

How to fill out the score sheet

To be done by the Team Rep:

- Fill out #1-6. Home Team always provides the score sheet
- 1. McFarland. Put your stickers on all 3 pages (white, yellow, and pink)
- 2. Fill in away team name. Get their stickers and put on all 3 pages
- 3. Date game is played
- 4. Scheduled start time of game
- 5. Arena = McF or MCIA
- 6. Level (Squirt A, Squirt B, Squirt C, Peewee, or Bantam)
- 7. No need to fill in Game #

To be done by the score keeper during the game

- 8. Scoring
 - a. Ref will say the scorer's number, and who had an assist if they caught it.
 - b. Score keeper needs to fill in H or A under team (Home or Away, or V for visitor)
 - c. Score keeper fills in period (1, 2, or 3)
 - d. Score keeper fills in time of goal

9. Penalties

- a. Ref will say player #, major or minor, and offense. If the ref doesn't specifically say major, you can put it down as a minor. (ie: "#99 trip" is the same as "#99 minor for tripping")
- b. Scorekeeper will fill in Home or Away, the period, and when the player comes off the ice.
- c. Scorekeeper will fill in the mins based on a major or minor infraction
 - i. Minor: Squirt = 1:30 min; PW & BT=2 min
 - ii. Major: Squirt=3 min; PW & BT= 5 min
 - iii. Misconduct: Squirt=6 min; PW & BT=10 min
- d. Most penalties will have a start time the same as the off time
 - i. I am not going to get into the intricacies of the situations where the start time is different. You can look into your off ice officials handbook for more info. Most refs will help talk you through this if it is complicated.
- e. On is when the player gets back on the ice
 - i. If a power play goal is scored, the player does not have to stay in the box for the full time for a minor penalty
 - ii. Some situations call for the player to not be able to get back on the ice until the first whistle after the penalty time has run out. Refs will tell you when these situations happen. Sometimes these players have to stay in the box many minutes after their penalty is over. So don't fill in the on time until after they player is actually back on the ice.

10. Official Scorer Signature. The score keeper signs the score sheet at the end of the game.
