

### 1942 State Nordic Champion - Charles Banks

Charles Bankui was the son of Minnesota Finn, who found his calling in Nordic skiing. Bankui would join the US, Navy shortly after high school, changing his name from the Finnish Bankui to an Americanized "Banks". After service to his country, Banks would get a teaching degree in Industrial Arts and land a job with Duluth Central, assisting legendary ski coach, Rudy Sabo, who had won multiple state ski team titles and had numerous individual champions. Banks would take over in 1956 and win several more team titles. Banks, who lived near Two Harbors on Korkki Road, built his own cross-country trail and would drive his team out to his place for practice, feed them, drive them back to school and then teach an evening shop class. Banks' ski trail was host to the 1967 Junior Nationals championship, the first year that girls would compete in a national competition. It would take another nine years before the Minnesota State High School League would sponsor a girl's state meet in 1976.
