The 3-on-3 overtime and shootouts only affect conference standings, while the game is officially a tie for NCAA purposes.

## NCHC FACTS AND FIGURES

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS:** While six NCHC teams return to conference play this weekend, Colorado College and No. 4/4 Denver travel to face non-conference foes. On the season, NCHC teams have combined to go 33-20-9 in non-conference play this season, with the .605 winning percentage tops among the six Division I men's hockey conferences. The NCHC has posted the best combined non-conference winning percentage in four of the last five seasons, including last year at .659. CC faces Princeton of ECAC Hockey, with NCHC teams 1-1-2 against ECAC teams this season (Princeton went 1-0-1 at St. Cloud State). DU battles Arizona State in the desert, the first NCHC team to face ASU this year. (page 9)

**POLL POSITIONS:** Five NCHC teams remain ranked in the USCHO.com Poll for the fourth straight week. The five ranked teams in the poll tie with Hockey East for the most from one conference. Three NCHC teams remain in the USA Hockey Magazine Poll, including two in the top five. (page 9)

**WE'RE GOING STREAKING:** No. 3/3 North Dakota heads into its series at No. 17 Western Michigan riding an 11-game unbeaten streak (10-0-1), which is the longest active unbeaten streak in the country, while its five-game win streak is tied for the fourth-longest active win streak. North Dakota ranks in the top five nationally in both offense (4.13 gpg/4th in NCAA) and defense (1.67 gapg/3rd in NCAA) on the season. (page 28)

**SHOT SHOW:** UND is allowing the fewest shots on goal per game in the NCAA this season at 20.13, while its opponent this weekend, Western Michigan, is firing 33.43 shots on goal per game, which is fifth nationally. Three NCHC teams are in the top six in the NCAA in shots on goal per game, with Denver fourth (34.57) and Minnesota Duluth sixth (32.71).

**CENTURY CLUB ACCESS:** No active NCHC players have 100 career points, but two are closing in on the century mark. Miami senior forward and captain **Gordie Green** has 96 career points, while Western Michigan senior forward and captain **Hugh McGing** has 93, with Green the active career scoring leader in the NCHC. Green has 41 goals and 55 assists in 126 career games, while McGing has 35 goals and 58 assists in 125 games.

**ALL THEY DO IS (SCORE TO) WIN:** Three players have scored an NCAA-best four game-winning goals this season and two reside in the NCHC in North Dakota junior forward **Jordan Kawaguchi** and Omaha freshman forward **Joey Abate**. All four of Kawaguchi's game-winners came in November, including his last three games. Abate has four goals all season, with all four serving as game-winners (in six UNO wins). (page 27)

• Colorado College was idle last weekend, but was swept on the road two weekends ago (Nov. 22-23) at Minnesota Duluth, falling 4-3 in the final 20 seconds in the series opener, before being blanked on Nov. 23, 5-0. The Bulldogs are the first team to sweep the Tigers this season, while the finale marked the first time CC was shut out all season. The Tigers have scored at least three goals in eight of 10 games this season.

• Freshman goaltender **Matt Vernon** made a career-high 43 saves Nov. 22 at UMD, tying his season best from earlier this season. Vernon also made 43 saves in an overtime tie against Western Michigan on Nov. 2.

• Senior forward **Nick Halloran** scored two goals in the Friday, Nov. 22 loss to UMD for his first multi-goal game this season. Including the Saturday, Nov. 23 loss when he was held off the scoresheet, he has four goals in his last four games and is now tied for the team lead with five goals with classmate **Chris Wilkie**. Halloran was an All-American as a sophomore before being injured mid-season last year as a junior.

• Denver split with Western Michigan at home two weekends ago (Nov. 22-23) after being idle last weekend. DU fell in the Nov. 22 opener, 2-1, before bouncing back on Nov. 23 for a 6-1 victory. The win marked DU's first conference win of the season in six tries, while it also snapped a five-game winless skid. The Nov. 22 home loss was a rarity, as Denver is 30-10-8 at home since the 2017-18 season, posting a .625 winning percentage and taking NCHC points from 79 percent of games.

• Junior defenseman and captain **Ian Mitchell** dished out two assists in the Saturday win over WMU, snapping a six-game pointless streak. Since last season, Denver is 20-2-4 when Mitchell scores a point and 13-13-3 when he does not. This season, the Pioneers are 8-0-0 when Mitchell records a point and 1-3-2 when he does not.

• The Pioneers' penalty kill went 4-for-4 against WMU two weekends ago and ranks sixth in the NCAA, going 49-of-54 (90.7%) on the season. Denver's penalty kill unit has scored three short-handed goals, as well, this season, tying for fourth in the NCAA.

## Miami RedHawks

• Miami went on the road over Thanksgiving weekend and was swept at Connecticut, dropping a 6-4 decision on Friday and a 4-3 contest on Saturday, with UConn scoring the game-winner in the third period both nights. Friday's loss marked the third time this season the RedHawks have scored four goals and lost, also settling for a 4-4 tie with New Hampshire back in October.

• Senior captain and forward **Gordie Green** tallied a goal and an assist in Friday's loss at UConn to push his point streak to six games (3g, 5a), only to have it snapped on Saturday. He leads the team with seven goals and 17 points. Green is now only four points away from becoming the 53rd player in Miami program history to post 100 career points (41-55-96 currently) and the first active NCHC player to do so.

• Miami's power play has scored in six of seven games after striking twice on the man advantage in Friday's loss at UConn, going 8-for-23 (34.8 percent) in that span. Prior to that, MU had scored on the power play in only three of eight games, going 3-for-31 (9.7 percent).

• Minnesota Duluth had its three-game winning streak snapped with a pair of losses at home at the hands of top-ranked Minnesota State last weekend. UMD scored only two goals in the series, both on the power play, suffering 4-1 and 3-1 defeats. The Mavericks are the first non-conference foe to sweep UMD in Duluth since Bemidji State (before they joined the WCHA) turned the trick back on Oct. 7-8, 2005.

• Junior defenseman **Scott Perunovich** was held scoreless both games against Minnesota State, only the second time all season that's happened (Oct. 18-19 at Wisconsin). He is second in the NCHC in scoring with 20 points and second among all NCAA defensemen in scoring, while his 18 assists are second nationally among all skaters.

• UMD went 2-for-8 on the power play against Minnesota State, scoring once each night. UMD ranks fourth nationally on the power play this season, going 18-for-61 (29.5 percent). The 18 power play goals are third nationally, while UMD also has 18 even strength goals this season.

Kawaguchi scored or assisted on seven game-winning goals during November and ranked third nationally with 16 points, leading North Dakota to an unbeaten month (8-0-1).

Kawaguchi averaged 1.78 ppg in November, which was second in the NCAA, with at least a point in eight of the nine games, including five multi-point outings. UND's assistant captain scored six goals to tie for ninth nationally, four of which were game-winners to lead the NCAA in November. He also dished out 10 assists, including three primary helpers on game-winning goals, which tied for sixth in the NCAA.

Kawaguchi was twice named NCHC Forward of the Week in November and NCAA Third Star of the Week once after a six-point weekend in a sweep of Miami on Nov. 8-9. His other NCHC weekly honor came after a three-goal, four-point series to close November, guiding UND to its first road sweep of Minnesota since 2006-07 by tallying both game-winners. He also notched four points in UND's sweep of St. Cloud State a week-end earlier (Nov. 22-23) to finish the month on a four-game point streak. He was +9 in November.

He led the NCHC with a .918 save percentage and a 1.75 GAA, while allowing only one goal in five of his nine games during the month.

Scheel topped 20 saves four times in November, including a season-high 30 saves in a 1-1 overtime tie at Denver on Nov. 15. He then made 27 more saves the next night in a 4-1 win to help UND record its first series win at Magness Arena since 2003-04. He allowed just two goals against the Pioneers to earn NCHC Goaltender of the Week honors and NCAA Second Star of the Week. He finished his month backstopping UND to its first sweep at rival Minnesota since 2006-07, compiling 41 saves in the two wins to capture his second NCHC Goalie of the Week accolade in the month. ## JULIE & SPENCER PENROSE MEMORIAL CUP

Awarded to the NCHC regular season champion, the Julie and Spencer Penrose Memorial Cup (right) serves as the league's crowning achievement. The Cup is named after Julie and Spencer Penrose, who were tremendously successful in the business world and did much of it in Colorado Springs in the early 1900s. The couple made much of their money in the copper industry, which is why the trophy includes copper stars on it. The Penroses also set up the El Pomar Foundation, which still today helps pay for amateur sports and other non-profits, including the NCHC office located in the Copper Building next to the Penrose House on the grounds of the Penrose compound in Colorado Springs. The El Pomar Foundation has also issued grants for the Penrose Cup, medallions for each individual champion and the NCHC's annual Post-Graduate Scholarship. St. Cloud State won its second straight and third Penrose Cup overall last season, also winning it in the NCHC's inaugural season (2013-14). North Dakota has won two Penrose Cups back-to-back (2014-15, 2015-16), while Denver is the only other Penrose Cup champion (2016-17) to date.



## NCHC TOURNAMENT/FROZEN FACEOFF

The NCHC Tournament will consist of four quarterfinal series on the first weekend following regular-season play (March 13-15, 2020). The four higher seeds will host the four lower seeds in a best two-out-of-three format. Seed #1 will host Seed #8, Seed #2 will host Seed #7, Seed #3 will host Seed #6, and Seed #4 will host Seed #5. The winners of the four quarterfinal series will advance to the NCHC Frozen Faceoff at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. for the two semifinal games on Friday, March 20. Semifinal games will be reseeded based on the final regular-season standings. The winners of the two semifinal games (4:08/7:38 p.m. CT) will then meet in the Championship Game (7:38 p.m. CT) on Saturday, March 21 for an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, while the two losers from the semifinal games will face each other in the third-place game (3:38 p.m. CT) earlier in the day. The 2018 NCHC Frozen Faceoff, won by Denver, was named Visit Saint Paul's Event of the Year for 2017-18. Minnesota Duluth won the 2019 Frozen Faceoff title, its second NCHC Tournament crown (2017).

## THURSDAY, NOV. 28

### No. 3/3 NORTH DAKOTA 9, MINNESOTA 3

In the lone college hockey game on Thanksgiving night, No. 3/3 North Dakota feasted against its long-time rival Minnesota, tripling up the Gophers, 9-3, on the road at 3M Arena at Mariucci Thursday night. The nine goals marked a season high for UND (11-1-2) and extended its unbeaten streak to an NCAA-best 10 games (9-0-1). The nine goals also tied North Dakota's most goals ever against Minnesota (5-7-3) in their storied history. The Fighting Hawks scored three goals in the first period, four in the second and tacked on two more in the third with only one coming via a power play. Junior forward Grant Mismash tallied a career-high four points and career-best three assists in the win, while classmate Jordan Kawaguchi scored two goals and added an assist for a three-point night. Sophomore Jacob Bernard-Docker also chipped in three points on a goal and two helpers in the win. UND outshot the Gophers, 36-21, Thursday.

## FRIDAY, NOV. 29

While most people were recovering from a huge meal Thursday, three NCHC teams were hard at work Friday looking to pick up non-conference wins. However, only one NCHC team skated away victorious Friday night, as No. 3/3 North Dakota completed a holiday weekend sweep, while Miami and No. 8/9 Minnesota Duluth both came up short in their series openers.

### No. 3/3 NORTH DAKOTA 3, MINNESOTA 2

After walloping Minnesota, 9-3, in Thursday's series opener, No. 3/3 North Dakota received a much stiffer test from the Gophers in Friday's finale, but still prevailed with a 3-2 win at 3M Arena at Mariucci to complete its first road sweep of its long-time rival since 2006-07. The win pushed the Fighting Hawks' unbeaten streak to an NCAA-best 11 games (10-0-1). Both teams struck in the first frame, but UND (12-1-2) took the lead for good with two goals in the first half of the second period. Junior forward Jordan Kawaguchi scored the eventual game-winner midway through the middle stanza for his fourth point of the weekend. Minnesota (5-8-3) closed within one on a power play goal in the final frame, but sophomore goalie Adam Scheel totaled 23 saves to preserve the win for North Dakota.

### No. 1/1 MINNESOTA STATE 4, No. 8/9 MINNESOTA DULUTH 1

In a top-10 in-state tilt, top-ranked Minnesota State got the better of No. 8/9 Minnesota Duluth in Friday's series opener at AMSOIL Arena. After a scoreless first frame, the Mavericks (11-1-1) struck three times in the second stanza to grab a commanding 3-0 lead. MSU then added its second power play goal of the night early in the final frame, 5-on-3. Junior forward Kobe Roth got the Bulldogs (7-5-1) on the board midway through the third period with a power play of their own on tic-tac-toe passing, but it was too late for a comeback. The Mavericks outshot UMD, 30-28, in their win.

### CONNECTICUT 6, MIAMI 4

In the first game to get underway Friday, Miami led after 40 minutes, but Connecticut stormed back with three in the third to top the RedHawks in Hartford, 6-4, in a high-scoring series opener. After UConn (4-6-3) struck early on a 5-on-3 power play, the RedHawks (4-7-3) rattled off three straight goals to close the

first frame, including two on the man advantage. The Huskies pulled even late in the second stanza, but sophomore defenseman Derek Daschke scored in the final two minutes of the period to restore a one-goal cushion at 4-3. UConn tied it early in the third period, then midway through potted their second power play goal of the night on Vladislav Firstov's second goal of the night, which was the game-winner. Connecticut outshot Miami, 48-30, in its win, as senior Ryan Larkin made 42 stops in net for MU.

## SATURDAY, NOV. 30

Only two NCHC teams were in action Saturday night, both playing non-conference foes, and both came up a bit short. Miami fell on the road at Connecticut, 4-3, while No. 8/9 Minnesota Duluth dropped a 3-1 home decision to top-ranked Minnesota State at AMSOIL Arena, with both NCHC teams surrendering two third-period goals in defeat.

### CONNECTICUT 4, MIAMI 3

In a back-and-forth affair, Miami (4-8-3) came up a goal short as Connecticut (5-6-3) struck twice in the third period to break a tie and clip the RedHawks, 4-3, Saturday at the XL Center. Freshman forward John Sladic scored two goals for the RedHawks for his second career multi-goal game, including opening the game's scoring midway through the first period. The Huskies answered later in the frame and took the lead in the second stanza. Sophomore forward Monte Graham tied the game for MU early in the final frame, but UConn answered with two quick goals less than two minutes apart to grab a 4-2 cushion, with the game-winner coming on the power play. Sladic added his second of the game later to bring Miami within one, but the RedHawks couldn't find the equalizer. UConn outshot the RedHawks, 35-27, in their sweep-clinching victory.

### No. 1/1 MINNESOTA STATE 3, No. 8/9 MINNESOTA DULUTH 1

It was a power play bonanza at AMSOIL Arena Saturday night, with all four goals being scored on the man advantage as top-ranked Minnesota State scored the game's final two goals to break a 1-1 tie and cap a sweep of No. 8/9 Minnesota Duluth, 3-1. Jake Jaremko book-ended the game's scoring, opening with a power play goal to put the Mavericks (12-1-1) up 1-0 midway through the first frame. UMD (7-6-1) had several chances to answer in the second period with three power play opportunities, including a major penalty, but the Bulldogs couldn't capitalize. UMD finally broke through when junior forward Justin Richards scored on the power play to tie the game in the third period. The Mavericks answered right back, however, as Lucas Sowder scored the game-winner a man up less than two minutes later and Jaremko sealed the game a few minutes after that. Despite the loss, UMD outshot Minnesota State, 38-24, but went just 1-for-5 on the man advantage, while MSU was 3-for-4.
