

2019 Parkland Athletic Club (PAC) Bantam AAA (BAAA) Release Process

Player Releases:

As per Hockey Alberta Development Model (ADM) procedure, all Elite AAA Player Movement is overseen by the respective league governors.

SGMHA Registered Player Options

1. Try out for PAC Bantam AA (BAA). If you were released prior to the start of the BAA tryouts (Tuesday, Sept. 3), check either of the PAC BAA team home pages for the tryout schedule. If you were released after Tuesday, Sept. 3, please contact the office (office@sgmha.ca) to advise them that you are not continuing on with a second or third tryout at the BAAA level and to be directed to your next skate.
2. Try out for St. Albert Minor Hockey Association (SAMHA) BAAA team. Contact Raiders Bantam Director Keith Waldbillig (bantamdirector@raidershockey.ca) and cc the registration office (registration@samha.ca).
 - Once you have confirmed a tryout with SAMHA, you will need to complete the Male Elite Notification of Tryout (NTO) form. Once completed, this form must be sent to the Spruce Grove Minor Hockey Association (SGMHA) office (office@sgmha.ca). (If you are unsure of your Respect in Sport (RIS) Certificate #, it can be looked up at the office.) The form will be signed and returned along with your waiver from PAC within 24 hours. If SAMHA waives you through, please contact Earl Reid (earlreid@shaw.ca) from the Alberta Major Bantam Hockey League (AMBHL) to be directed to your next tryout location. Once a confirmed tryout is determined please forward the completed NTO with the Elite Team listed as the second tryout option and the waiver from SAMHA to the office. The NTO and a waiver from PAC will be forwarded to you within 24 hrs.

 - If released from SAMHA's BAAA team you may try out for a third BAAA team. Contact Earl Reid (earlreid@shaw.ca) from AMBHL to get more information and to find out which team you are eligible to try out with.

Non-Resident Options

1. For players whose home association is Onoway, Pembina, or Enoch: You can try out for PAC BAA. If you were released prior to the start of the BAA tryouts (Tuesday, Sept. 3), check either of the PAC BAA team home pages for the tryout schedule. If you were released after Tuesday, Sept. 3, please contact the office (office@sgmha.ca) to advise them that you are not continuing on with a second or third tryout at the BAAA level and to be directed to your next skate.
2. Try out for St. Albert Minor Hockey Association (SAMHA) BAAA team. Contact Raiders Bantam Director, Keith Waldbillig, (bantamdirector@raidershockey.ca) and cc the registration office (registration@samha.ca).
 - A waiver from PAC will be emailed to you within 24 hours of your release, along with the NTO you submitted during the tryout registration process. If you do not receive one, please contact SGMHA office (office@sgmha.ca) to have it forwarded to you. You will need to provide the waiver from PAC and your NTO at your next BAAA tryout location. Please also notify your local minor hockey association (LMHA), letting them know that you have been released from SGMHA and will be continuing on with the tryout process.

- If released from SAMHA's BAAA team you may try out for a third BAAA team. Contact Earl Reid (earlreid@shaw.ca) from the AMBHL to get more information and to find out which team you are eligible to tryout with.

Additional Notes:

- If you are invited to try out with a second or third BAAA club, you will be required to produce the signed NTO and waiver forms. It is important that you keep copies of these documents on hand and are able to produce them if asked during the tryout process.
- SGMHA, SPMHA, Onoway, and Enoch players: If you proceed with a second and/or third tryout at the BAAA level with plans to return to PAC for BAA, please contact the office (office@sgmha.ca) for direction to your next skate.
- SGMHA, SPMHA, Onoway, and Enoch players: You need to complete your tryout options at the BAAA level **prior** to stepping on the ice for BAA tryouts.
