2022 IIHF U18 WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

The U.S. U18 Women's World Championship Team is one of eight teams competing at the International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Women's World Championship from June 6-13, 2022 in Madison, Wisconsin.

The tournament features eight teams divided into two groups of four. Team USA is competing in Group A alongside, Canada, Finland and Sweden. Group B includes Czechia, Switzerland, Germany and Slovakia. Each group will play a single round-robin series before the playoff round.

All four teams from Group A and the top two teams from Group B advance to the playoff rounds. The top two teams in Group A receive a quarterfinal bye. The two semifinal winners will play in the gold medal game, while the two semifinal losers will play for bronze.

U18 WWC SUCCESS

The U.S. has earned gold or silver in every IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship since the inception of the event in 2008.

LAST TIME OUT

Grace Dwyer (Wynnewood, Pa.) scored the game-winning goal with 6:31 to play as the U.S. came from behind in the final period to defeat Sweden, 3-2, and advance to the Gold Medal Game at the 2022 Under-18 Women's World Championship. Team USA tallied two unanswered goals in the third to complete the comeback victory, outshooting Sweden 53-24 in the winning effort.

QUICK SHOTS

TODAY'S MATCHUP

Following a 3-2 victory over Sweden in the semifinal round, the U.S. will face Canada with the gold medal on the line. This marks the second meeting of the tournament for these two teams. They met on June 9 in the final preliminary round game, with the U.S. coming out on top, 7-0. It marked the U.S.' first shutout of Canada in U18 Women's World Championship play.

IN THE GOLD MEDAL GAME

Team USA boasts an 8-5 all-time record in the gold medal game at U18 Women's World Championship and has made the gold medal game in every U18WWC in history. The U.S. has faced Canada 12 times in the final game, winning seven of them.

A STINGY DEFENSE

Team USA has yielded three goals on the entirety of the tournament. It is the fewest goals allowed of any team. Against Sweden, the U.S. killed off all eight Sweden power plays, including two 5-on-3 opportunities in the second period.

FIRST PERIOD FRENZY

Team USA has outscored its opponents 10-0 in the first period of its four games of the tournament. 10 of the team's 21 goals have been tallied in the first.

ON THE SCORESHEET

Two of the top five point scorers of the tournament are from Team USA. Laila Edwards leads the event with four goals and is third with eight points (4G, 3A). Sydney Morrow sits in fifth with eight points (1G, 7A).

THREE BEST PLAYERS

Laila Edwards, Sydney Morrow and Tessa Janecke were named the IIHF three best players of the tournament.

AGAINST CANADA

In 20 games against Canada at the U18 WWC, the U.S. holds a 13-7 record. Team USA holds a 6-2 record against their rival in the last eight games, including wins in the 2020 and 2017 gold medal game. Most recently, the U.S. topped Canada, 7-0, in the final preliminary round game.

SECOND GO AROUND

Danielle Burgen and Kirsten Simms are the only two returning players from the 2020 edition of the U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship team. The pair played an integral part in bringing home gold in a 2-1 overtime victory over Canada in 2020.

DEFENDING THE GOLD

Team USA enters the U18 Women's World Championship as the defending gold medalists having won the 2020 title, 2-1, in overtime fashion against Canada in Bratislava, Slovakia. The U.S. has won five of the last six (2020, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2015) U18 Women's World Championships competed. The 2021 tournament was canceled due to COVID.

TEAM USA AT A GLANCE

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The 2022 U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship roster is 23 players, including two returners, Danielle Burgen and Kirsten Simms, from the gold medal-winning team that competed at the 2020 IIHF Women's World Championship in Slovakia two years ago. 21 players on the team are U18 newcomers. 11 states are represented on the roster, with seven players hailing from Minnesota. 16 different youth programs are represented as well.

AYE AYE CAPTAINS

Dani Burgen (Lindstrom, Minn.) is the captain of Team USA for the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship. Kirsten Simms (Plymouth, Mich.) and Laila Edwards (Cleveland Heights, Ohio) will serve as alternate captains.

BEHIND THE BENCH

Katie Lachapelle head coach of the Holy Cross women's ice hockey team, is serving as head coach of the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for the first time, after serving as an assistant coach from 2013-17. Mel Ruzzi, head coach for Brown and Chelsea Walkland, assistant coach for Colgate, will both serve as assistant coaches. Alli Altmann will be the goalie coach.

Of Note: Team USA tops Sweden to advance to 2022 gold medal game.

JUNE 13, 2022: USA 3, SWE 2: Grace Dwyer (Wynnewood, Pa.) scored the game-winning goal with 6:31 to play as the U.S. came from behind in the final period to defeat Sweden, 3-2, and advance to the Gold Medal Game.

Series vs. Canada: 8-5-4-3 (W-OTW-OTL-L)

Of Note: The U.S. shutout Canada 7-0 in last meeting; have won 6 of last 8

JUNE 9, 2022: USA 7, CAN 0: Behind a 25-save shutout from goaltender Annelies Bergmann, Team USA topped Canada, 7-0 to close out the final preliminary round game of the IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship.

QUARTERFINALS



U.S. All-Time in U18WWC Quarterfinals: 0-0 (W-L)

Of Note: The U.S. has never played in a quarterfinal contest in IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship history, having earned a BYE to the semifinal round in all 14 of the Under-18 Women's World Championship tournaments.

SEMIFINALS



U.S. All-Time in U18WWC Semifinals: 14-0 (W-L)

Of Note: Team USA has advanced to the semifinal round in all 14 U18 WWCs completed. The U.S. has won all 14 semifinal contests it has played at the competition, topping the Czech Republic six times, Sweden three times, Russia twice and Canada, Finland, Germany each once.

U.S. All-Time in U18WWC Gold Medal Games: 8-5 (W-L)

Of Note: Team USA and Canada have faced off for gold in 12 of the 13 previous U18WWCs, with the U.S. holding a 7-5 advantage in those contests. Six of those contests have gone into overtime (2020, 2019, 2016, 2013, 2010, 2008), with the U.S. winning three.

TEAM TIDBITS

SECOND GO AROUND

Danielle Burgen and **Kirsten Simms** are the only two returning players from the 2020 edition of the U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship team. The pair played an integral part in bringing home gold in a 2-1 overtime victory over Canada in 2020. The 2021 tournament was canceled due to COVID.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Two pairs of siblings are set to represent the U.S. at both the 2022 Under-18 Women's World Championship and 2022 World Junior Championship. **Madison Kaiser** and Wyatt Kaiser, along with **Sydney Morrow** and Scott Morrow will all look to bring home gold for the U.S. this summer.

USA HOCKEY NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Six members of the team won a 2022 Chipotle-USA Hockey National Championship this past April in Pittsburgh. **Elyssa Biederman**, **Cassie Hall** and **Kirsten Simms** won the 19U title with Little Caesars. **Sedona Blair**, **Ava Lindsay**, **Josie St. Martin** won the 16U title with Minnesota Grey Elite.

A SLIVER OF WASHINGTON

Defender **Ava Svejkovsky** is the only player on the roster from Washington state, hailing from Point Roberts. Point Roberts is a pene-exclave south of Vancouver, Canada and is accessible by land only by traveling through Canada. Svejkovsky plays her youth hockey in Canada at Delta Hockey Academy.

MONTANA MINDSET

Forward **Finley McCarthy** is from Whitefish, Montana and is the only player on the 2022 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team from the state on Montana. She is the first-ever player on a U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship Team to be from 'The Treasure State.'

COLLEGE CONNECTION

20 of 23 players are publicly committed to play collegiate hockey, with most entering school in the fall of 2022 or fall of 2023. Seven are committed to the University of Wisconsin and are currently playing the tournament in their future home arena. Cornell, Colgate and Ohio State all have two commits on the roster, while Boston College, University of New Hampshire, Minnesota State, University of Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and Penn State all have one player.

OLYMPIC ALUMNI

A total of 18 players on the silver medal-winning 2022 U.S. Women's Olympic Team represented the U.S. at an IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, including **Cayla Barnes**, **Megan Bozek**, **Hannah Brandt**, **Dani Cameranesi**, **Alex Carpenter**, **Alex Cavallini**, **Jesse Compber**, **Kendall Coyne Schofield**, **Brianna Decker**, **Jincy Dunne**, **Caroline Harvey**, **Megan Keller**, **Amanda Kessel**, **Abbey Murphy**, **Abby Roque**, **Kelly Pannek**, **Lee Stecklein**, and **Grace Zumwinkle**. Murphy and Harvey were both on the most recent U18 team in 2020.

OLYMPIC CONNECTION

Two-time Olympian Kelly Pannek currently serves as the head coach of the Benilde-St. Margaret's Girl's Hockey Team, where she coached Edina, Minnesota native, **Emma Peschel**.

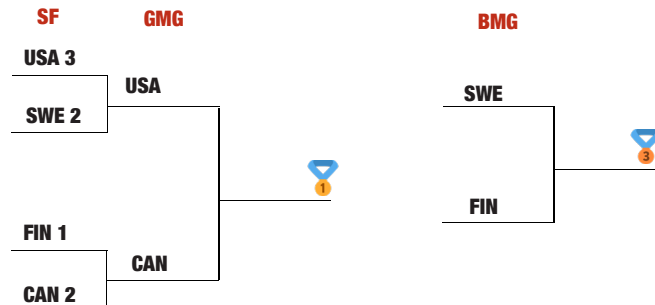
MINNESOTA MADE

AROUND USA HOCKEY

THE SUMMER OF HOCKEY

Summer 2022 will be a busy one for USA Hockey. Due to COVID, a number of tournaments were rescheduled for this summer, including the Women's Under-18 World Championship and the World Juniors. In addition, Team USA have competed at the Under-18 Men's World Championship and Men's World Championship and will compete at the Men's World Championship and the Women's World Championship, along with the Five Nations Tournament and the Hlinka Gretzky Cup.

THE BRIANNA DECKER ENDOWMENT FOR GIRLS HOCKEY

The Brianna Decker Endowment For Girls Hockey is going national. Started in 2018 by three-time Olympian **Brianna Decker** (Dousman, Wis.), and in conjunction with the USA Hockey Foundation, the endowment aims to provide grants to girls hockey organizations to increase female youth participation in hockey by alleviating costs around ice and equipment, advertising and marketing, and overall development. 2022 grants are open to all girls programs across the nation. 2022 USA HOCKEY ANNUAL CONGRESS

USA Hockey's Annual Congress took place from June 8-11 in Denver, Colo. Annual Congress serves as a USA Hockey's annual meetings and will be the first in-person since 2019.

2022 IIHF WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

For the first time ever, there will be an IIHF Women's World Championship in the same year as an Olympics. The 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship will take place August 25 - September 4 in Herning and Frederikshavn, Denmark. The U.S. will bring a 23-player roster that will be named in August.

U.S. AND CANADA U18 AND COLLEGE SERIES

The U.S. and Canada will meet for an Under-18 and College series in late summer, resuming an annual faceoff that was last competed in 2019 due to COVID. The teams will play in Canada in August. The teams will be announced during the summer.

Throughout the summer, USA Hockey will host six different player development camps for both boys and girls as a talent evaluation and development opportunity.

KATIE LACHAPELLE, HEAD COACH

Katie Lachapelle is serving as head coach of the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for the first time during the 2022 season.

She has been closely involved with the U.S. Women's National Team program since 2013, having served as an assistant coach for the U18 Women's National Team from 2013-17, leading the squad to three golds at the IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship in 2015, 2016 and 2017 and a silver medal in 2014.

Lachapelle also served on the coaching staff of the U.S. Under-22 Women's Select Team on occasions for the U22 Series against Canada, leading the U.S. to a three-game sweep in 2018 and a 2-1 series victory in 2019. She has also served as a coach at numerous national and player development camps over the last decade.

For the last three seasons, Lachapelle has led the Holy Cross Women's Ice Hockey program as head coach. The Lewiston, Maine native has been on staff for five seasons, serving as the team's associate head coach prior to taking over the head seat.

Prior to joining the Crusaders program, Lachapelle was an assistant coach at Boston University (2008-17), Ohio State (2004-08), Niagara (2001-04) and Union (1999-01). She is a Providence College graduate, and four year letterwinner for the Friars.

MEL RUZZI, ASSISTANT COACH

Ruzzi is serving as an assistant coach for the 2022 U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship team for the first time. She has been involved with USA Hockey since 2006, including serving as the director of USA Hockey's multi-district girls camp for the Rocky Mountain District and Pacific Districts since 2017 and serving on the coaching staff of numerous national development camps.

The Mansfield, Massachusetts native finished up her first season at the helm of the Brown University Women's Ice Hockey team in 2021-22. Prior to Brown, Ruzzi served as the assistant coach for Princeton University from 2019-21.

She began her coaching career at Amherst College, with stops at Harvard and Providence along the way. Ruzzi is a 2003 graduate of Providence College.

SYDNEY BRODT, ASSISTANT COACH

Brodt is making her coaching debut as an assistant coach for the Under-18 Women's World Championship team in 2022.

Prior to this coaching assignment, Brodt spent the 2021-22 season as a player with Linköping HC in Sweden and has been a member of the U.S. Women's National Team, having won gold with the squad during the 2019 IIHF Women's World Championship. The North Oaks, Minnesota native also competed for Team USA during the 2019-20 Rivalry Series and the 2019 and 2020 Under-22 Series against Canada.

Brodt also represented the U.S. at the 2016 Under-18 Women's World Championship, where she recorded three goals and one assist en route to gold. She is a four-year letterwinner for Minnesota Duluth.

CHELSEA WALKLAND, ASSISTANT COACH

Walkland is making her debut as an assistant coach for the 2022 U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship team this season. She has previous experience with USA Hockey having been involved with the organization in various capacities through player development camps since 2012.

The Rochester, N.Y. native recently finished her third campaign as an assistant coach for the Colgate University Women's Ice Hockey team.

Prior to Colgate, Walkland spent five seasons behind the bench as an assistant coach at Robert Morris. She began her coaching career at RIT from 2011-12 and SUNY Oswego (2012-14).

She is a Robert Morris alum, having skated for the Colonials from 2006-10.

ALLI ALTMANN, GOALTENDING COACH

Altmann is serving as the goaltending coach of the Under-18 Women's National Team for the fourth season, having previously served in the role from 2017-20. She guided the U.S. to two golds and a silver during that time.

The Egan, Minnesota native also served on the silver medal-winning staff of the 2020-21 U.S. Women's National Team that took silver at the Women's World Championship in Calgary. She has served as the goaltending coach for the U.S. Women's National Festival since 2016.

Altmann is currently the co-owner and vice president of DEVENIR Goaltenders. She played four seasons for Minnesota State University, recording a career .901 save percentage.
