The Idaho Foodbank



On October 28 we were invited to set up the Bogus Basin Ski Club raffle booth at Eagle Luxe Reel Theatre. The movie, "Anywhere from Here," was sponsored by McU Sports and 10 Barrel Brewing Boise with all proceeds going to The Idaho Foodbank. Fifty percent of the proceeds from BBSC raffle sales were also donated to The Idaho Foodbank. That amounted to \$105.00 from our raffle for the Foodbank. Every \$1 donated can provide food for up to four meals. At \$105, our donation helped provide 420 meals. The movie was narrated by a young boy with the dreams of a perfect day skiing to allow himself to push to the extreme to accomplish his goals. It was a fitting reminder of The Idaho Foodbank programs that help children, families, individuals and entire communities with their mission to nourish, educate and end hunger.

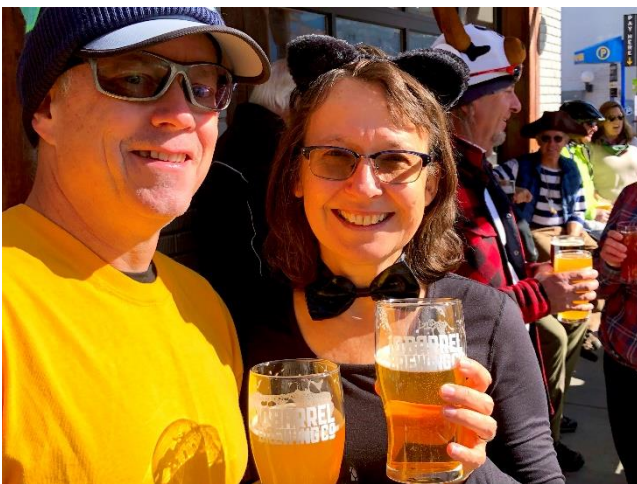

Notes from Your Ski Patrol

Responsibility Code

With snow falling on the mountain, it's time to introduce the 2022 Responsibility Code. National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) first developed the Skier Responsibility Code in 1962 and they have made numerous revisions since then to update the terminology and to include snowboarders, bikers and everyone who enjoys the slopes. The 2022 version of Your Responsibility Code has grown from seven points to ten. The pre-existing seven points were revised to modernize the language, and item six was split into two (six and seven).

Two new points have been added:

- Item nine was added to emphasize the importance of not skiing or riding under the influence.
- Item ten advises you of the best practices to follow if you are involved in a collision or incident.

It's that time of year again! Break out your skis or board and bring it down to Hyde Park Pub for a fresh coat of wax. Proceeds from this fundraiser will go toward educational/ training devices.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

- 1 Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid people or objects.
- 2 People ahead or downhill of you have the right-of-way. You must avoid them.
- 3 Stop only where you are visible from above and do not restrict traffic.
- 4 Look uphill and avoid others before starting downhill or entering a trail.
- 5 You must prevent runaway equipment.
- 6 Read and obey all signs, warnings and hazard markings.
- 7 Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- 8 You must know how and be able to load, ride and unload lifts safely. If you need assistance, ask the lift attendant.
- 9 Do not use lifts or terrain when impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- 10 If you are involved in a collision or incident, share your contact information with each other and a ski area employee.
