ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION
of

The undersigned subscribers, natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, do hereby associate themselves for the purpose and with the intention of forming a corporation under Chapter 24.03 of the Revised Code of Washington, and by their subscription adopt the following articles of association.

I

The name of the corporation shall be MISSION RIDGE FOUNDATION.

II

The period of duration shall be perpetual.

III

1. The location and post office address of the registered office of the corporation in this state shall be 31-1/2 North Wenatchee Avenue, P. O. Box 542, Wenatchee, Washington 98801.

2. The registered agent of the corporation shall be Charles E. Cross, whose address is 31-1/2 North Wenatchee Avenue, P. O. Box 542, Wenatchee, Washington 98801.

IV

The general purpose for which the corporation is formed is to engage only in educational and charitable activities within the provisions of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or as this section may be amended. To accomplish this exclusive purpose, the association may engage in the following:

1. Establish, administer and promote an educational program devoted to the development and training of skiers as a means of helpful recreation and physical fitness; to stimulate

interest in skiing competition in schools, colleges and otherwise, to give encouragement, coaching and instruction to competitive and recreational skiers; to cooperate with the Olympic Committee, and Amateur Athletic Union, the United States Ski Association and other recognized associations for the promotion of skiing.

2. Establish, administer and promote an educational program, devoted to the development and training of the individual in ski safety, first-aid, winter rescue through instruction, lectures and safety campaigns of all manners or types.

3. Acquire property for these corporate purposes by grant, gift, devise or bequest, and to hold and dispose of the same, subject to the limitations as are prescribed by statute.

4. Do all things and have all powers granted or allowed under the laws of the State of Washington to charitable corporations under Chapter 24.03 or the Revised Code of Washington, provided that the corporation shall limit its activities and powers to those permitted under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

5. Do every act and thing necessary to carry out and attain the above purposes to the same extent as natural persons might or could.

6. Conduct all of its business without pecuniary profit to any of its members.

V

This corporation is organized pursuant to the laws of the State of Washington relating to associations for education and charitable purposes under Chapter 24.03, Revised Code of Washington. This corporation does not contemplate the distribution of gains, profits or dividends to its members, and is organized for non profit purposes; no part of any funds of the corporation, grants or gifts to the corporation, or income therefrom shall be expended for other than the purposes set forth in the articles of association or administration thereof.

VI

The corporation shall issue no stock. Its funds shall be obtained by membership fees, gifts, grants, devises, bequests or donations and income therefrom.

VII

The number of elected directors of this corporation shall be established by the by-laws adopted by the corporation. The names and addresses of those chosen to serve as directors until the election and qualification of the successors are:

In furtherance of and not in limitation of the powers conferred by the laws of the State of Washington, the board of directors is expressly authorized to make, alter and repeal the By-Laws of the corporation, subject to the power of the members of the corporation to change or repeal such By-Laws.

VIII

The qualifications of membership of the corporation, the voting and other rights, privileges and obligations incident to membership, and the qualifications and election of directors shall be set forth in the By-Laws.

IX

In the event of the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts

or obligations of this corporation, the directors, or persons in charge of liquidation, shall grant, convey, assign and transfer the remaining assets of this corporation unto:

1. A state, or political sub-division thereof, or to the United States of the District of Columbia, to be used exclusively for public purposes.

2. A corporation, trust or community chest, fund or foundation: (a) created or organized in the United State, or in any possession thereof, or under the laws of the United States, any state or territory, the District of Columbia, or any possession of the United States; (b) organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes; (c) no part of the earnings of which enters to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual by reason of stock or membership interests; and (d) no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.

The assets transferred to any organization listed above shall be used within the United States or any of its possessions, exclusively for the purposes set forth in Article IV.

No such organization listed above shall qualify for distribution unless such organization shall be an organization, association, fund or foundation organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary or educational purposes which is a tax exempt, non-profit corporation under the United States Internal Revenue Code, and which is recognized as such by the United States Bureau of Internal Revenue.

If the corporation holds any assets in trust at the time of the dissolution thereof, such assets shall be disposed of in such manner as may be directed by decree of the Superior Court in the County in which the dissolved corporation and its principal office, upon petition therefor by the Attorney General, or any person concerned in the liquidation.
