PROJECT OVERVIEW

The City of McCook is in the final fundraising stage for building a \$16.9 million sports complex that will become a community gathering hub for generations. This state-of-the-art facility will grow the local economy and enrich the lives of youth and adult athletes and their families throughout Southwest Nebraska, creating a safe and sought-after place to play for traveling teams, while fulfilling the needs of local families first.

Phase 1 will establish the foundation of the complex, featuring earthwork, site utilities, a turf four-plex for baseball and softball plus two additional turf championship fields, a turf soccer field, a grass soccer field, a restroom/concession building, and a parking lot.

Phase 2 will expand the facility with tennis courts, pickleball courts, basketball courts, a splash pad, a playground, and a walking trail.

Phase 3 will finish out the complex with a Fieldhouse.

HONORING A HOMETOWN HERO



Private First Class Gerald Leroy Walters gave his life for his country during the Vietnam War. Born and raised in Culbertson, Nebraska, he was drafted into the U.S. Army and began his tour on April 29, 1968. He died two days after his 23rd birthday on June 30, 1968. He is buried at Memorial Park Cemetery in McCook. By naming the new sports complex in his honor, Pfc. Walters will never be forgotten, and all who visit the facility will be reminded of the price of freedom.
