NOTABLES

- Head coach Ian Russell keeps a lineup the same for consecutive games for the first time since Sept. 5 and 12. This lineup is 4-0-1 on the season.
- © Only three players in the starting XI tonight started every regular season game: Christiano François, Kevin Partida and Corey Hertzog.
- Forward Corey Hertzog makes the start tonight, his 48th straight start for Reno. Since signing before the 2019 season, Hertzog has not missed a single game, starting all but three. The streak is the longest among active players, more than double the next longest (Kevin Partida with 20 straight).
- Brent Richards wears the captain armband tonight for the 14th time this season, and 25th time in his career. The total is the third-most in club history.
- Rookie defender Jared Timmer makes his 10th start of the season, with the team going 6-1-2 in his starts.
- Defender Sam Gleadle leads the team in minutes played this season with 1,371 of a possible 1,440. Only seven other players have reached the 1k mark: François, Partida, Thomas Janjigian, Tucker Bone, Hertzog, Richards and Sergio Rivas.
- Eangsdorf is one of just five players (François, Gleadle, Hertzog and Partida) to appear in all 16 regular season games. Of the five, Langsdorf is the only one to have played fewer than 1,000 minutes. The forward has played just 856 minutes on the season.
- The lineup features three players from the 18 in last-year's playoff game. Richards andd Hertzog started, with Gleadle on the bench.
- Richards becomes the first player in club history to start each of the club's five playoff games.
