TODAY'S GAME

Team USA continues preliminary-round play of the 2024 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship this evening against Latvia.

Team USA has played Latvia a half-dozen times in the history of the U18 Men's World Championship, winning all five games in the preliminary round as well as a quarterfinal win in 2022.

All of Team USA's preliminary-round games will take place at Metro Areena in Espoo, home of the Finnish Elite League's Kiekko-Espoo. The arena seats 6,982 fans for hockey games.

TALKING POINTS

PRELIMINARY ROUND VS. NORWAY

James Hagens (Hauppauge, N.Y.) collected a goal and two assists and six other U.S. skaters added multiple points as the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team skated past Norway, 8-2, Saturday night at Metro Arena in the team's second preliminary round game at the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship.

BOSS TALK

"I'm proud of our guys for managing the game tonight and coming away with another win," said Team USA head coach **Nick Fohr** (Grand Forks, N.D.). "Now we need to shift our focus and be ready for a Latvian team tomorrow that we know is going to play hard and compete."

GOAL EISERMAN

After three goals and four points in Team USA's first win of the tournament, forward **Cole Eiserman** (Newburyport, Mass.) added another pair of scores in yesterday's 8-2 win over Norway to give him five goals to lead all skaters at the 2024 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. His six total points gives him sole possession of second place through two games played for all 10 teams.

Eiserman's nine goals in last year's championship tied him with teammate **Will Smith** for the most in the tournament and he's picked up right where he left off. Yesterday marked his fourth multi-score game in IIHF action across nine total games played over the two tournaments.

The future Boston University Terrier is up to 123 career NTDP goals, three off the all-time program record set by Cole Caufield from 2017-19. Eiserman's 187 career points (123g-64a) at the program ranks fourth all-time, and he is currently two points off of Clayton Keller's (2014-16) 189 for third place.

MAINTAIN THE ZERO

Team USA has squared off with Latvia a total of six times throughout the history of the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship, collecting wins in all six games as they look to keep a zero in the loss column. The overall series:

- April 17, 2007 - Preliminary - USA 8-0
- April 21, 2013 - Preliminary - USA 7-1
- April 17, 2016 - Preliminary - USA 12-1
- April 23, 2019 - Preliminary - USA 7-1
- April 28, 2022 - Quarterfinals - USA 13-3
- April 20, 2023 - Preliminary - USA 7-1

Half of the six games have ended in an exact 7-1 score, while Team USA has an overall 54-7 goal margin in all previous games.

TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2024 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 25 - May 5, 2024, in Espoo and Vantaa, Finland. The U.S. enters the tournament off of a gold-medal finish at the 2023 event in Switzerland. Team USA has earned 11 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Espoo at Metro Arena against Group A opponents Finland, Latvia, Norway and Slovakia. The quarterfinal round will be split between Espoo and Vantaa, while both semifinals and medal-round games will all take place in Espoo.

Group A on the opposite side of the bracket consists of Canada, Czechia, Germany, Kazastan and Sweden and they will play their games at Vantaa Trio Arena in Vantaa.

WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2024 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air all Team USA games live throughout the tournament, which begins Thursday (April 25) and runs through May 5 in Espoo and Vantaa, Finland.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

HIMMY HAGENS

Team USA forward **James Hagens** continued his torrid start to the 2024 U18 Championship, following up four points in the team's first game with a goal and two assists in yesterday's 8-2 win over Norway. His seven points through two games is tops in the tournament, one more than Eiserman and two more than any non-U.S. skater.

The three-point performance brought Hagens into a tie for eighth place amongst all-time NTDP scorers with Patrick Kane, as both sit at 172 career points. The next gap is a big one for Hagens as both Cole Caufield (2017-19) and Phil Kessel (2003-05) have 180.

The future Boston College Eagle forward has 106 career assists over his two-year tenure, which puts him sixth on the all-time list. Next up on the assist leaderboard is last year's U18 World Championship MVP, Will Smith, who had 109 from 2021-23.

STONE COLD KEMPF

After earning a shutout in his IIHF debut, it appears that U.S. netminder **Nick Kempf** (Chicago, Ill.) will get his second turn in net this evening against Latvia.

Kempf made saves on all 24 shots he saw against Latvia to pick up a shutout in his first-ever IIHF contest on Thursday afternoon in a 9-0 victory.

The University of Notre Dame commit has had success in international competition this year, as his only other blanking came in a 5-0 win over Finland in the 2023 U18 November Five Nations, where he made 22 saves.

The shutout performance improved Kempf's season-long numbers to a 19-6-0-2 record, 3.10 goals-against average and .897 save percentage.

DIRTY IN THE DOT

Team USA has had great success in the face-off circle through a pair of games, led by **Lucas Van Vliet** (Livonia, Mich.), who leads the tournament with a 75.0% face-off percentage. Van Vliet has been skating as the 13th forward for Team USA, but slots in often, especially when a win is needed.

Kamil Bednarik (Chicago, Ill.) ranks fourth with a 65.7% win rate in the face-off circle and his 23 total face-off wins ranks third among all skaters.

Underager **LJ Mooney** (West Mifflin, Pa.) has also had success on draws, going 11-6 in his 17 attempts to rank seventh with a 64.7% win rate.

KEEPING IT FRESH

The United States has had the ability to continuously roll all four lines in their first two games of the preliminary round in an attempt to keep everyone as fresh as possible. The U18 championship can feature seven games in 10 days, so it's imperative to keep players' legs ready to go for the entire duration.

Defenseman **Cole Hutson** (Chicago, Ill.) leads Team USA in average time on ice with 20:09, a number that ranks only 24th overall in the tournament. No other U.S. skater ranks among the top-30. **Will Skahan** (Woodbury, Minn.) comes in next, averaging 18:30 per game, while **Logan Hensler** (Woodbury, Minn.) is the only other skater averaging over 18 minutes per game, as he's at 18:02 through two contests.

STAY OUT OF THE BOX

Team USA has been far and away the least penalized team through two games here at the U18 World Championship. They have only 12 penalty minutes called on them, besting Latvia and Sweden who have each had 20 PIMs.

On the other end, Canada leads the tournament with 96 penalty minutes assessed through a pair of games.

The U.S. did allow a late power-play tally to Norway yesterday and without many opportunities to bring the success rate back up, sit in the middle of the pack with an 80.0% rate on the penalty kill.

PRELIMINARY ROUND VS. SLOVAKIA

Behind two goals and two assists from **James Hagens** (Hauppauge, N.Y.) and a 24-save shutout from **Nick Kempf** (Chicago, Ill.), the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team shut out Slovakia, 9-0, in the opening game of the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship Wednesday afternoon.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Team USA is led by captain **Brodie Ziemer** (Hutchinson, Minn.) for the 2024 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. Fellow forwards **Max Plante** (Hermantown, Minn.) and **Teddy Stiga** (Sudbury, Mass.) will serve as alternate captains for the tournament. The three players served in the same capacities for the 2023-24 U.S. National Under-18 Team that played out of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program this season.

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Eighteen members of the 2024 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team were named to the National Hockey League Central Scouting's Final Rankings ahead of the 2024 NHL Draft, set to take place June 28-29 at The Sphere in Las Vegas.

Trevor Connelly (Manhattan Beach, Calif.) was the highest-rated USA skater and finished at the number six overall ranking on the final report. **Cole Eiserman** (Newburyport, Mass.) sits in the 12th overall spot for North American skaters, while **Kamil Bednarik** (Chicago, Ill.) was also rated as a possible first-round selection at 28th overall.

Team USA was highly populated in the 2nd-3rd round projections, beginning with defenseman **EJ Emery** (Compton, Calif.) in at 39. He was followed closely behind by **Max Plante** (Hermantown, Minn.) at 43, and **Teddy Stiga** (Sudbury, Mass.) right behind at 44. A pair of defensemen were also given back-to-back rankings with **Cole Hutson** (Chicago, Ill.) at 55 and **Will Skahan** (Woodbury, Minn.) one spot behind at 56. Team USA captain **Brodie Ziemer** (Hutchinson, Minn.) rounded out the projected second-round choices with his ranking of 59.

Next up were **Christian Humphreys** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and **Lucas Van Vliet** (Livonia, Minn.), who were named the 71st and 75th ranked North American skaters, respectively.

Austin Baker (White Lake, Mich.) was listed at 104, while **John Whipple** (Minnetonka, Minn.), **Brendan McMorro** (Lakeville, Minn.) and **Sam Laurila** (Moorhead, Minn.) were all tight together at 145, 147 and 148.

In net, all three Team USA netminders were ranked among North America's best. **Nick Kempf** (Chicago, Ill.) was the fourth-ranked netminder, **Jack Parsons** (Ithaca, N.Y.) came in at 13th and **Caleb Heil** (Victoria, Minn.) finished in the 23rd slot.

The other five members of Team USA - defensemen **Logan Hensler** (Woodbury, Minn.) and **Dakoda Rheume-Mullen** (Northville, Mich.), along with forwards **James Hagens** (Hauppauge, N.Y.), **LJ Mooney** (West Mifflin, Pa.) and **Shane Vansaghi** (St. Louis, Mo.) are not age eligible for this year's draft and will be available for the 2025 NHL Draft.
