History of the NWBA



World War II veterans gave birth to wheelchair basketball in 1946. They played in Veterans Administration (VA) hospitals in Birmingham, California, Framingham, Massachusetts and the Corona Naval Station in California, where World War II veterans were being treated for various degrees of paralysis. The Birmingham Report published an article on November 26, 1946, titled "Plegics Win Wheelchair Game, 16 to 6." The veterans competed against doctors who practiced at the Birmingham Hospital. In 1947, the Birmingham team traveled to the Corona Naval Station, where they competed in the first match between two wheelchair basketball teams.

Within two years, six teams emerged that represented VA hospitals across the country. National tournaments were organized and hosted by the Paralyzed Veterans of America.

In 1948, the National Wheelchair Basketball Association pioneer and Hall-of-Fame inductee Tim Nugent, of the University of Illinois, organized the NWBA and the first official National Wheelchair Basketball Tournament. That same year, in a remarkable act of self-determination, the Birmingham VA Flying Wheels took to the air and challenged VA hospital teams throughout the United States. Wheelchair basketball soon became the number one sport of individuals with disabilities. VA teams and players joined the NWBA shortly after 1948.

Wheelchair basketball for women's teams began to surface in the mid-1960s. In 1968, a U.S. women's team competed alongside U.S. men in the Paralympic Games in Tel Aviv, Israel. As only a men's division existed in the NWBA at that time, the few women who played in the U.S. competed on men's teams. As of 1970, one women's team had been formed, the University of Illinois Ms. Kids. During the 1973-1974 season, the Ms. Kids played the Southern Illinois University

Squidettes in the Men's Old Gym on the University of Illinois campus in Urbana. This was the first recorded wheelchair basketball game between two organized women's teams in the U.S. and the first women's wheelchair basketball game between two collegiate women's teams. In 1977, a proposal to create a Women's Division was submitted to the NWBA delegates by University of Illinois graduate student and future Hall-of-Fame inductee, Bob Szyman. Following the approval of the proposal, six women's teams were formed. In 1978, these six teams competed in the national tournament, hosted by the University of Illinois.

Since 1991, the NWBA has attained considerable recognition in the public domain, when it became an associate member on the U.S. Congress. It is now an active member of USA Basketball. Its former commissioner, Stan Labanowich, yet another University of Illinois graduate and NWBA Hall-of-Fame member, was appointed to USA Basketball's board of directors.

Wheelchair basketball has come a long way since its origins in the U.S. in 1946. The NWBA has since grown to over 200

teams. The National Wheelchair Basketball Association has given birth to hundreds of teams from North and South America, Africa, Asia and Europe. The U.S. now competes against teams from those regions at the Paralympic Games and the World Championships.

The NWBA National Wheelchair Basketball Tournament is the largest single-sport event in the world for athletes with disabilities. The NWBT is the

culmination of the regular season with the top ranked teams competing for a coveted National Championship in their respective divisions. The top sixteen teams in the Adult DI, DII and DIII will play for their respective division titles. In the Junior Division, the top 16 Varsity teams will compete for the Varsity National Title, while the 17-32 ranked Varsity teams will play for the NIT Championship. The top 16 Junior Prep Division teams will play for a National Prep Title as well. Over 1,050 athletes will compete for these titles throughout four days of competition on 12 courts. Additionally, the NWBA conducts National Tournaments for the Women's Division and Intercollegiate Division at individual tournaments annually.



What is the NWBA?

What is the NWBA?

The National Wheelchair Basketball Association is the longest standing and largest Disabled Sports Organization in the world. It was founded in 1948 to provide individuals with physical disabilities the opportunity to play and learn wheelchair basketball.

What does the NWBA do?

We are the organization that is responsible for growing and developing wheelchair basketball in the United States, and the selection and training of the Paralympic and Parapan



Am Games teams, as well as major international competitions. The U.S. Olympic Committee's Paralympic Division and the International Wheelchair Basketball Federation recognize the NWBA as the governing body for the United States.

What is the NWBA's reach?

The NWBA is currently in 42 states and has nearly 3,000 members and 225-plus teams. We have divisions for Men, Women, High Performance, Collegiate, Division I, Division II, Division III, Junior and Prep.

How many Competitions are there?

There are nearly 200 NWBA sanctioned competitions annually throughout the United States, Puerto Rico, Ontario and Quebec. The NWBA season is from October to April, culminating in the National Tournament, which is being held in Louisville, Ky., April 12-15, 2018.

PLAYING THE GAME: RULES AND DEFINITIONS

COURT

A regulation college sized (94 feet by 50 feet) court is used for all NWBA competitions. The foul lane (12 feet wide), foul line (15 feet) and college three-point line (20.75 feet) are used in NWBA events.

BASKETS

The NWBA uses traditional 10-foot height baskets for all divisions, except for the Junior Prep Division, 13 years old and younger, where an 8.5-foot basket is used.

BASKETBALLS

Molten is the official basketball provider of the National Wheelchair Basketball Association. The Adult Division (DI, DII, DIII), Intercollegiate Men's and Junior Varsity use a size 7 ball. The Intercollegiate Women's and Women's Division use a size 6 ball. The Junior Prep Division uses a size 5 basketball.

PLAYER

Any individual is eligible, who has of permanent severe leg disability or paralysis of the lower portion of the body. A person will benefit from participation in wheelchair basketball, who would be denied the opportunity to play basketball were it not for the wheelchair adaptation.

WHEELCHAIR

The height of the seat must not exceed 21 inches from the floor. The height of the foot platform or rest point of contact must be no more than 4 7/8 inches from the floor. Seat cushions are permitted for medical and therapeutic reasons. A medium weight foam rubber is permitted (2" maximum thickness for Class III and IV players and 4" maximum thickness for all other players). A heel strap of 1 1/2" width (minimum) must be attached to the foot platform bars. Each chair must be equipped with a roll bar or other protective device to ensure against damage to the playing surface.

CONTACT

The chair is considered a part of the player. General rules of contact in regular basketball (charging, blocking, etc.) apply to wheelchair basketball.

TIME LIMITS

An offensive player cannot remain more than three seconds in the free throw lane while the player's team is in possession of the ball

DRIBBLE

A player in possession of the ball may not push more than twice in succession with one or both hands in either direction without dribbling, passing or shooting. Taking more than two consecutive pushes constitutes a traveling violation. A player may, however, wheel the chair and bounce the ball simultaneously just as an able bodied player runs and bounces the ball simultaneously in regular basketball.

LOSS OF THE BALL


If a player in possession of the ball makes any physical contact with the oor or tilts the chair so far backward that the anti-tip (safety) casters touch the oor, it is a violation and the ball is awarded to the other team.

PHYSICAL ADVANTAGE FOUL

Because of the varying causes and degrees of disability among participants, a basic rule of keeping seated in the wheelchair at all times and not using a functional leg or leg stump for physical advantage over an opponent is strictly enforced. An infraction of this rule (rebound, jump ball, etc.) constitutes a physical advantage foul. It is so recorded in the official scorebook. Three such fouls disqualify a player from the game. Two free throws are awarded and the ball is given to the opposing team out of bounds.

FALLING

If a player falls out of the chair during play, the officials will immediately suspend play if there is any chance of danger to the fallen player. If not, the officials will withhold their whistles until the particular play in progress has been completed. If a player falls out of the chair to gain possession of the ball or by falling keeps opponents from gaining possession of the ball, the ball is awarded to the opposing team.

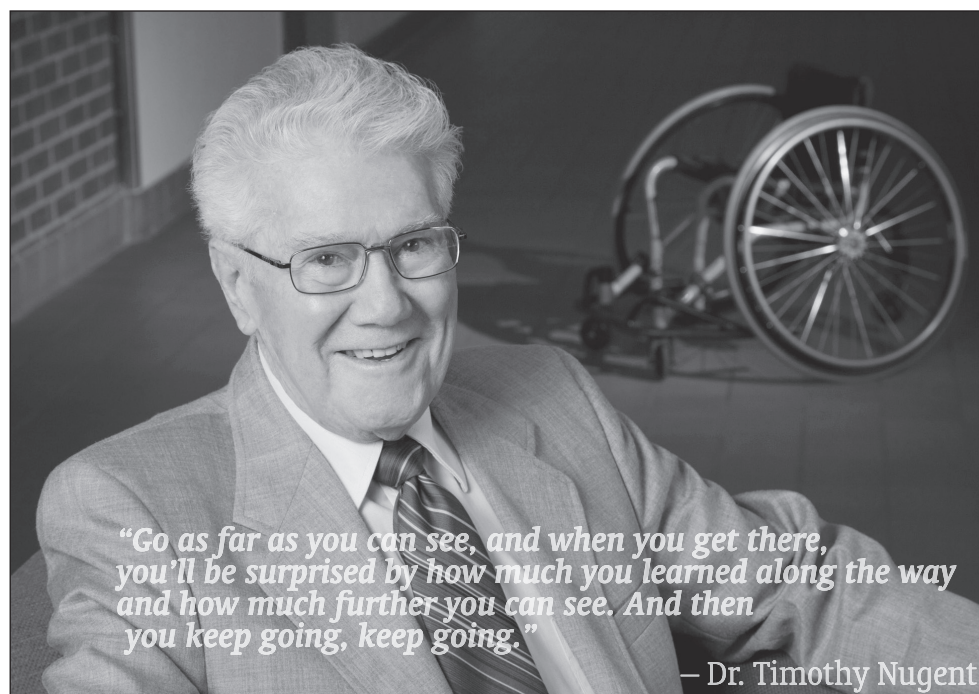

The Legacy of Dr. Timothy Nugent

January 10, 1923-November 11, 2015



Dr. Timothy Nugent, who is best known as the “Father of Accessibility” and is the founder of the National Wheelchair Basketball Association, died at the age of 92, in November 2015. He was a life-long ambassador for the NWBA and a major contributor to those with disabilities.

Dr. Nugent created the first comprehensive program of higher education for individuals with disabilities at the University of Illinois and started the Gizz Kids, the original collegiate wheelchair basketball team. Also in 1948, he organized the first National Wheelchair Basketball Tournament, and later that year founded the NWBA to provide a year-round structure to wheelchair basketball.

The visionary Nugent expanded wheelchair basketball beyond the VA hospitals to bring structure to the sport and create worldwide adoption and acceptance into the Paralympic Games and Parapan Am Games, which has been enjoyed by millions of people. As the first Commissioner of the NWBA, a post he held for 25 years, he modified the rules of the game to make them more similar to able-bodied basketball making it easier for the fans to follow. He was inducted into the Wheelchair Basketball Hall of Fame in 1973.

From a young age, sports played a very important role in his life. Sports helped him get through the Great Depression and it afforded him many opportunities. He played and coached basketball, and this is where he started to get the inspiration to have the same opportunities for sport regardless of their physical limitations.

He helped transform the lives of many through the power of adaptive sports, and was involved in the creation of other wheelchair sports including football, track and field, archery, and square dancing.

“Dr. Nugent dedicated his life to helping others and through his efforts he created many opportunities for individuals with disabilities,” said Castle. “We are thankful for his vision that ultimately touched so many lives on and off the basketball courts. His legacy with the National Wheelchair Basketball Association is remarkable. He has touched so many great athletes, coaches, officials and leaders. My life is richer for all of his contributions as are those of countless other athletes and we will cherish all you have done for those with disabilities. You will always be fondly remembered in the wheelchair basketball community.”

He focused on the ability in disability. Most notably, Nugent was a leader in the development of architectural accessibility standards, public transportation, adaptive equipment, and recreational activities for people with disabilities.

He served as Professor of Rehabilitation Education and Director of the Rehabilitation Education Center and the Division of Rehabilitation Education Services at the University of Illinois, until retirement in 1985. He founded Delta Sigma Omicron, a national

rehabilitations service fraternity. He served as President of the National Paraplegia Foundation (now the National Spinal Cord Injury Association) for four terms.

He held degrees from Tarleton State University; University of Wisconsin at LaCrosse; and the University of Wisconsin. He also has honorary degrees from Springfield College in Massachusetts and Mount Mary College in Wisconsin.

The NWBA will recognize Dr. Nugent’s lifelong commitment to adaptive sports with the addition of the Dr. Timothy Nugent Person of the Year Award, and the first recipient will be Dr. Nugent posthumously at the 2016 National Wheelchair Basketball Tournament. Into the future, the NWBA will identify an individual annually who has best demonstrated Dr. Nugent’s vision for inclusion.



Modern Day Coaches Ron Lykins, Stephanie Wheeler & Mike Frogley to be Inducted into the 2018 NWBA Hall of Fame

The 2018 NWBA Hall of Fame class was announced by the NWBA Hall of Fame Committee. The 2018 inductees are a group of five individuals, who made their name staples in the wheelchair basketball community. This year's inductees include: Mike Frogley of Whitby, Ontario; Chuck Gill of San Francisco, California; Ron Lykins of Columbia, Missouri; Jason Van Beek of Chino, California and Stephanie Wheeler of Champaign, Illinois.

This year's Hall of Fame class represents a younger generation of inductees who are responsible for transforming the game into what it is today. The class is headlined by Ron Lykins, the winningest international coach in NWBA history. Lykins also is partially responsible for the overall development of two other 2018 NWBA Hall of Fame Inductees – Frogley (coach) and Wheeler (athlete and coach).

The NWBA Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony is set for Saturday, April 14 at the Omni Hotel Louisville at 8:00 p.m., where NWBA Hall of Fame Chairperson Frank Burns will oversee the celebration. The Hall of Fame inductions have been held in conjunction with the National Wheelchair Basketball Tournament presented by ABC Medical for many years, and this marks the 70th anniversary.

Mike Frogley, Whitby, Ontario, Coach

As a coach with the University of Wisconsin at Whitewater from 1993-1997 and the University of Illinois from 1997-2013, Mike Frogley won 12 National Championships with men's and women's teams in his collegiate tenure.

Throughout his career, Frogley has coached 25 All-Americans, 21 Academic All-Americans, 18 U.S. Paralympians and at least another five players that represented Team USA in other major international competitions.

Frogley has always been on the cutting edge on spreading wheelchair basketball through camps. Many summers he would have over 100 athletes at his camps ranging from novice to elite. He also had a coaching clinic that ran in conjunction with the camps that helped coaches on the local, collegiate and international level. Frogley's guidance helped in the development of camps at several other colleges and communities throughout the United States that are thriving today.

Frogley later moved behind the Canadian bench, serving as the head coach of the Men's National Team from 1996-2004. He guided the Canada Men's National team to Paralympic supremacy for the first time in program history with back-to-back gold medals in 2000 and 2004, as well as a Paralympic silver medal in 2008. Frogley's coaching career started under the tutelage of fellow 2018 Hall of Fame inductee Ron Lykins.



Ron Lykins, Columbia, Missouri, Coach

Ron Lykins is the winningest international coach in NWBA history – winning three Paralympic Games (2004 and 2008 for U.S. Women; and 2016 for U.S. Men). He presently coaches the U.S. Men's National Team in hopes of defending its 2016 Paralympic gold at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

Lykins' coaching resume is nothing short of amazing, having coached in 16 international competitions, reaching the gold-medal games in 14 of those, and bringing home the top podium finish in 10 events. This includes: three Paralympic Games; one World Championships; two Para Pan American Games; and four American Zonal Qualifiers. He also has a Paralympic silver medal in 1992, and three silver medals from the World Championships.

The style and system that his teams have run during Paralympic years have revolutionized the way wheelchair basketball is played around the world. Other countries are trying to duplicate and emulate what he has done with Team USA. On top of those accolades, Lykins is the first head coach to win Paralympic gold medals with both the U.S. Men's and U.S. Women's Paralympic Teams.

Like many others, he has spent the majority of his adult life in wheelchair basketball. He got his start at the University of Kentucky under the mentorship of then NWBA commissioner and Hall of Famer Stan Labanowich. What started out as a college internship turned into a passion, career and ultimately his life's work. Lykins has coached at every level within the NWBA. He has coached within the Intercollegiate Division at the University of Kentucky, University of Wisconsin at Whitewater and University of Missouri. He also coached at the community level with the Atlanta Hawks Wheelchair Basketball Team and Minnesota Junior Rolling Timberwolves. Lykins' greatest successes and honors have been achieved during his time spent on the sidelines for Team USA.



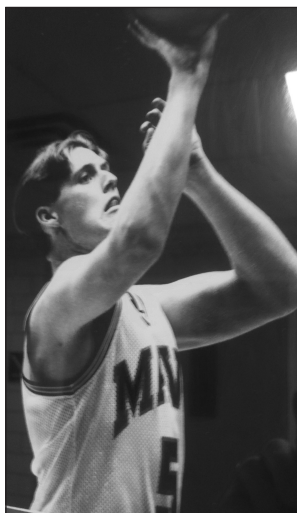
Chuck Gill, San Francisco, California, Player

Chuck Gill was born in San Francisco and started playing wheelchair basketball in 1987 for the NWBA BORP Berkeley Breakers. Gill started playing with the Golden State Road Warriors' "Golden State 76ers" in 1991 and has been the Golden State Road Warriors team captain for the last 13 years. Gill had speed, size, shooting ability and an on-the-court presence that the team needed from a two guard. With him and Hall of Famer Trooper Johnson in the backcourt, Golden State quickly became one of the top NWBA Adult teams. The duo led Golden State to its first Final Four National Tournament

in 1997. The Far West Sectional game stands out in Gill's career. With 12:30 left in the Championship game, Gill and three other Road Warriors had to finish the game because Jeff Briebl fouled out and there was no sub for a legal line up. Gill showed his leadership and poise in that game.

That is one of the many reasons he has been a two-time NWBA National Champion and 12-time NWBA All-Star. Gill showed his professionalism and knowledge of the game by being an assistant coach for the U.S. Men's Wheelchair Basketball team in 2011 and 2012.





Jason Van Beek, Chino, California, Player

Jason Van Beek was born in Chino, California, and played in his first NWBT at the age of 10 with the Casa Colina Condors in 1982. Since then, Van Beek has won nine NWBT championships and four NIWBT Championships with the University of Texas at Arlington from 1990-1994. In his four years at UTA, Van Beek only lost one intercollegiate game.

At 6' 5" tall with long strong arms, Van Beek played the small forward, power forward and center positions with fierce determination, focus and excellence. He was the ultimate team player who was able to dominate when necessary. Van Beek played with some of the NWBA's best teams and he was a major part of their success. He was a

center that could shoot well when he posted up, a good foul shooter, had range from as far as the foul line and was very knowledgeable about moving without the ball. On defense, he was the rim protector and would utilize the principal of zone defense away from the ball and grab every rebound on a missed shot.

Stephanie Wheeler, Champaign, Illinois, Coach

Stephanie Wheeler is the epitome of the athlete-turned-coach in the NWBA, having found major success in both realms. She has a very impressive coaching resume, having coached at the University of Illinois since 2009, the Under-25 USA Women's National Team in 2011 and the U.S. Women's National team from 2013 to 2016.

She has achieved at every level on and off the court. She has been an all-star and MVP in the Women's Division. She has also won national championships as a player at two schools, University of Illinois and University of Alabama. Wheeler also is U.S. Paralympic gold medalist as a player in 2004 and 2008 and then as the head coach of the women in 2016.

In 2001, Wheeler made her first USA Developmental Team. In 2010 she was co-captain of the gold-medal winning World Championships team in Birmingham, England. Her achievements as a player are a mile long winning a total of four gold medals, two silver medals and numerous international championships across the globe. Wheeler transitioned from athlete to coach when she was selected as the head coach the 2011 USA Women's Under 25 national team, where she led the team to victory at the inaugural event. She later earned the distinction of NWBA Developmental Coach of the Year.

Wheeler has been a key person in the growth of the women's game in the United States. While at Illinois, she was part of the team that sought to find the toughest competition they could to prepare for international competition by competing in the Adult Division II of the NWBA and was part of the team that chose to go and compete in the men's college division.

When she graduated from Illinois, she went down to Alabama to help a young Alabama program grow and develop. Currently, Wheeler is having continued success off the court and is on track to earn her Doctorates degree in philosophy from the University of Illinois. She was also inducted into the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2017.
