

Wolfpack Scoresheet Instructions

Please use the steps below as your guide completing the scoresheet:

Before the Game:

1. Locate the 4 page scoresheet (white, pink, yellow and golden copies) located in the scorebook found in scoreboard/clock area at rink. For tournaments, the scorebooks will be at the Front Table.
2. Obtain the Home and Away Team's labels and place the player labels in the upper left hand section of the page. Place one label on each of the 4 pages of the scoresheet. Place the divider in between the game scoresheet and next blank set of scoresheets so that nothing transfers through to the next set of scoresheets.
3. Validate that the team names are written in the space provided at the top of the form, as well as, date of game and level of game. For example: 10/29/2019 C Bantam
4. If this is your first time doing the book, let the referees know so that they make sure you have heard them and have documented what you were told.
5. Give the scoresheet to the referee. They will enter their names, ID numbers, verify roster totals for both teams and obtain the head coach's signature from each team.
6. Now you're ready to start the game!! 😊

During the game:

1. Goals: For each goal that is scored, update the following information in the Goals section of the sheet:
 - a. A **referee** will provide the scoring team, jersey number of player scoring the goal and player(s) awarded assists.
 - b. Look at the **clock** to record period and time left in period, scoring team and jersey number of player scoring the goal and player(s) awarded assists. Use a comma if there are multiple assists.
 - c. At the end of each period, record the total goals scored by each team for that period in the Scoring section of the scoresheet.
2. Penalties: For each penalty, go to the Penalties section of the sheet.
 - a. A **referee** will provide the penalized team, jersey number, type of penalty, length of penalty.
 - b. Look at the **clock** to record the period and time on clock (time-off). When player goes back on ice, record the time the player is back on the ice (time-on).
3. Shots on Goal: To record Shots on goal (SOG), keep track of SOG during each period in the Shots on Goal, Saved and Scored section (a SOG is any shot that goes in the net or would have gone in the net if not blocked by the goalie). There is a separate section for each period.
4. Goalkeeper Saves: At the end of each period, record Goalkeeper Saves for each team (Shots on Goal minus goals scored).

After the game:

1. Total up the number of goals scored by each team and record the final score in the Scoring section.
2. If you tracked the number of Shots on Goal, total up the number of Shots on Goal/Saves and record the final totals for each team.
3. Print or sign your name in the space provided as Scorer.
4. Give scoresheet to BOTH referees for them to review and sign. After all signatures have been obtained, the referees will take the white scoresheet.
5. Give the Pink Copy of the completed scoresheet to the visiting team manager or coach.
6. Give Yellow Copy of the completed scoresheet to the home team manager or coach.
7. Leave the Golden Copy of the completed scoresheet in scorebook and leave the scorebook at the Scorer's Table. For tournaments, the scorebook should be returned to the Front Table after each game.
