In each year as a head coach I develop practices plans, game strategies and skill development with each and every kid on the team and sometimes kids on other teams. Working with and helping managers chosen on my team to best run the season. Working with and developing a coaching staff so we are working together and having the same mindset to work with the kids in practices scrimmages and games. Email, texting and/or calling parents and working on communicating to the parents all of the season plans and goals. Disciplining kids, trying to improve work ethic and attitude.

When coaching the last three years it has always been my intent to coach these young athletes into young men more than professional hockey players. I have always felt that head coaching you are a strong influence to these young men and have to help them learn responsibility and respect.

Other Youth Experiences and Community Involvement

Between the ages of 15 to 18 years of age. I was a Youth Servant Leader (YSL) at a Christian based camp called Camp Omega. Youth Servant Leader Program prepares high school aged youth to be servant leaders at camp, at church, and in their communities. YSLs spend a week of leadership training gaining skills and better understand Scripture. Following leadership training you are given a week or two of camp throughout the summer to work with Counselors and a group of kids coming to camp. YSLs would give morning and/or evening devotions, wash dishes, connect with campers through camp activities and lead games and songs.
