### **Other Information:**

- Sportsmanship: make sure to work with sideline manager (or head coach) if parents get out of control
- If a game is limited in time due to injury, weather, etc. The score at the final stoppage of play will be used to calculate the seating for Sunday's Tournament.
- Maximum goal differential is seven (7).
- Offsides will be observed.

#### Passing Rules:

- 1 Pass Rule: U9 Games requires one <u>COMPLETED</u> pass in the offensive Half of the field for a team to be HOT (able to shoot)
  - o Once Hot, the team remains HOT as long as the ball remains on the offensive side of the field.
  - o Even with Goalie clears, until the ball crosses mid-field the opposing team would remain HOT

# Other Information:

- Sportsmanship: make sure to work with sideline manager (or head coach) if parents get out of control
- · Check's to the head, violent collisions, excessive Body Checking to include defenseless player
  - o 2 minutes non-releasable penalty. Penalty clock stops (game clock does not stop) with timeout or injury
- If there is a Flag Down, play will stop on a change of possession. The ball hitting the ground doesn't stop play. When there is a second flag down, a loose ball will result in a whistle to stop play.
- If a game is limited in time due to injury, weather, etc. The score at the final stoppage of play will be used to calculate the seating for Sunday's brackets.
- Maximum goal differential is seven (7).
- Mouthpiece violation is a technical foul
- For U13c and above, during the last 2 minutes of the game, the team who is ahead only has to keeps the ball in the box if the goal differential is 4 goals or less
- Unlike High School, sub-High School games don't require 6" of tape for the face-off players.
- A goal is good if the shot is released before the clock turns 0 and the shot my hit the ground and/or a defensive player, again it still counts

#### **Braveheart Rules**

- The Braveheart begins with a faceoff. One player on each team competing for the faceoff, one player on the wing and one
  goalie.
- There is no offsides all players can cross midfield.
- The Braveheart is sudden victory
- All other applicable 2018 NFHS rules apply
