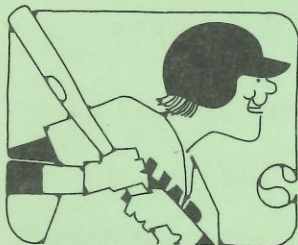

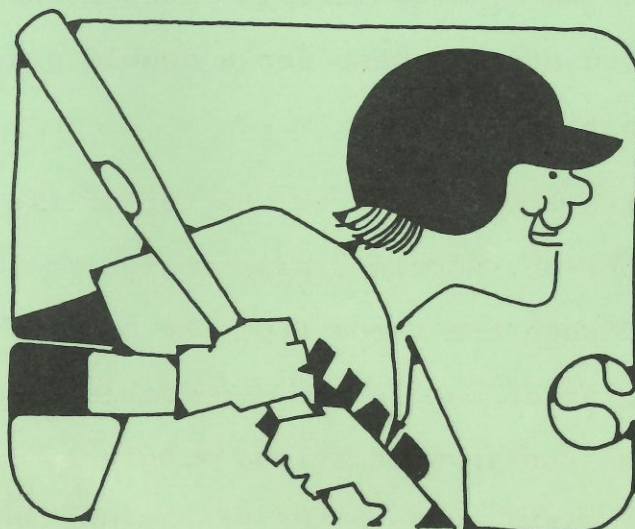

## DYNASTY GOES THROUGH THE FRONT IN FIRST GAME 6-1

DAVIE MIZ SUPPLIES HITTING; HADDAD, NASAR COMBINE FOR 8 ASSISTS

The line score above tells most of the story. Dynasty got ahead early and never let up, winning the first game of the series just as they had done in the previous two series. Dynasty did it with clutch hitting, solid defense, and a superb pitching performance by Jackie Matalon.

In the top of the first Jeffrey Gindi, a recent insertion into the no. 2 spot in the batting order, laces a one-out single. Mitchell Haddad follows with a wicked bouncer that bounded into centerfield scoring Gindi, Mitch taking third on the throw. Richie Braha then lofted a single to give his team a 2-0 lead.

Eddie Beda's team started off noisily in their half of the first. Eddie leads with a walk and Nathan Tawil shoots a single to right but the next batter, Sammy Cohen, saw his shot to the box handled by Jackie Matalon on a good effort. Jackie throws to third for one and the Dynasty infield catches the runner who had advanced to second off the base for a double play. So ended the Front Runners initial threat.

Dynasty built its lead to 3-0 in the top of the second. With two outs and none on, Morris Gindi singles to left and keeps going to third when the throw from the outfield gets loose. The next man up at bat is the dependable Davie Mizrahi who promptly gets the run in with a loud single to left center. Ricky Franco follows with a single but Storefront leaves Dynasty

runners stranded on first and second.

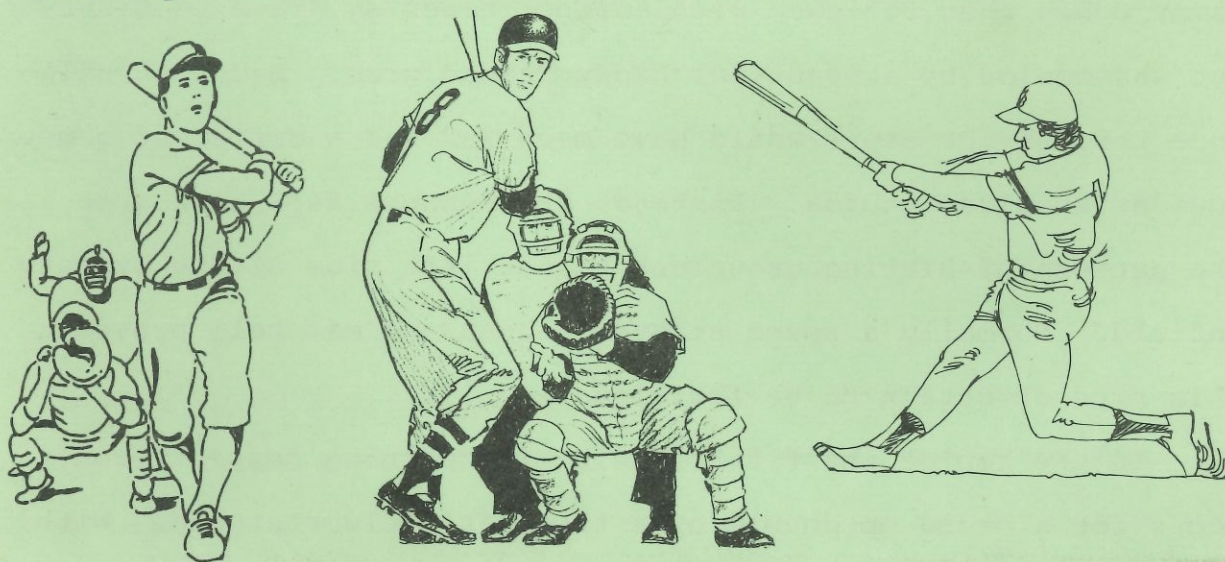
After three innings of watching Mitchell Haddad and Joel Nasar pick up everything in sight, the Front Runners get on the board in the bottom of the fourth. Nathan Tawil leads off with a rocket to right which found the trees and resulted in a homer. Sammy Cohen then followed with another towering drive to right, but was denied by a beautiful Ricky Franco grab. Had that ball gone through the score would have been 3-2 and a different game. Coulda, shoulda, woulda. Instead, the Runners fell back into the pattern of hitting grounders to the left side of the Dynasty infield. Normally a sound strategy, Joel and Mitchell proved this type of attack to be fruitless.

In the top of the fifth, Davie Miz "earning respect" connects for a stand-up double over the left fielder's head. With two out, Garr follows with a double in the right centerfield cap, which could easily have been a homer had Bucky Doueck not made a fine play. Bucky made another good catch the next inning, lunging in the Gap to make a shoe-string crab while fighting off the sun. In the bottom of that inning, on a controversial play, Eddie Beda hit a ball seemingly by the outfielders for a round tripper. But Gary Erani cuts it off and hustles it in to second where Eddie is called out for oversliding the base, stymying another Runner effort.

Dynasty rounded out the scoring in the top of the last with a Joel Nasar single, Morris Gindi triple, and Ikey Haber single for two more runs.

In the not to be overlooked dept., yes we did see that sensational diving catch by Richie Braha on the rightfield line against the Ramblers. Dynasty outfield continues to sparkle.

Albert Beyda was reactivated off the seven day disabled list and will be eligible to play this Sunday. Albert's presence sure to rouse Runners. So far, in these playoffs the team which has won the first game of the series has won the series five times out of six. Please come early to claim your seats on game day.
