2022-23 RIVALRY SERIES

One of the fiercest rivalries in all of sports, the Rivalry Series is an annual series between the women's national teams of the United States and Canada.

Established by USA Hockey and Hockey Canada during the 2018-2019 season, the Rivalry Series in an annual showcase of the highest level of women's hockey at varying locations in the United States and Canada.

Following a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic and preparation for the 2022 Olympic Winter Games, the Rivalry Series resumes with seven games across three months - three in November, two in December and two in February.

The U.S. won the 2019-20 Rivalry Series by the tally of four games to one.

RIVALRY SERIES SUCCESS

The U.S. and Canada have competed in the Rivalry Series twice prior, with the U.S. winning the series in 2019-20 and Canada winning in 2018-19.

2019-20: The won the series by the tally of four games to one.

2018-19: won the series by the tally of two games to one.

MEDIA ACCESS

Team USA players and head coach John Wroblewski will be available for postgame interviews following all games and non-gameday practices. The lockerroom is closed. All interviews must be coordinated through Melissa Katz of USA Hockey.

LAST TIME OUT

A late third-period goal by Canada's Sarah Nurse proved to be the difference maker as Canada took game five of the Rivalry Series, 3-2. **Amanda Kessel** opened the scoring late in the first off a tight 2-on-1 opportunity to open a 1-0 lead. Canada responded in the middle frame with two goals of its own, going up 2-1. **Hilary Knight** tied the game in the third, but Nurse's goal put Team Canada over the top. **Maddie Rooney** made 13 saves in net.

QUICK SHOTS

TODAY'S MATCHUP

Today's meeting between the U.S. and Canada marks the fifth game of the 2022-23 Rivalry Series and the final meeting of the series in the U.S. Team USA currently leads the series three games to one and can clinch the series title with a win today. Team USA won game one, 4-3, in a shootout, game two, 2-1, and game three, 4-2, Canada won game four, 2-3.

IN THE RIVALRY SERIES

The U.S. holds a 6-2-1-3 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record over Canada all time in the Rivalry Series.

RAZOR-THIN MARGIN

With the exception of game four, all games of the Rivalry Series have been decided by one score, with the deciding tally coming in either the third period or the shootout.

CALIFORNIA CONNECTION

Defender **Cayla Barnes** is the only member of the roster who is from Southern California, Eastvale, Calif., just an hour drive from Crypto.com Arena. Barnes played her 14U hockey for the Los Angeles Jr. Kings.

HAVE A KNIGHT

Throughout the first four games of the 2022-23 Rivalry Series, forward **Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, Idaho) has recorded eight points (five goals, three assists), and has posted a multi-point game in two of the four games. Knight recorded the game-winning shootout goal in game one and the game-winning tally in game three.

HOLLYWOOD HOCKEY

For the first time in Rivalry Series history, the U.S. and Canada will face off in Los Angeles, Calif. at Crypto.com Arena. It marks the second time the Rivalry Series visited California, following a Feb. 8, 2020 meeting at the Honda Center in Anaheim, Calif.

SETTING RECORDS IN SEATTLE

A total 14,551 fans witnessed Team USA top Canada, 4-2, at Climate Pledge Arena on Nov. 20, the third game of the Rivalry Series. That marked the largest crowd ever to watch a U.S. Women's National Team game on U.S. soil. It broke a previous record, 13,320, set on Feb. 8, 2020 at the Honda Center in Anaheim, Calif.

TEAM USA AT A GLANCE

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

Team USA's roster for the December Rivalry Series games features 26 players - 15 forwards, eight defenders and three goaltenders. Of the 26, 19 players were members of the 2022 U.S. Olympic Women's Hockey Team. Additionally, all 23 players from the silver-medal winning team at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship are on the roster as well.

Tessa Janecke (Orangeville, Ill.) is making her U.S. Women's National Team debut during the December Rivalry Series swing. Olympic medalists **Kali Flanagan** (Hudson, N.H.) and **Abbey Murphy** (Evergreen Park, Ill.) also return to the U.S. Women's National Team roster.

AYE AYE CAPTAINS

Kendall Coyne Schofield (Palos Heights, Ill.) is the captain of Team USA for the 2022-23 Rivalry Series. **Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, Idaho) and **Lee Stecklein** (Roseville, Minn.) will serve as alternate captains.

BEHIND THE BENCH

John Wroblewski is serving as head coach of the 2022-23 U.S. Women's National Team following his debut with the team during the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship. **Shari Dickerman**, assistant coach at Minnesota State, **Molly Engstrom**, head coach for Maine and **Josh Sciba**, head coach for Union, will both serve as assistant coaches. **Alli Altman** will be the goalie coach. Both Sciba and Altman also served on the coaching staff of the Women's Worlds team.

2022 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM RETURNEES

The December roster for the 2022-23 Rivalry Series returns 19 players from the 2022 U.S. Olympic Women's Hockey Team that captured silver in Beijing in February 2022. Those returners include, **Cayla Barnes, Hannah Brandt, Alex Carpenter, Jesse Compher, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Jincy Dunne, Savannah Harmon, Caroline Harvey, Nicole Hensley, Megan Keller, Amanda Kessel, Hilary Knight, Abbey Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Maddie Rooney, Abby Roque, Hayley Scamurra, Lee Stecklein** and **Grace Zumwinkle**.

2022 WOMEN'S WORLDS RETURNEES

All 23 players that represented Team USA at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship in Herning, Denmark will skate for the U.S. at the December Rivalry Series. The team swept the preliminary round, 4-0, before falling in the gold medal game, 2-1, to Canada, taking home silver.

2018 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM RETURNEES

The December roster features 11 players from the 2018 U.S. Olympic Women's Hockey Team that won gold in PyeongChang in February 2018, defeating Canada, 3-2, in a shootout. Those players include, **Cayla Barnes, Hannah Brandt, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Kali Flanagan, Nicole Hensley, Megan Keller, Amanda Kessel, Hilary Knight, Kelly Pannek, Maddie Rooney** and **Lee Stecklein**.

WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM NEWCOMERS

Tessa Janecke will make her U.S. Women's National Team debut during the December Rivalry Series swing. Janecke represented Team USA at the 2022 Under-22 Series vs. Canada and at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship.

COLLEGE CONNECTION

All 26 athletes on the Team USA roster have competed or are currently competing as women's hockey student-athletes at a U.S. college or university. The University of Minnesota tops the list with seven athletes represented on the roster. The University of Wisconsin and Boston College both have five athletes each, with Northeastern University boasting three. Clarkson University, Cornell University, Lindenwood University, Ohio State University, Penn State University and University of Minnesota Duluth have one athlete. Ten different schools have representation on the team.

U18 WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP ALUMNI

A total of 20 players on the December roster of the 2022-23 Rivalry Series have represented the U.S. at an IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, including **Cayla Barnes, Hannah Bilka, Hannah Brandt, Alex Carpenter, Jesse Compher, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Jincy Dunne, Lacey Eden, Rory Guilday, Caroline Harvey, Taylor Heise, Tessa Janecke, Megan Keller, Amanda Kessel, Abbey Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Maddie Rooney, Abby Roque, Lee Stecklein** and **Grace Zumwinkle**. Janecke was most recently on the U18 team in 2022.

FROM NEAR AND FAR

A total of 13 different states are represented on the Rivalry Series roster. Seven players hail from Minnesota, five are from Illinois and two are from Michigan, New Hampshire and New York. California, Colorado, Idaho, Massachusetts, Maryland, Missouri, Texas, and Wisconsin all have one player representing its state on the roster.

PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD HONOREES

Five members of the team have been honored with the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, bestowed annually to the best women's player in NCAA Division I college hockey: **Aerin Frankel** (2021), **Kendall Coyne Schofield** (2016), **Alex Carpenter** (2015), **Taylor Heise** (2022), **Amanda Kessel** (2013).

The team, led by head coach **Katie Lachapelle** (Lewiston, Maine), will compete at the IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship in Östersund, Sweden January 8-15, 2023. The team returns seven players - **Annelies Bergmann, Cassie Hall, Molly Jordan, Ava Lindsay, Finley McCarthy, Maggie Scannell** and **Josie St. Martin** - from the 2022 U18 Women's National Team.

2023 U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM

The 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship will be played Dec. 26 - Jan. 5, 2023 in Halifax and Moncton, Nova Scotia. Team USA will host a training camp in mid-December in Plymouth, Mich. to select the 23-player roster.

2023 BIOSTEEL ALL-AMERICAN GAME

The 2023 BioSteel All-American Game will return to the ice on Jan. 16 at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Mich. Puck drop is slated for 4 p.m. ET. The BioSteel All-American Game brings together the top American-born prospects eligible for the upcoming NHL Draft. The annual event, which began in 2012, has seen 215 players that have gone to be drafted, including 46 first round picks.

2022-23 U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM STAFF



JOHN WROBLEWSKI, HEAD COACH

John Wroblewski is serving as the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team for the 2022-23 season following taking the helm at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship, where he led the U.S. to a silver medal.

Wroblewski joined the U.S. Women's National Team following two years (2020-22) as the head coach of the Ontario (Calif.) Reign, the AHL affiliate of the LA Kings, and four seasons (2016-20) as the bench boss of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Over his four years with the NTDP, the program reached its first USHL playoff berth since 2012 and finished top-three in all 12 international tournaments played. He led his team to 33-consecutive international victories from 2016-18, and also oversaw the development of 29 NHL Draft picks, including Jack Hughes, who was selected first overall by the New Jersey Devils in 2019.

At the IIHF level, Wroblewski guided the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team twice, resulting in a gold in 2017 and bronze in 2019.

The Neenah, Wisconsin, native began his coaching career as an intern assistant coach with the NTDP and was promoted to a full-time assistant coach the following season, a position he held from 2008-10.

Wroblewski, a player on the inaugural NTDP roster in 1997, skated four years with the University of Notre Dame (1999-2003). He went on to play four years (2003-07) professionally with the ECHL's Fresno Falcons, recording 125 points (65-60) in 273 career games.

JOSH SCIBA, ASSISTANT COACH

Josh Sciba is reprising his role on the U.S. Women's National Team staff during the 2022-23 season, after serving in the same capacity at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship.

As an assistant coach, Sciba helped lead the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team to a gold medal at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, after serving in the same capacity for the 2019 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team.

Sciba is currently the head coach of the Union College women's ice hockey team, a role he has served in for the past six seasons.

As a player, Sciba was a member of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program from 2001-03, prior to playing four years at the University of Notre Dame.

MOLLY ENGSTROM, ASSISTANT COACH

Molly Engstrom is making her debut as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team at the 2022-23 Rivalry Series.

Engstrom is currently in her first season as the head coach of the University of Maine, after serving as an assistant coach at St. Cloud State from 2018-22.

Prior to her appointment to the USA Hockey staff, Engstrom served as an evaluator at numerous USA Hockey camps.

As a player, Engstrom represented the U.S. at two Olympic Games (Turin, 2006; Vancouver, 2010) and six IIHF Women's World Championships, winning gold in four of the (2005, 2008, 2009, 2011).

SHARI DICKERMAN, ASSISTANT COACH

Shari Dickerman is making her debut as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team at the 2022-23 Rivalry Series.

Dickerman, an assistant coach at Minnesota State University, previously served as assistant coach of the 2022 U.S. Collegiate Women's Select Team, that competed at the 2022 Collegiate Series against Canada in August.

Prior to her appointment to the USA Hockey staff, Dickerman served as an evaluator at numerous USA Hockey camps.

A member of the Mavericks staff since 2009, Dickerman has helped lead Minnesota State for the last 13 seasons.

As a player, Dickerman was an All-American goaltender for the Mavericks.

ALLI ALTMANN, GOALTENDING COACH

Alli Altmann returns as the goaltending coach of the U.S. Women's National Team after serving on the silver medal-winning staff of the 2021 and 2022 U.S. Women's National Team that both took silver at the Women's World Championship.

Altman also guided the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for four seasons, having served in the goaltending coach role from 2017-22. She guided the U.S. to two golds and two silvers during that time.

Altmann is currently the co-owner and vice president of DEVENIR Goaltenders. She played four seasons for Minnesota State University, recording a career .901 save percentage.
