



MWYF Town Representative Responsibilities

Role Overview

The Town Representative plays an important leadership role within the Pee Wee Football program. This individual serves as the primary point of contact between the league board, coaches, families, and the community in their town. Town Representatives help ensure that the program operates smoothly, safely, and in alignment with league standards.

League Requirements

Prior to assuming their role, Town Representatives are required to complete all league requirements established by the board. These requirements help ensure that all representatives understand league policies, safety procedures, and expectations.

Coach Recruitment and Oversight

Town Representatives are responsible for recruiting qualified coaches within their community. Once coaches are selected, the Town Representative must ensure that all coaches complete the league's required certifications, tests, and background checks prior to the start of the season.

Community Outreach

Town Representatives help promote the Pee Wee Football program within their community. This includes sharing information about the program with local schools, families, and community members to help recruit players and increase awareness of the league.

Game Day Presence and Oversight

Town Representatives are expected to attend games hosted in their town. During these games, they help maintain a positive and respectful environment by assisting in resolving any issues that may arise between coaches, referees, players, or spectators. If you are unable to attend, you must communicate to the board of directors so that representation from the board can be present.

Leadership and Sportsmanship

Town Representatives serve as leaders and role models within the program. They are expected to promote good sportsmanship, support league policies, and help ensure that the focus of the program remains on providing a positive experience for all athletes.
