JASON KOSANKE HOMESTEAD

Jason Kosanke has a coaching resume that spans three decades. The 2004 WBCA Coach of the Year is making his 2nd appearance at the Classic, nearly 20 years after his first appearance. He was an assistant coach for 14 years, starting one year with Evangel University in Missouri, then six years as a head JV coach and Varsity Assistant coach at Menomonee Falls. He then coached junior varsity at Waterford and then spent three years as a Varsity Assistant at Slinger.

His experiences aided his rise as a successful head coach. In six years as the head coach at Waukesha South, he led the Black Shirts to a Classic Eight title in 2004, three Regionals championships and a Sectional Championship. He then became the head coach at Carroll College for four years before returning to the High School ranks, where he led University School of Milwaukee for two years, before becoming the head coach at Homestead in Mequon, where he has led the team the past six years, including winning a Regional title in 2022. Much admired in the coach fraternity, Kosanke won the WBCA's Ethics in Coaching Award in 2003. Kosanke teaches math at Germantow High School



DON RADOMSKI WAUKESHA NORTH HIGH SCHOOL

Don Radomski graduated from Thomas More High School in 1989 and was coached by Joe Zolecki, who he attributes much of his playing and coaching success to. In high school, he played football, baseball and basketball. After high school he played D2 baseball at St. Joseph's College in Indiana for one year and continued his college baseball career at UW Stevens Point where he earned All-conference honors and MVP for the Pointers. After his playing days, Coach Radomski has coached for the youth Brewer Baseball Academy, JV2 Brookfield Central under hall of fame coach Jeff Bigler, assistant coach at Bryant and Stratton JUCO under head coach Mike Zolecki, and recently coached for STIKS Academy 14U.

Radomski took over Waukesha North baseball in 2019. The first season was rough with only five wins. Now into the 6th season, the program has gotten stronger with every passing year. In 2022 North finished 12-12, and in 2023, 13-13 which earned 5th place two years in a row in a very tough Classic Eight Conference. Coach Radomski currently teaches 6th grade science in Brookfield where he is raising four boys of his own with his wife, Heidi.



TIM SCHULTZ SAINT THOMAS MORE HIGH SCHOOL

Schultz is a graduate of Greendale High School and was a member of the 1987 State Championship team under 2009 WBCA Hall of Fame coach Robin Schrank. He later continued his playing career at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Schultz is in his twelfth year as the Director of Student Services / School Counselor at STM and in his fourth year as Varsity Head Coach after previously serving as JV coach. He has compiled an 82-25 record so far in four seasons, including three Regional titles, one Sectional title, and D2 State Runner-Up this past season.

STM plays in the Metro Classic Conference and his teams have a 49-5 record, including the past two years as undefeated conference champions and currently have a 33-game conference winning streak going back to the 2022 season.


DARIN PAPE SAUK PRAIRIE HIGH SCHOOL

Pat also was a four year varsity basketball player and helped the team to a second place finish in the 1963 state tournament. Pat attended Platteville College, which later became Platteville University then University of Wisconsin-Platteville during his four years there. He participated in basketball, baseball and soccer at the school.

He served in the US Army then returned to Dodgeville where he became editor of The Dodgeville Chronicle newspaper, a position he still holds today and has for 56 years.


Reilly noted coaching with his son Ryan is one of the best things in his career. Ryan and his son, Sean, played in the High School All Star games.
