockwood of his veteran teammates, "We were so deep. We worked hard on every play. With Gary (Patterson) the tighter the game, the bigger the game -- the tougher he got." Late game pressure meant nothing to leading scorer Estep, said Patterson, adding "No moment was too big for Jack." The team played in front of standing room only crowds in every gym they entered, and Rieger Auditorium was rocking as the state's #1 team routinely delighted the home crowd.

The path wasn't easy. Ed Pepple's mighty Mercer Island team (with 4 D1 commits including current Montana head coach

Travis DeCuire) took down the Stangs in a regular-season showdown and again in the conference tournament. With Jack Estep out with a staph infection, the defending champs were reeling and were forced into a loser-out game at districts. But the Stangs saved their best for last (and despite a tough draw in the state tournament) they outlasted a strong Marysville-Pilchuck team before avenging their earlier losses to Mercer Island (with a win in the State quarterfinal). "Maybe the highlight of my high school career," said Patterson. The Stangs took down deeply talented Puyallup and Garfield squads to bring another trophy back home to Redmond. "Those games at Key arena were tough," said Rockwood, "we earned it." Patterson (named all-state) insists that the humble Rockwood never get the publicity he deserved. "Rockwood was the motor. He was the heart and soul of our team -- so unselfish -- but he was the straw that stirred the whole thing."

"I give a lot of credit to coach Koester, but I also give a lot of credit to our team --- everyone played with greater purpose," said Patterson. "We were skilled, but our toughness was underrated. It's not easy to repeat. But we played together. We were versatile, with so many interchangeable parts and we had guys that could guard anyone. Our only goal was to win state -- and we did it the hard way."

# GREATEST GAMES



In a year unlike any other (thank you, Covid-19), the Rieger auditorium saw a performance unlike any in the history of Redmond Basketball. It was April 27, 2021 and long-time foe Lake Washington came to Education Hill for an early-season matchup.

The Kangaroos were short-handed (playing without all-conference guard Ben Nyquist) but they were long on effort and grabbed an early lead. Mustang junior Luke White kept the game close (with 11 first-half points) but the Kangs (led by junior Zach Pemble) used a suffocating defense to grab a double-digit second-half lead and seemed poised to pull off the upset.

Senior Nathan Miller, however, turned in a post-intermission performance that will live in Redmond infamy, scoring 29 points, including 2 free throws (he would shoot 9-9 in from the line) that tied the game with less than 2 seconds remaining, rallying the Stangs to overtime.

"He's the greatest player I've ever seen," said teammate Seth Kreysar, and Nathan's 10 points in overtime secured the win. "It was amazing," Nathan said post game, "This is what we play for." Assistant Coach Nelson (who has seen more games at Redmond than any man alive) added "it was the best game I've ever seen a Mustang play. And it's a testament to his will to be the best player he can be -- and his love for our family."

# COACHING STAFF



## TODD RUBIN | HEAD COACH

Coach Rubin is in his 7th year as the Redmond High School Mustang Head Coach. He has enjoyed every minute of being back at his alma mater teaching and coaching basketball. Rubin started teaching and coaching immediately after being a college athlete at Linfield College where he earned a degree in Health and Physical Education. His first basketball stop was at Seattle Prep as a head JV coach where his team went 18-2. The following three years he would be the head assistant on the Varsity team where he was in charge of the defense. In his first year in this position Prep won the state championship, followed by a state performance and a final four finish in his last year at Prep.

During Rubin's last year at Prep he also started doing personal basketball training where he has trained local professional players that have been successful in the NBA, D-League and European Leagues. Rubin also coached high school baseball as an assistant for 4 years. Following Seattle Prep Rubin became the head coach at Edmonds-Woodway HS. At EWHS Rubin took his team to the district playoffs each year while also developing a feeder program for 5th-8th graders.

Todd was the head coach of the top AAU team at Eastside Basketball Club for 3 years. His teams won 5 NCAA sanctioned tournaments including an Elite 8 finish at the top division of the Adidas 64 in Las Vegas which only two other teams from the state of Washington have ever done.

After seven years of teaching and coaching at the high school level Rubin was hired as the assistant coach at Northwest University. In his first year he helped Northwest win its first league championship and earn an Elite 8 finish at the national tournament with a 29-5 record. He would stay at Northwest two more years and make the national tournament one more time and win 20 plus games in each season. At Northwest Rubin was in charge of the defense for two years and the offense for one year. While at Northwest Todd continued to work with professional, college and high school players. Rubin has led the Mustangs to a winning record 5/6 seasons as head coach. In 2019 Redmond won the division and posted a 15-5 record. He is looking forward to many more successful seasons with the Mustangs Basketball Family on and off the court.

Rubin also earned his master's degree in Sports Administration and Kinesiology in 2012.

In his free time he loves to spend time with his family and friends, especially his wife Andrea, his 7 year old daughter Reese and his 5 year old son Banks.



## GORDON KAPLAN | JUNIOR VARSITY HEAD COACH

A veteran coach, Gordon Kaplan enters his first year on the Mustang staff and will be tasked with directing the Junior Varsity. Most recently, he was the Head Coach at Skyline High School where he directed the program to two consecutive post-season appearances in three years, a state ranking, and #14 RPI. While coaching two KingCo All-League candidates he earned a KingCo Coach of the Year award in 2019. Kaplan served as an assistant at SHS for one season before accepting the head coaching position. Before coming to Skyline, Kaplan was an assistant coach at Seattle's Lakeside School in the Metro League (3A) under the guidance of Shea Robinson. He was also an assistant coach at Roosevelt High School, a consultant to BC Elite Basketball, and a clinician for Converse.

Kaplan spent a season with the NBA's Orlando Magic in 1998-99 - Chuck Daly's last year in coaching. He was an assistant to the Director of Video Scouting and handled Draft, Free Agent, and data mining duties assigned to him by the GM and coaches, including Eric Musselman - now the Head Coach at Arkansas.

Gordon earned his master's degree in Sport Management at Indiana University in Bloomington. There, with the permission of Bob Knight, he attended Hoosier basketball practice in Assembly Hall. He also completed grad level course work in coaching as conducted by Knight and Assistant Coach Norm Ellenberger.

Before his time in Bloomington, Coach Kaplan served as First Assistant at Division III Goucher College in Baltimore. There he assisted in building an NCAA Tournament-caliber team from the ground up, eventually earning back-to-back conference championships and defeating the defending National Champions on their home floor.

Kaplan was also a successful high school coach in the Baltimore area coaching two parochial schools, local travel teams, and training private clients.

Gordon is a "cat person", occasionally plays guitar, and is a certified yoga teacher having completed a 2-year 2,000-hour training in alignment-based yoga.

# COACHING STAFF



## DERIK DETWEILER | C-TEAM HEAD COACH

Coach Detweiler is excited to be entering his first year as Head Coach of the boys' C team at Redmond High School. He has served as a school counselor at Redmond High School since January of 2021 and can't wait to get more involved with students in another capacity to further help them achieve and grow in holistic regards. Detweiler began coaching basketball in youth leagues fifteen years ago and later served as a developmental coach at Sageridge College Preparatory Academy in Reno, NV and Meridian Middle School in Lynden, Washington.

Detweiler hails from Dayton, Nevada and played in a highly successful basketball program which placed team and fundamentals above all else. He is eager to bring these same mindsets as a coach at Redmond High School as players prepare for the Varsity program. Coach Detweiler is a die-hard fan of the Sacramento Kings and prides himself on watching every game they play despite their 16-year streak of a losing record. Unquestionably, this dedication demonstrates his sense of passion and loyalty. Coach Detweiler is looking forward to learning from his players and growing as a coach, in addition to further connecting with the community he cares for so deeply.



## SCOTT NELSON | ASSISTANT COACH

Coach Nelson is in his 7th season as an assistant at Redmond High School. He has been around coaching for over 30 years. Nelson played point guard at Trinity Western University for 4 years and lead the conference in Free throw percentage. Following his playing time at TWU he served as an assistant coach. He then headed to the Northwest where he was an assistant at SPU for the women's team for 3 years. His first years as a high school coach he was as an assistant at Rainer Beach who won the AA State Championship that year.

Coach Nelson then earned his master's degree in Guidance & Counseling at City University in Bellevue. Concurrently, while he took over at Liberty HS as the head coach for two years where he had a winning record both seasons. As a teacher at Redmond Jr. High he took over the head coaching job and won 5 league championships in 10 years. This was following by a couple years as an assistant at Skyline HS and 8 years at Bear Creek HS where the team qualified for state 4 times. When not around basketball he enjoys spending time with his wife Margie and mountain biking with his dog Gracie.

Coach Nelson has been a major supporter of Redmond Basketball for a long time and is thrilled to be working with student athletes. He can't wait to see the improvement of the program this season.

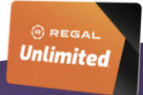

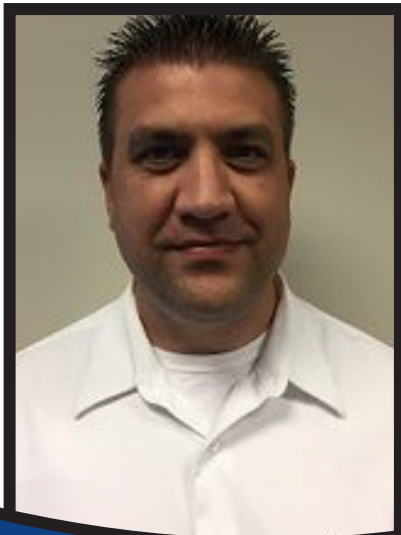

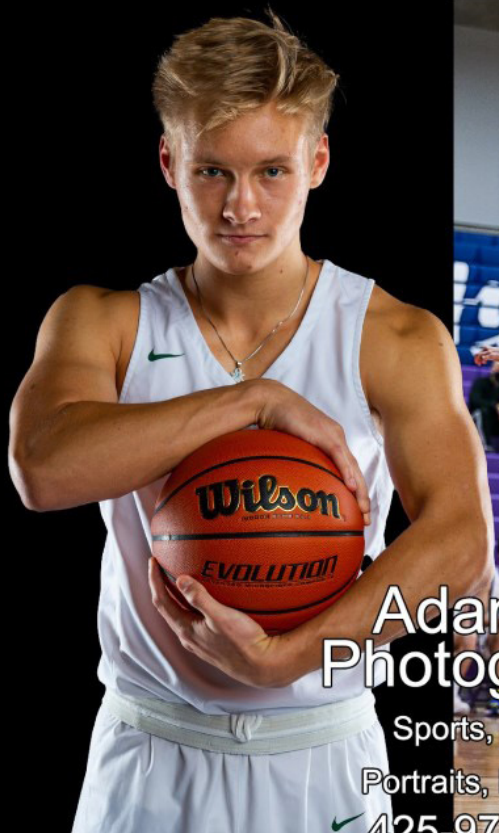
