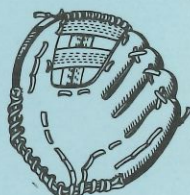

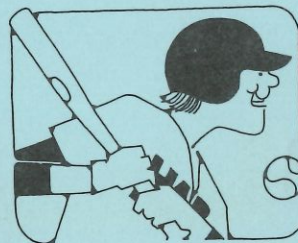

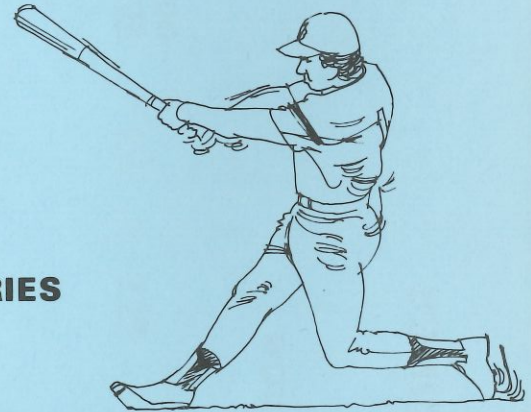

MAX ZALTA

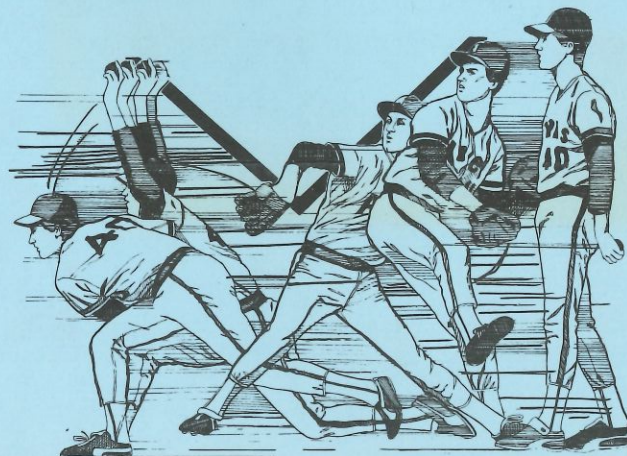

Marty Miz won the first game with help from superb pitching of Stevie Azur. Marty went 3 for 3 and played beautifully in the field, shutting down Klingon rallies. Other factors were timely hits by Charlie Semah and Jackie Haddad, and exceptional play by Ricky Franco.

Going into this doubleheader, Kamikaze found themselves as the only team in circuit without a win. A shot in the arm in the form of masterful pitching by Abie Cohen changed all that. With Abie in control and third baseman, Maxie Zalta sparkling defensively, Kamikaze held the powerful Angels to 5 runs on the day.

After trailing 1-0 in the first game, Kamikaze erupted for 13 runs on 16 hits. Leading the barrage was David Haddad, 3 for 4 with 2 RBI's and 3 runs scored, and Zalta (see Player of the Week). Kamikaze also welcomed back Sammy Tawil, who contributed with a couple of RBI's.

In the second game, the Angels took an early 2-0 lead only to see their opponents score 4 times in the bottom of the first. Capt., Eddie Kassin, did the most damage, going 2 for 3 with 2 RBI's. The Angels narrowed a 5-2 lead on a homer by Alan Saka, but tough pitching in key spots by Cohen and brilliant defense by Zalta, Haddad, Morris Shalom, and David Shamula preserved the victory.
